

-- Tonight's Game --

It's Homecoming, 1961, at New Mexico State University. In the stands tonight are alumni NMSU, many of whom traveled many miles to be on hand for this special occasion.

Opposing each other on the gridiron will be the Aggies of Coach Warren B. Woodson and the Tigers of University of Pacific, coached by John Rohde (pronounced ROW-dee). It promises to be a close, hard fought contest.

Pacific will bring a 2-2 record into the fray. The Tigers have scored wins over Long Beach State (12-7) and San Diego University (40-7) while dropping games to San Jose State (16-0) and Fresno State (20-19).

The Aggies meanwhile, will enter the contest with a 2-1-1 record. NMSU downed Arizona State College (56-6) and McMurry (35-7) while dropping a game to New Mexico (41-7) and tying North Texas State last week end (14-14).

The meeting between NMSU and UOP tonight marks the first in history between the two schools. The Tigers, formerly known as College of Pacific, are a noted West Coast football independent. They have turned out such players as Duane Putman, Eddie LeBaron and Dick Bass.

A strained neck and a painful charley horse may have a bearing on the outcome of the game. NMSU's top running back — James (Preacher) Pilot—came up with a stiff neck after the Aggies tie with North Texas. End Richard Ramirez, who played a top defensive game and blocked a punt, had the charley horse. How much duty either man would see was still questionable late in the week.

Pilot leads all Aggie backs in rushing (398 yards on 63 carries for 6.3 average), total offense (398 yards) and scoring (42 points on seven touchdowns). He's the workhorse of the Aggie

backfield along with Fullback Bob Jackson, 220-pound senior.

The top pass receiver on the NMSU squad is Wingback Dave Thompson with seven catches. Quarterback Ron Logback leads Armando Alba in passing with 13 completions to 12 for the Deming product.



DR. ROGER CORBETT
President, New Mexico State University

Dr. Roger B. Corbett, in his seventh year as president of New Mexico State University, is an experienced educator and administrator. At present, he heads the University in its period of greatest development.

A native of West Virginia, Dr. Corbett received all his higher education at Cornell University, topped by award of the Ph. D. in 1925.

He was an instructor at Cornell in 1924-25, head of the Department of Economics at Rhode Island State College, 1925-33, senior economist for the U. S. Department of Agriculture 1933-36, and executive secretary of the New England Research Council 1936-37.

In 1937-40 he was dean of the College of Agriculture at the University of Connecticut, and from 1940-43 was director of the Agriculture Experiment Station at the University of Maryland.

Dr. Corbett was secretary-treasurer of the American Farm Bureau Federation from 1943-47, returning to the University of Maryland afterward as associate dean and director of the College of Agriculture, 1947-49. He was agriculture counsel of the National Association of Food Chains from 1949-55.

The NMSU president is also the author of numerous experiment station and extension service bulletins and other articles.

Dr. Corbett is the father of two children, a son and a daughter, both married. Mrs. Corbett died in 1939.



WARREN B. WOODSON
Athletic Director and Head Football Coach

Not just every coach in the nation has notched 201 wins in his college football coaching career. In fact, there is only one—Warren B. Woodson of New Mexico State University.

In 30 years of coaching Woodson has suffered only four losing seasons. His exact lifetime collegiate coaching record is 201 wins, 84 losses and 17 ties. Time and again players he has coached have walked away with national statistical honors. Last fall the Aggies' Bob Gaiters led all major college backs in the nation in rushing and scoring.

The Winged-T formation the Aggies use is Woodson's brainchild. He used it first at Hardin-Simmons University in an era when the single-wing, double-wing and short punt were all in wide use.

The idea of the formation, Woodson says, is to place the men where more of them can deflect on pass patterns in less time. Yet it is designed to keep the running game a threat.

Woodson came to the Border Conference in 1941 as director of athletics and head football coach at Hardin-Simmons University. He remained there through the 1951 season, except for three years in the Navy during World War II where he was a lieutenant commander in the Naval Aviation Cadet Training Program.

Prior to that he served as head coach at Texarkana Junior College and Arkansas State Teachers College.

College Football Periscope

YOU are one of more than two million fans attending a college football game this weekend.

Small wonder then, that you've possibly experienced difficulty obtaining that season seat on the 50-yard line to watch your favorite college team in action.


And the way college football attendance is spiraling, you likely will face even more competition for such a choice location in the future.

Tabulations of the National Collegiate Athletic Association show that college football set an all-time attendance record last fall — more than 20 million fans—as attendance rose for the seventh consecutive year.

Attendance for 1960 totaled 20,403,309 fans, bettering by more than 750,000 the previous all-time attendance record set in 1949. Over the past five years, total college football attendance has jumped 18 percent (3,136,853 fans).

And indications are that college stadiums are packing in more people this season than ever before.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . . despite the fact that several institutions dropped football recently, there are as many colleges currently conducting intercollegiate football programs as at any time in the last eight years? A total of 623 colleges and universities are fielding varsity football teams this fall and more than 31,000 student-athletes are participating on the varsity level. This total doesn't include participation in junior varsity, freshman and intramural programs.

COLLEGE football is the original football. The first game played in this country was between Princeton and Rutgers in 1869 and all football today stems from rules developed by the colleges and universities through the National Collegiate Athletic Association.


Football has changed over the years, and to keep abreast of these changes the colleges have discarded many of the playing rules they pioneered. The platoon system, devised in 1941, has eventually given way to the new and popular "wild card" substitution rule. . . . goal-line goalposts were developed and used by the colleges until 1927; now, the colleges are using the wider, safer goalposts. . . . the two-point conversion rule has provided college football with a fascinating new look, an interesting twist to the point-after-touchdown play.

How are college football rules formulated? By the colleges and universities themselves, acting through the NCAA.

Football rules, like rules for 12 other intercollegiate sports, are drawn by NCAA rules committees by coaches and athletic administrators representing every section of the country. For example, eight active football coaches, three former coaches now athletic directors and an officiating supervisor were members of the NCAA rules committee which formulated the 1961 college football rules.

College rules makers have certain obligations and responsibilities in formulating playing rules—to achieve a balance between offense and defense to make the game as competitive as possible, to consider the welfare of the student-athletes playing the game, and to retain for college football its traditional appeal as the great athletic spectacle of the fall season.


