DEDICATION CEREMONIES WILL BE HELD OUTDOORS ON THE NORTH SIDE OF THE CALLISON COLLEGE QUADRANGLE. IN THE EVENT OF RAIN, THE LOCATION WILL BE CHANGED TO THE CONSERVATORY AUDITORIUM.

CALLISON COLLEGE is the third "cluster" college to be founded by the University of the Pacific since 1962. Each of these liberal arts colleges has introduced an innovative thrust to the undergraduate educational scene. Those planning the Callison College program creatively examined the mounting need for non-Western studies. It is clear that our survival as a free society is dependent upon developing a more thorough understanding of the history, culture and aspirations of the people of the non-Western world. The Callison College curriculum confronts this need with a distinctive emphasis. The College also requires each sophomore class to spend a year in residence in an emerging, non-Western nation. Bangalore, India has been chosen as the first campus site.

Dr. Wendell Phillips will be the guest speaker at the Dedication Convocation. Dr. Phillips is a noted explorer, archeologist and economic advisor to the Sultan of Oman. He will analyze current Near East issues.

Dr. Phillips will also present a two-hour documentary film on the evening of October 25, interpreting one of his archeological expeditions. This is open to the public with no admission charge. This film will be shown in the Conservatory of Music Auditorium at the University, beginning at 7:30 p.m.

Callison College is named in honor of Dr. and Mrs. Ferd Callison of San Francisco whose generous gift made the founding of this college possible.
