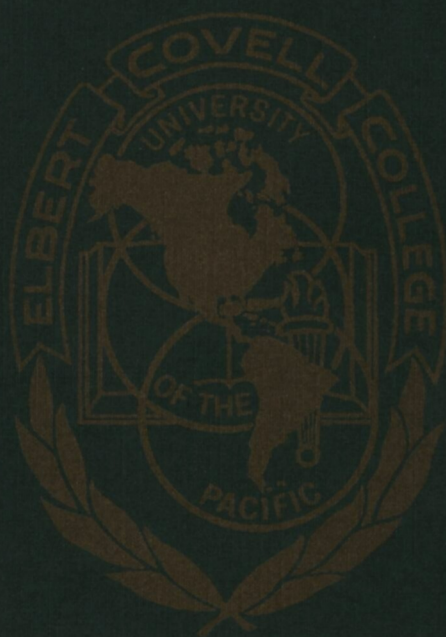

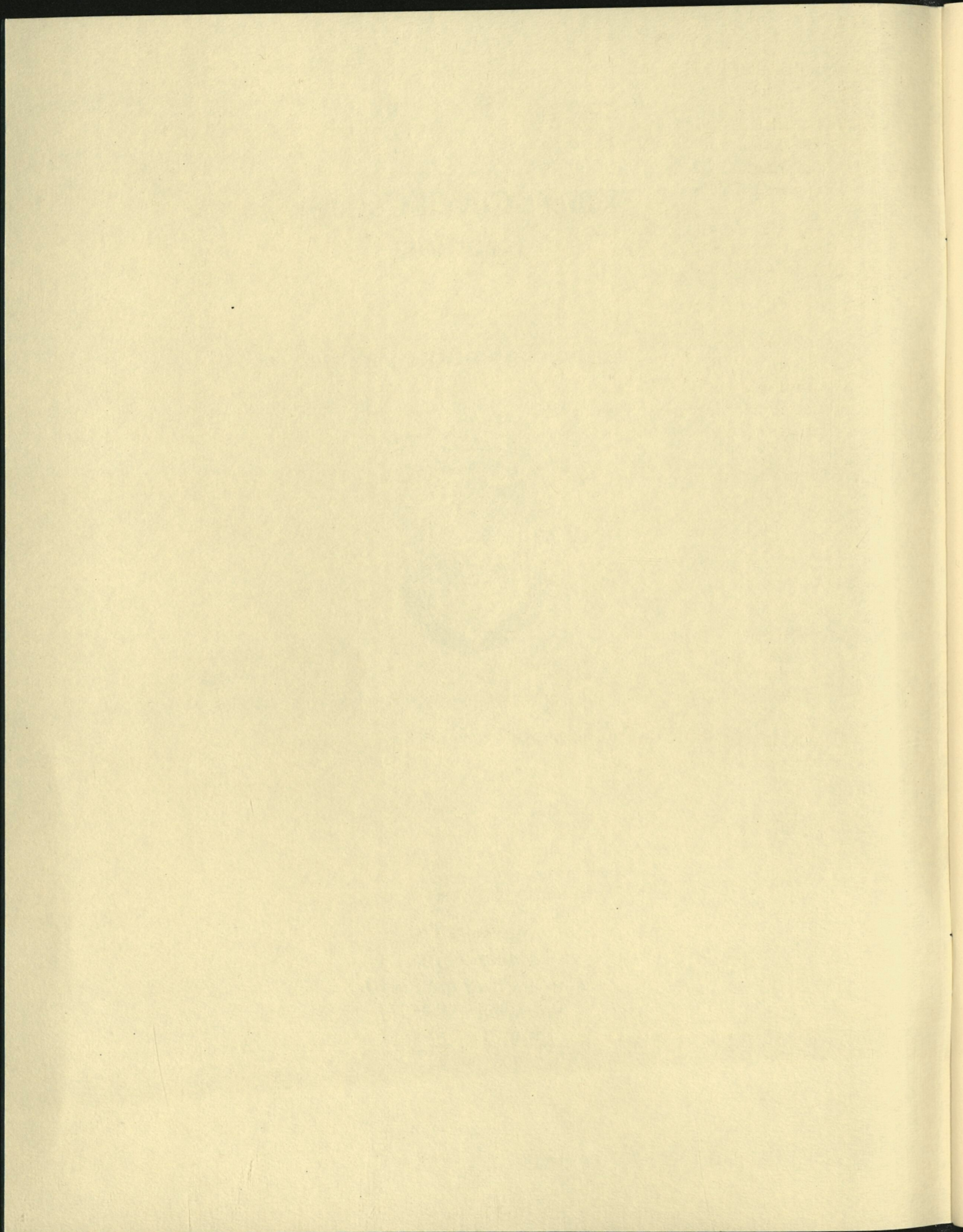

Elbert Covell College

Established in 1963 during the presidency of Robert E. Burns, Elbert Covell College was the second of three residential Oxford-type cluster colleges created by University of the Pacific during the 1960's. Elbert Covell offered an innovative Inter-American liberal arts curriculum in which most courses were taught in the Spanish language. Designed as an intercultural experience, both Latin American and North American students were required, in addition to completing a major, to be bilingual upon graduation. An optional semester in Costa Rica was included in the four-year program. Elbert Covell students lived in Jessie Ballantyne House, Casa Werner and Casa Jackson, with the Elbert Covell Dining Hall and El Centro Administrativo serving as all-college facilities. Elbert Covell was phased out beginning in 1982 graduating its last class in 1986. Elements of the Elbert Covell program, however, were absorbed by other UOP units and have continued to enrich the overall University academic environment. Historically, the cluster college experiment at UOP represents one of America's boldest ventures in higher education.

Elbert Coveilh College

Established in 1954 during the presidency of Robert B. Baker, Elbert Coveilh College was the second of three residential Oxford-type colleges created by University of the Pacific during the 1950s. Elbert Coveilh offered an innovative inter-American liberal arts curriculum with most courses taught in the Spanish language. Designed as an international experience, Latin American and North American students were required, in addition to completing a year in the bilingual program. An optional semester in Costa Rica was included in the first year program. Elbert Coveilh students lived in lease buildings known as Casa Wines and Casa Jackson with the Elbert Coveilh Dining Hall and Elbert Coveilh Administration building on-site facilities. Elbert Coveilh was phased out beginning in 1955 graduating its last class in 1965. Elements of the Elbert Coveilh program, however, were absorbed by other UOP units and have continued to enrich the overall University academic environment. Historically, the college's emphasis at UOP represents one of America's boldest ventures in higher education.
