Othello

Ted Elipoulos, a veteran of Pacific Theater productions, used William Shakespeare's great tragedy "Othello" as a vehicle for his talents in the first Theater production of the year. With fine direction by DeMarcus Brown and superb performances by the supporting cast, "Othello" and Elipoulos gave Pacific viewers a dramatic treat they are not likely to forget. With Jim Achterberg as the villainous Iago, and Tricia Beattie as Desdemona, the play was exquisitely done and well accepted.

Skillfully directed by Pacific Theater veteran Jim Achterberg, *The Sign of Jonah* gave local audiences one of the most inspirational experiences of the year in conjunction with the Religious Lectureship Series. With Ted Eliopolous in the role of Jonah, the surrealistic vehicle of Geunter Rueborn portrayed life in Germany immediately following the Second World War. Each role was splendidly fulfilled by Pacific Theater performers, combining under Achterberg's talented scrutiny, to give onlookers a moment they are not likely to forget. The production's originality and unusual approach was enhanced by its scene, as it was presented in Morris Chapel.

The outstanding production, directed by De Marcus Brown, was one of the season's highlights.

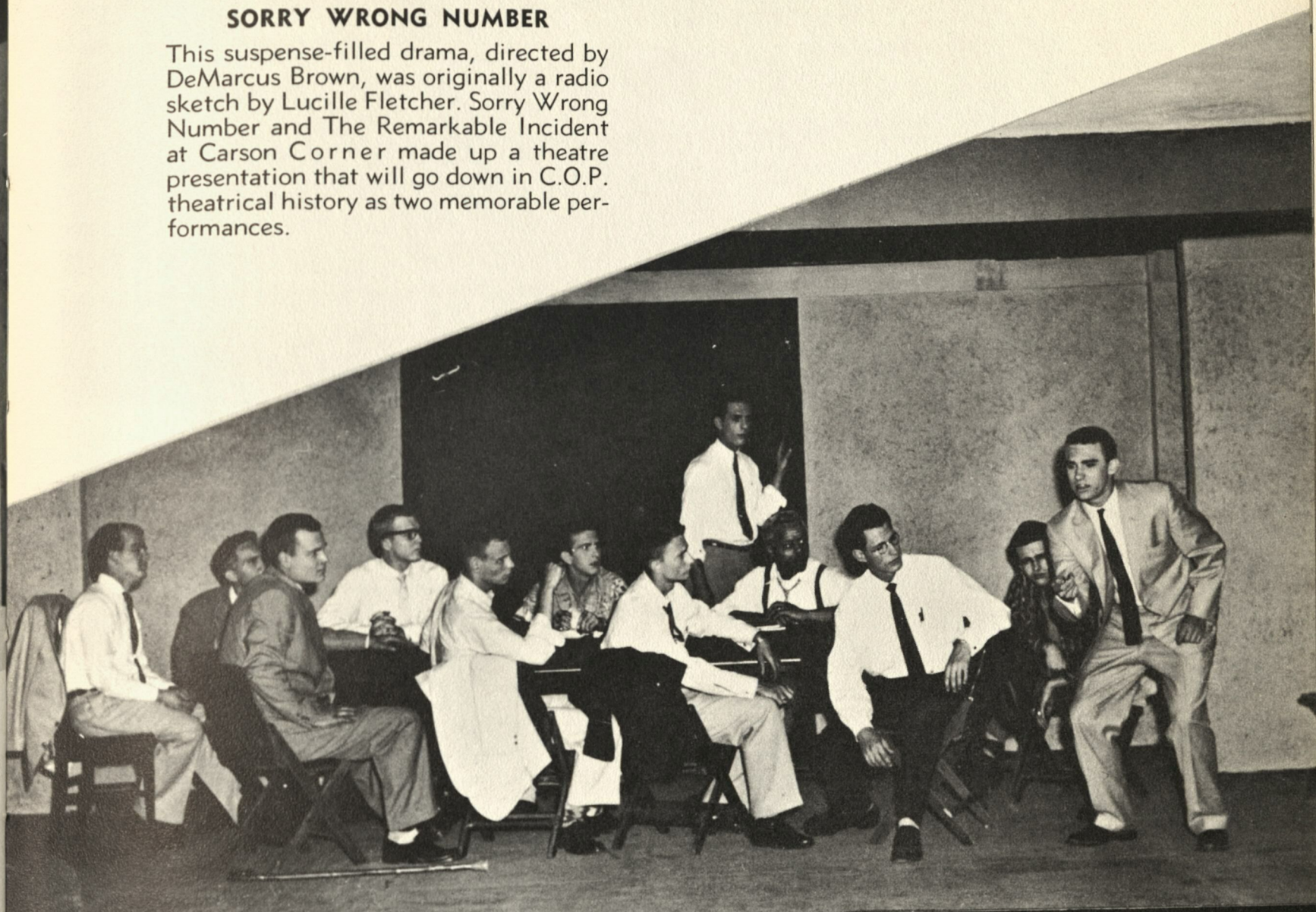

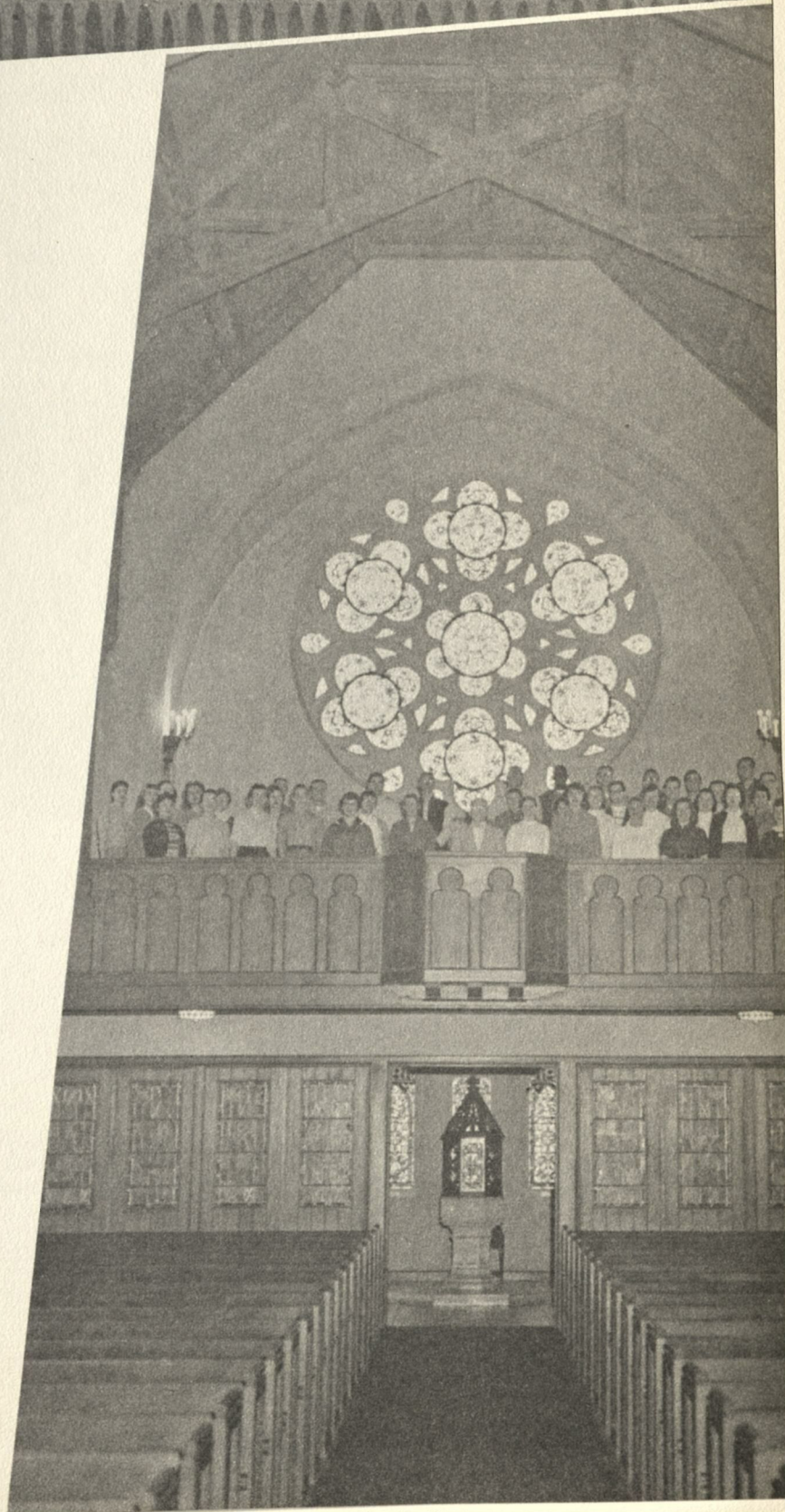


THE MAGIC FLUTE

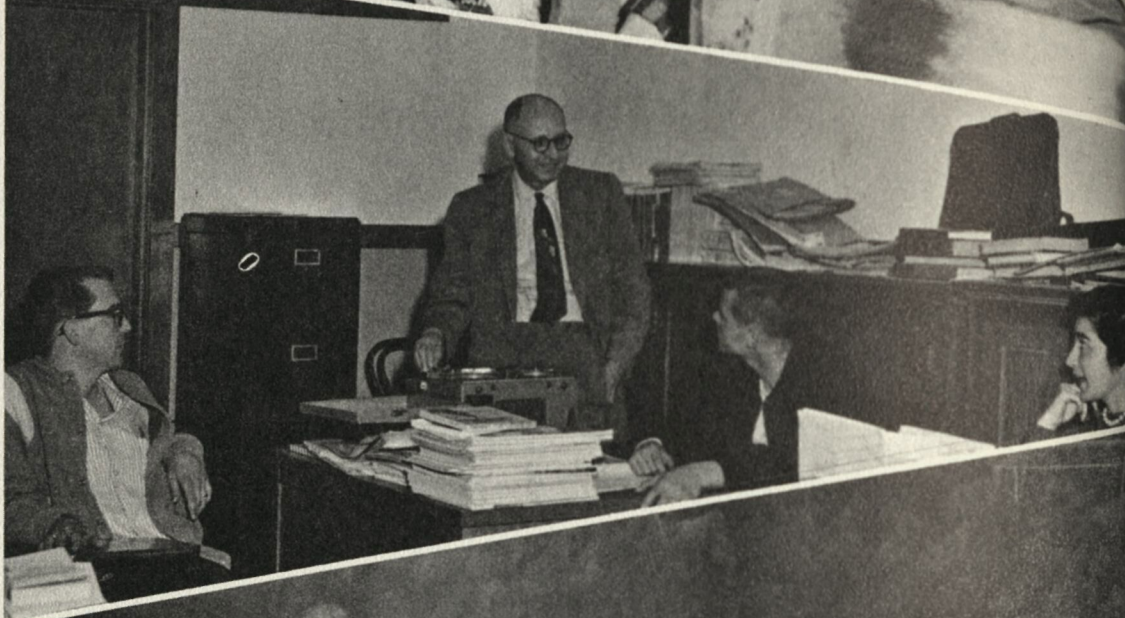
LITERATURE CLASS

Professor Hand of the English Department is instructing a class in the fundamentals of literature. More advanced courses help to continue the students' growing interest in literature.



