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One UOP Student Journey to an International Career

Dear Prospective SIS Student,

My parents provided me with an exceptional educational opportunity in attending the University of the Pacific (UOP), with a focus on international and intercultural studies. I attended Callison College, with its focus on non-western studies and its requirement to study for one year in Asia. Callison College later morphed into what is now called the School for International Studies (SIS)/UOP. SIS continues the important tradition of preparing students to be globalists, to learn about, understand, and appreciate the world and importantly how to successfully engage as a global citizen. SIS offers the advantage of small classes and excellent student-professor ratios, with deep self-learning, while still having the advantages of being at a larger university. My own journey from a university student to an international professional reflects the critical importance of international studies as foundational for a successful international career. Here are some highlights of my own journey:

- During my sophomore year in India, the focus of my studies was Gandhian philosophy and nonviolent action as a means for positive community change.
- For the required senior thesis, I had the opportunity to work with Cesar Chavez and the farm workers union as an application of Gandhian nonviolent action and change in the USA context.
- Upon graduation from UOP, I served in the US Peace Corps for 3 years in Ecuador, to support resource poor indigenous communities in the Andes, and learn first-hand about international development through project management.
- After a few years back in the USA working with nonprofits, I then landed an assignment with the United Nations Development Program in Nepal, working in rural development.
- Next, I was hired as Country Director for an international development organization, Save the Children US, designing and leading regional development programs for 6 years in Indonesia and 3 years in the Central Pacific country of Kiribati.
- After 12 years working and living overseas, my family and I returned to the USA. I then became an international consultant. For the last 26 years, I have carried out over 50 international assignments in 49 countries around the world.
- My professional expertise is in consulting and training in a range of technical areas, always working as a cross-cultural team player. My assignments are with NGOs, INGOs, UN agencies, and government agencies. And decades later, I still apply what I learned from my university education which provide me a conceptual framework and practical skills for international work.
- Today, I am still consulting, these days with USA nonprofits, with a focus on multi-stakeholder collaboratives for shared goals, with diverse people and organizations.

What an exciting life journey, from my UOP student learning to a successful professional career. I very much still value and appreciate how my international, multi-disciplinary education at UOP launched me, and how that unique education opened-up a world of rewarding opportunities and work. I highly recommend SIS for any prospective student, seeking a unique and special opportunity to grow and learn, to become a professional globalist, and a competent professional to work with and in the world, across different countries and cultures, including with diverse people here in the USA.
