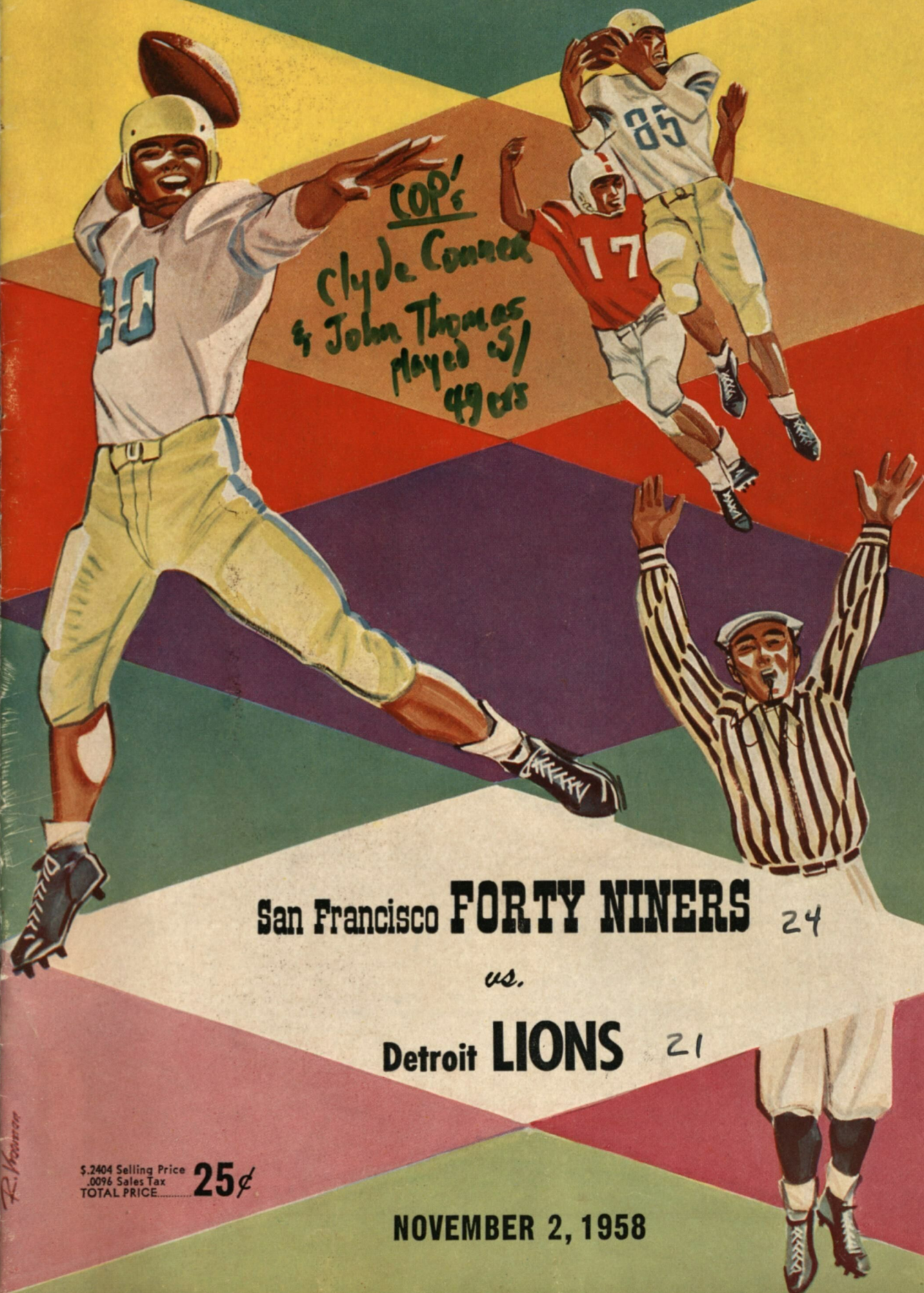

## LIONS EVOKE SAD MEMORIES

When the Detroit Lions trot out on the Kezar turf today, 49er fans undoubtedly will emit a collective shudder. The nightmare second half of last Dec. 22, when the Lions roared back for a 31-27 victory in the Western Division play-off is still vivid in the memories of all who witnessed the carnage.

Tom (The Bomb) Tracy, who manufactured most of the running mischief in that game, is now wearing Pittsburgh garb, but most of the same Lions, including the peerless Tobin Rote, have returned. Racked by injuries earlier this season, Detroit got back into its usual winning ways last Sunday by massacring Los Angeles, 41-24.

The most significant part of that victory was that the Lion secondary defenders picked off seven passes and the defensive line held the Rams to only 45 yards rushing. Such feats are awesome in the eyes of the 49ers, who suffered a 33-3 loss to Los Angeles in the second league game.

This series has been one of the greatest in the National Football League. The 49ers hold a 9-7 lead in victories, with last year's play-off not counted in the regular standings.

Ever since they were organized in 1946, the 49ers have been known as one of the "runningest" clubs in pro football. The old All-America Conference was terrorized by such ball carriers as Johnny Strzykalski, Norm Standlee, Len Eshmont, Verl Lillywhite and Joe Perry. After the merger with the NFL in

1950, Perry and Lillywhite maintained the dynasty with the aid of Hugh McElhenny and John Henry Johnson.

In 1954, for example, McElhenny led the league in rushing until he was injured in the seventh game. He still finished among the top 10, while Perry and Johnson were 1-2 for the season.

The rushing statistics, after the first five games of 1958, are enough to make an old-time rooter seek solace in his favorite brand of fire-water. The 49ers are 11th in the league in yards gained on the ground—a paltry 453. Only Philadelphia with 414 is lower.

By contrast, Cleveland paces the pack with 1311. Individually, the Browns' Jim Brown has already rolled up the amazing total of 815 yards. The league record for 12 games is 1146, established by Steve Van Buren in 1949. The 49ers, for the first time since 1950, don't have anyone in the first 10.

\* \* \* \*

After today's game, the 49ers will be missing from the Kezar scene for four Sundays. They'll be cheered on by a large local delegation at Los Angeles Nov. 9, but then face three all-hostile audiences—at Detroit, Nov. 16; with the Packers at Milwaukee, Nov. 23, and at Baltimore, Nov. 30.

The schedule closes out at home with Green Bay, Dec. 7, and Baltimore, Dec. 14. Reserved seat tickets for both those games are now on sale at the 49er box office and at all regular agencies throughout the Bay Area.