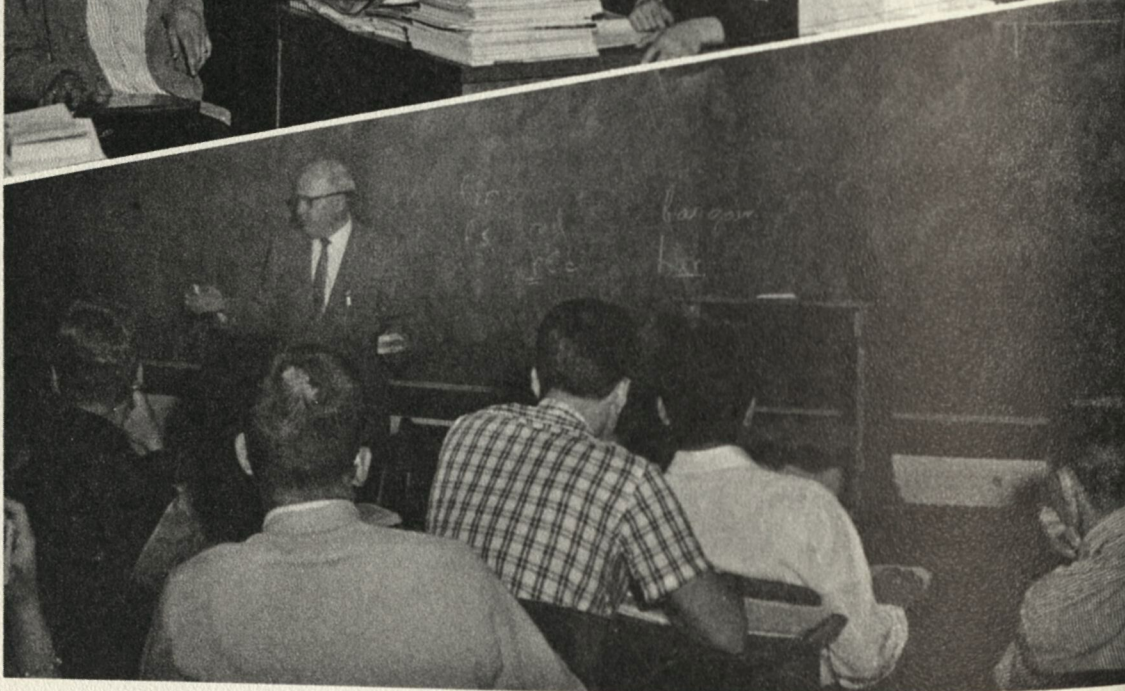
LANGUAGE CLASS

