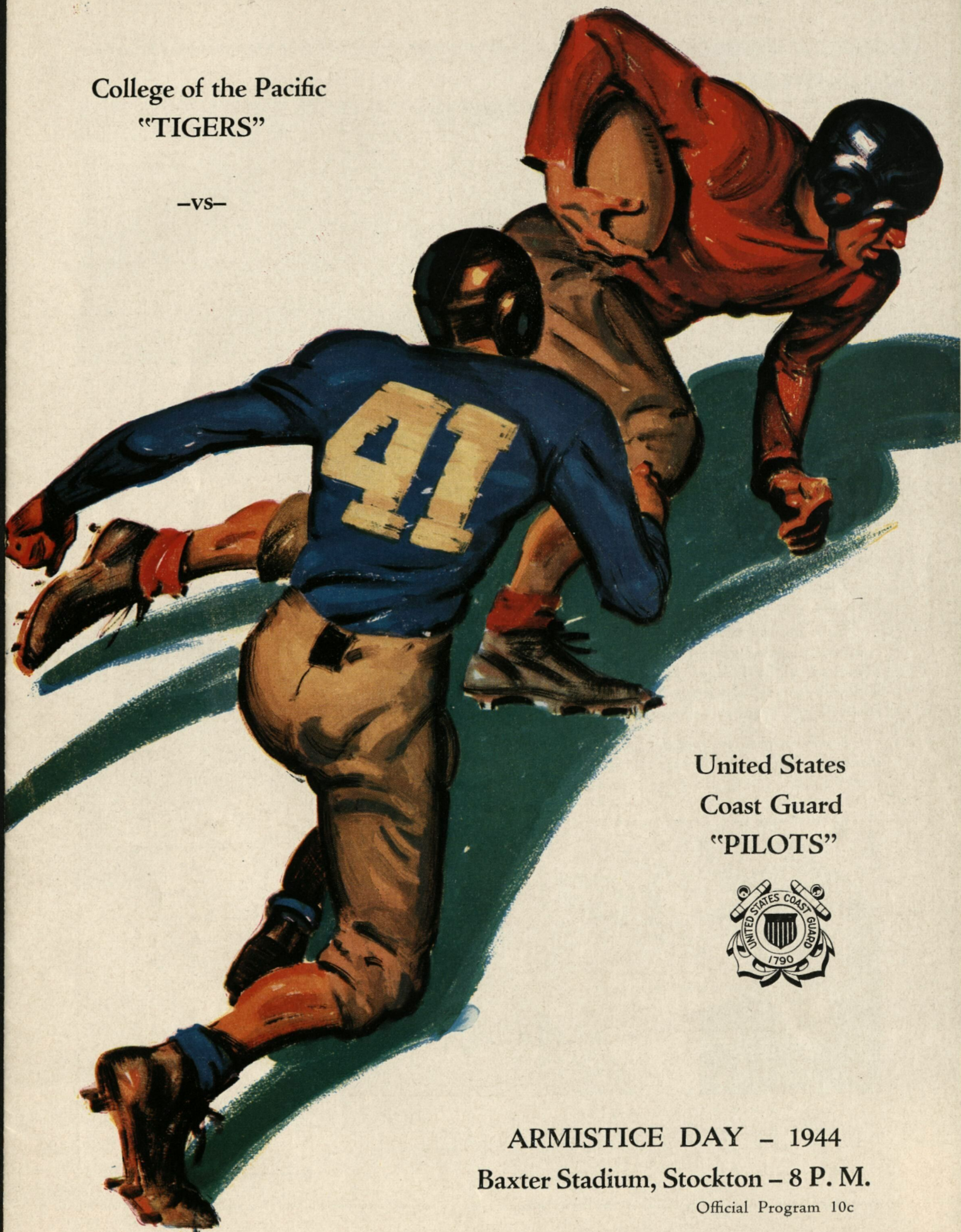

# THE GAME

Tonight's Armistice Day football contest brings together veterans from the Atlantic and Pacific theatres of war and trainees under the Navy V-12 program, who will help to finish the job.

The revamped Pacific Tiger team beginning the second section of its 1944 schedule is host tonight to one of the most unique squads in America. These sea-going guardsmen of the Coast Guard Receiving Station in San Francisco were returned to the mainland for rest and relaxation, after living through all the terrors of battle contact with the enemy. This football business is their version of rest and relaxation.

Both coaching staff and playing squad is comprised entirely of enlisted personnel, and the "Pilots" have the distinction of being the only San Francisco football team in 1944.

Built around triple-threat rear back Newell "Ace" Oestreich, and a mere handful of players who have seen any previous game action this fall, the new Tiger team has the potentiality of a powerful grid machine. Handicapped by lack of time, the Stagmen will not be able to show their greatest strength tonight. Men who will do most to see the Tigers through the November and December schedule will begin to emerge in tonight's battle.

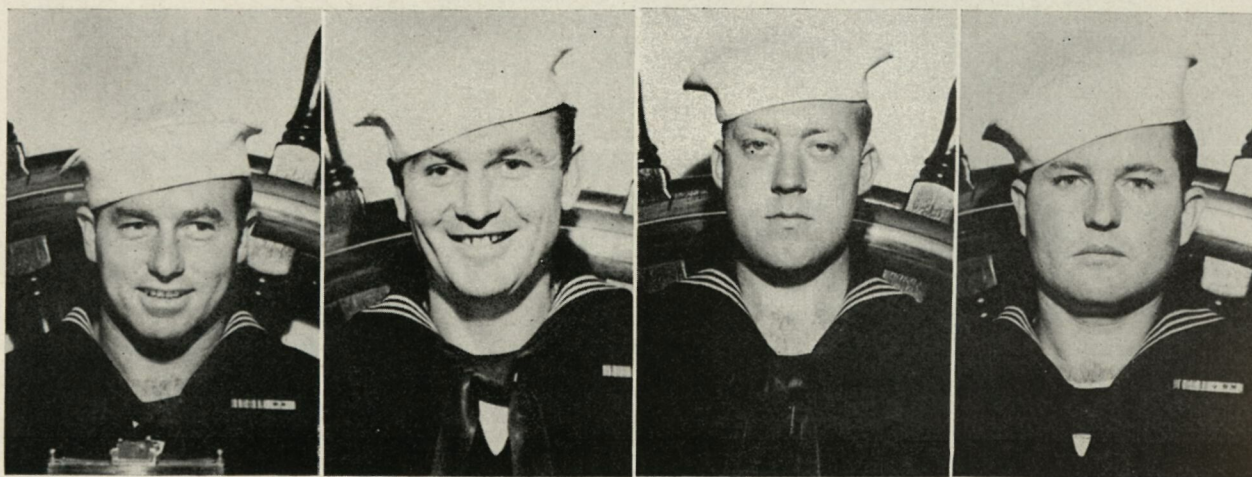