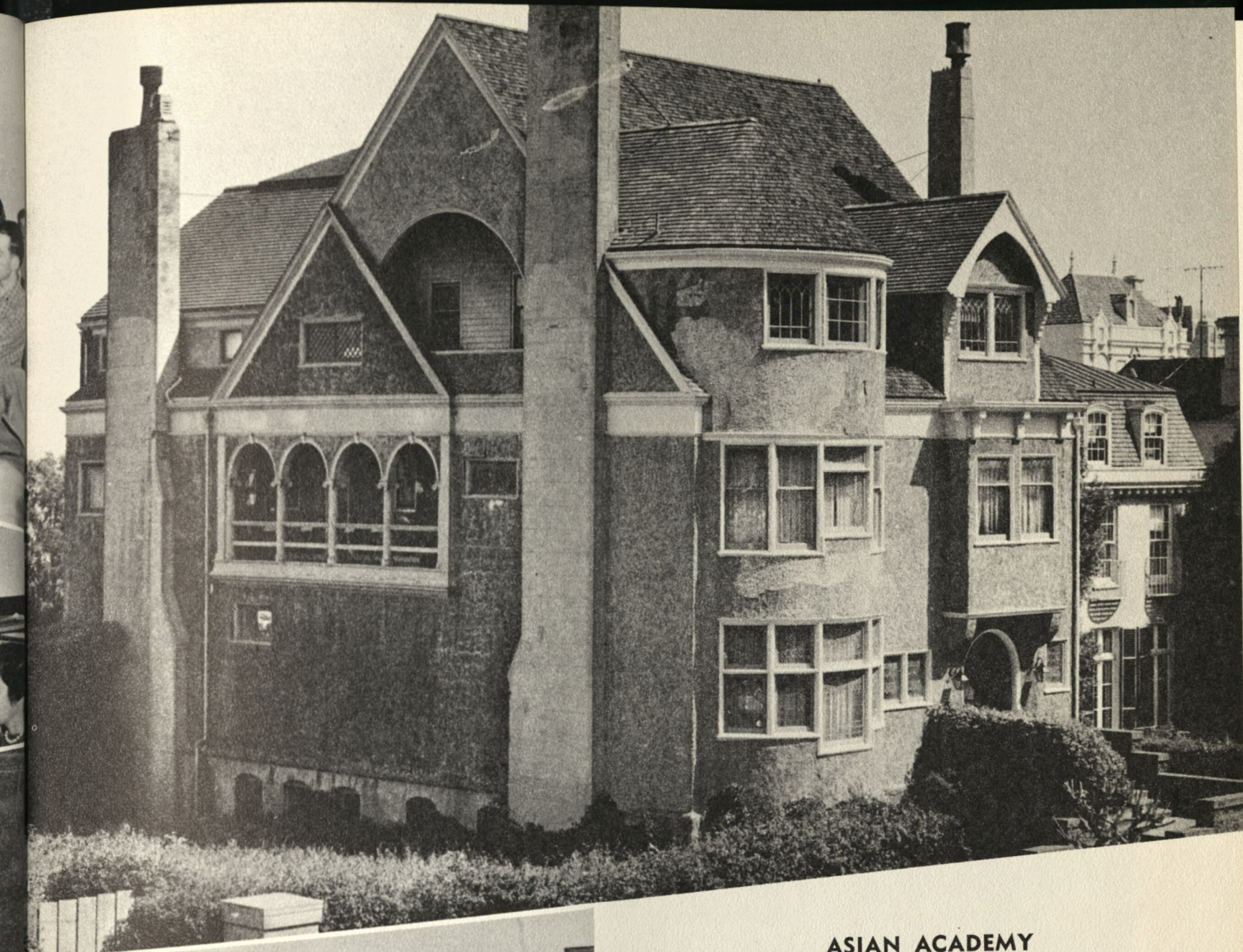


SPEECH CLASS

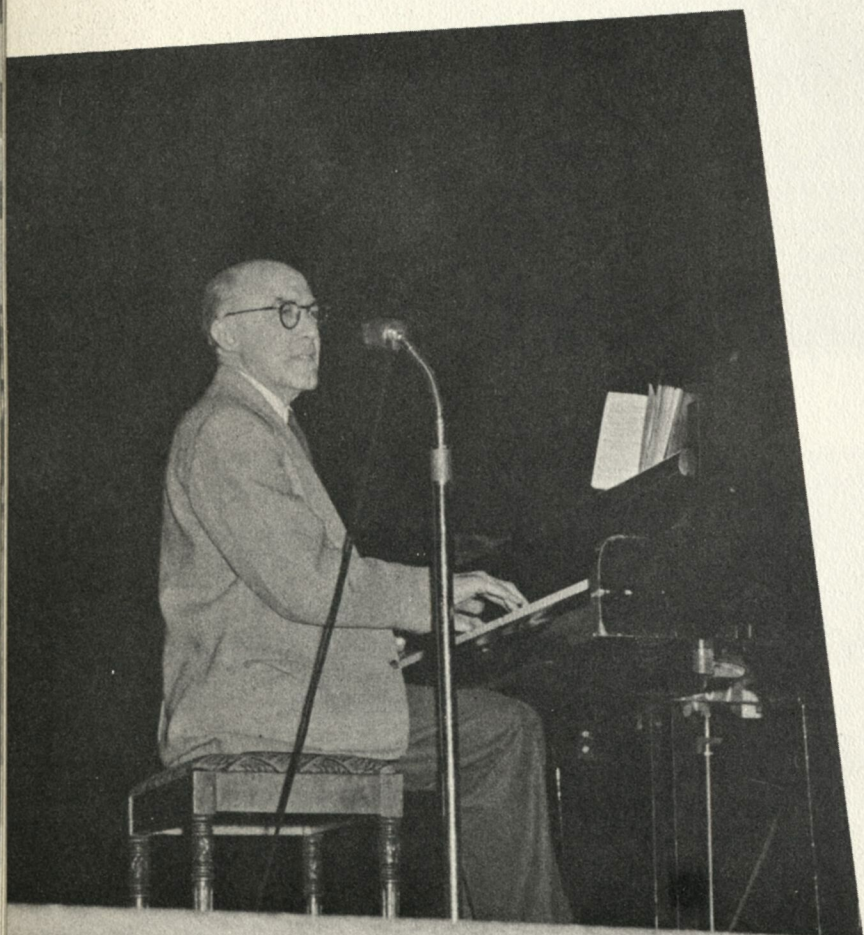


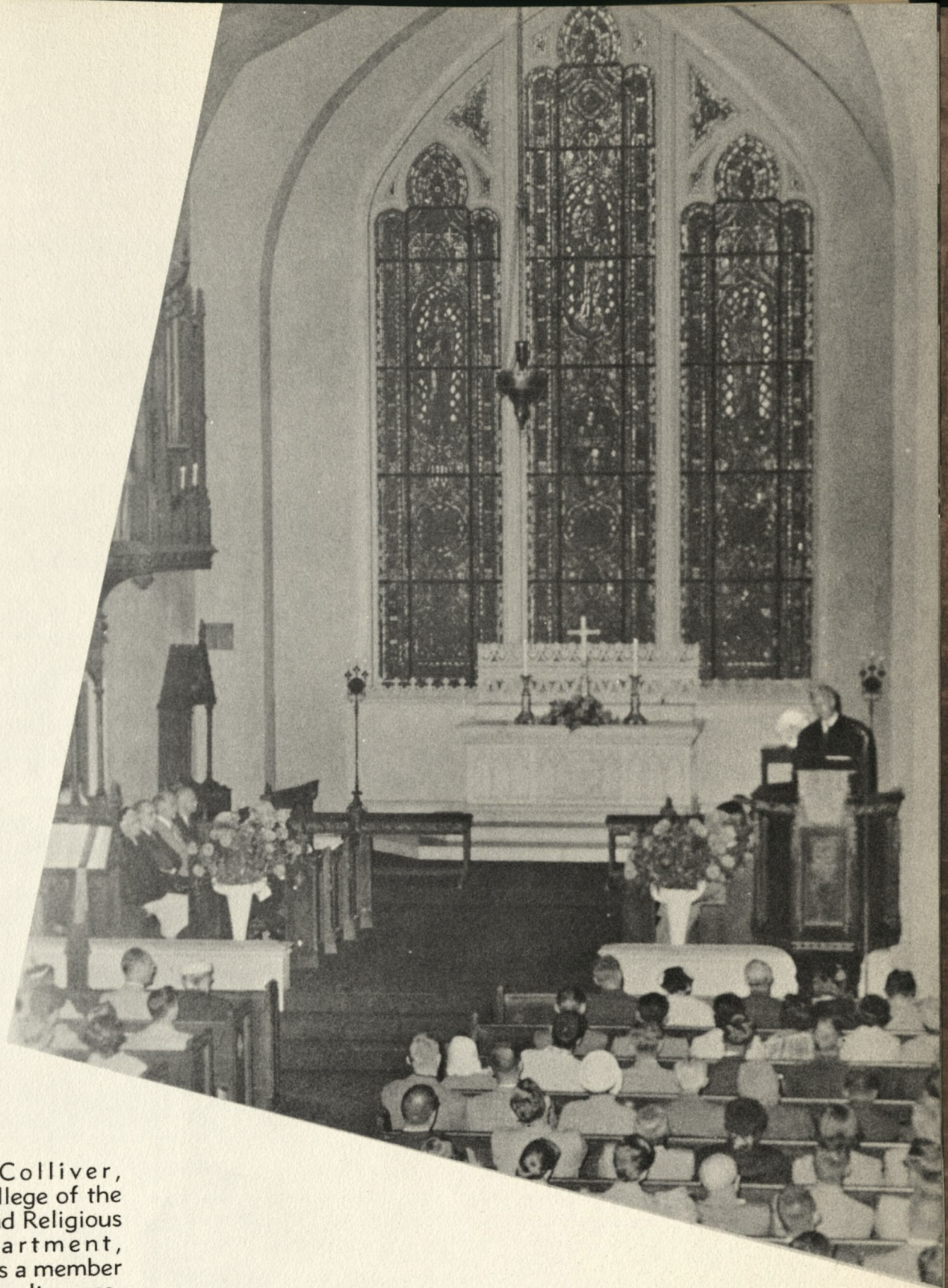
Homecoming Queen Darla Zunino

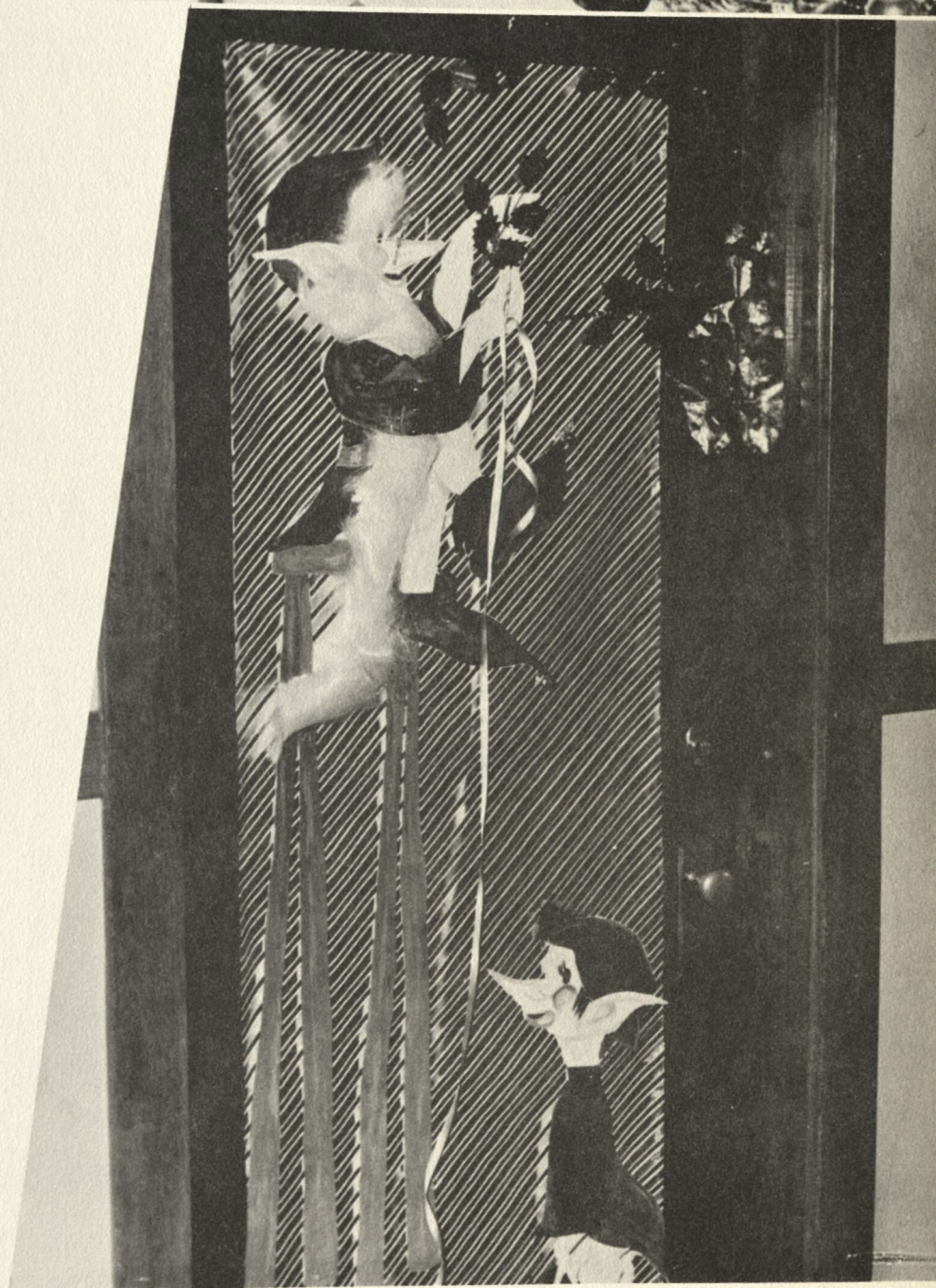

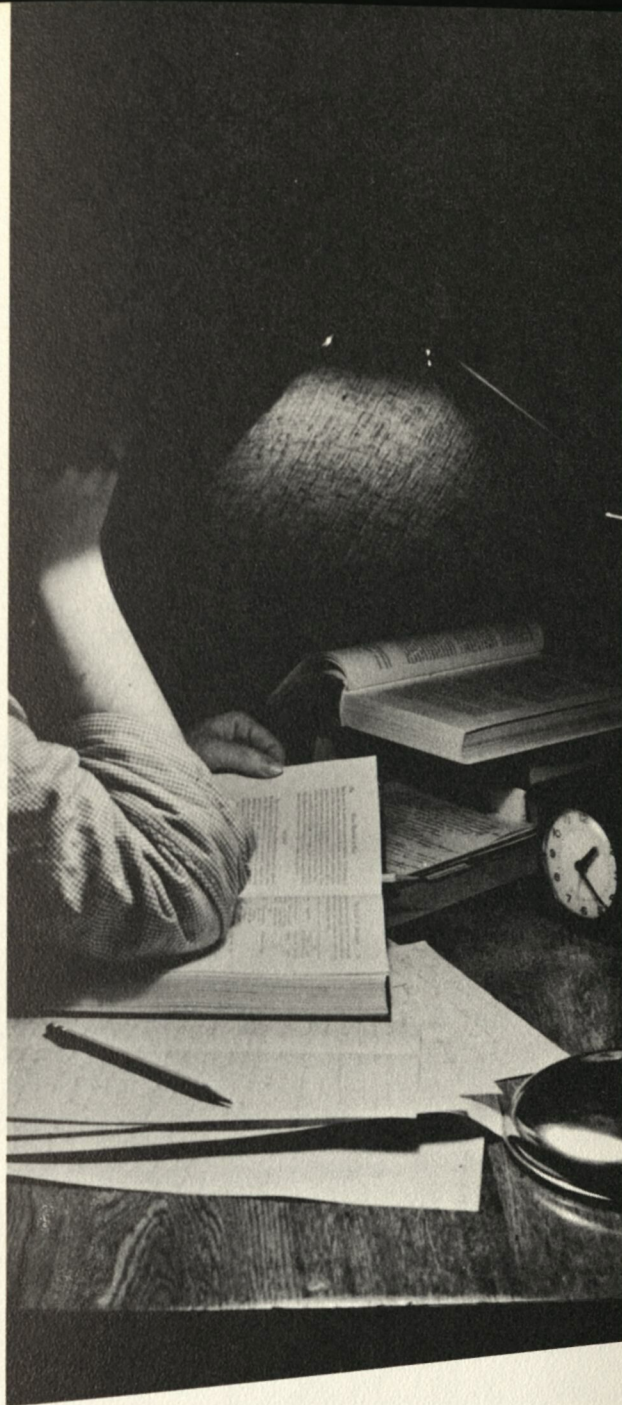

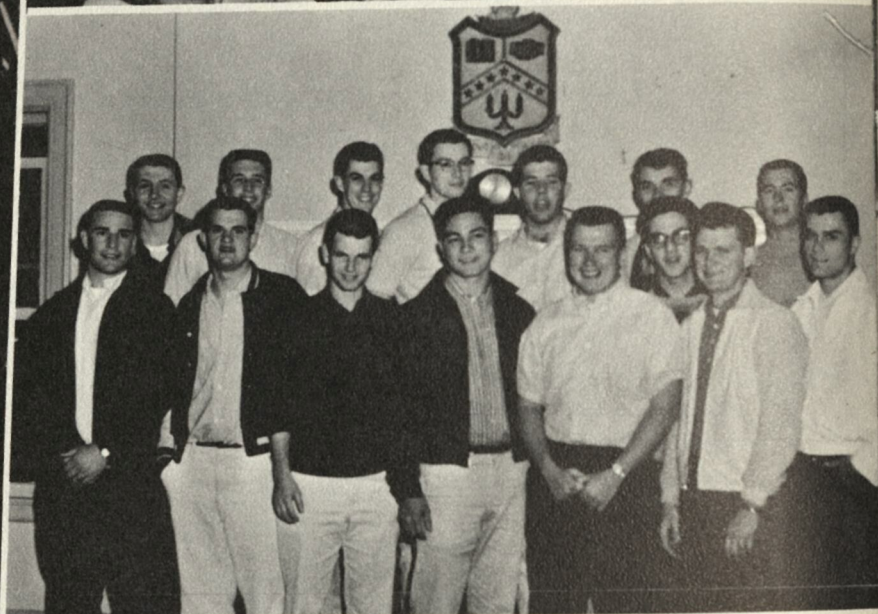


Greek Dances

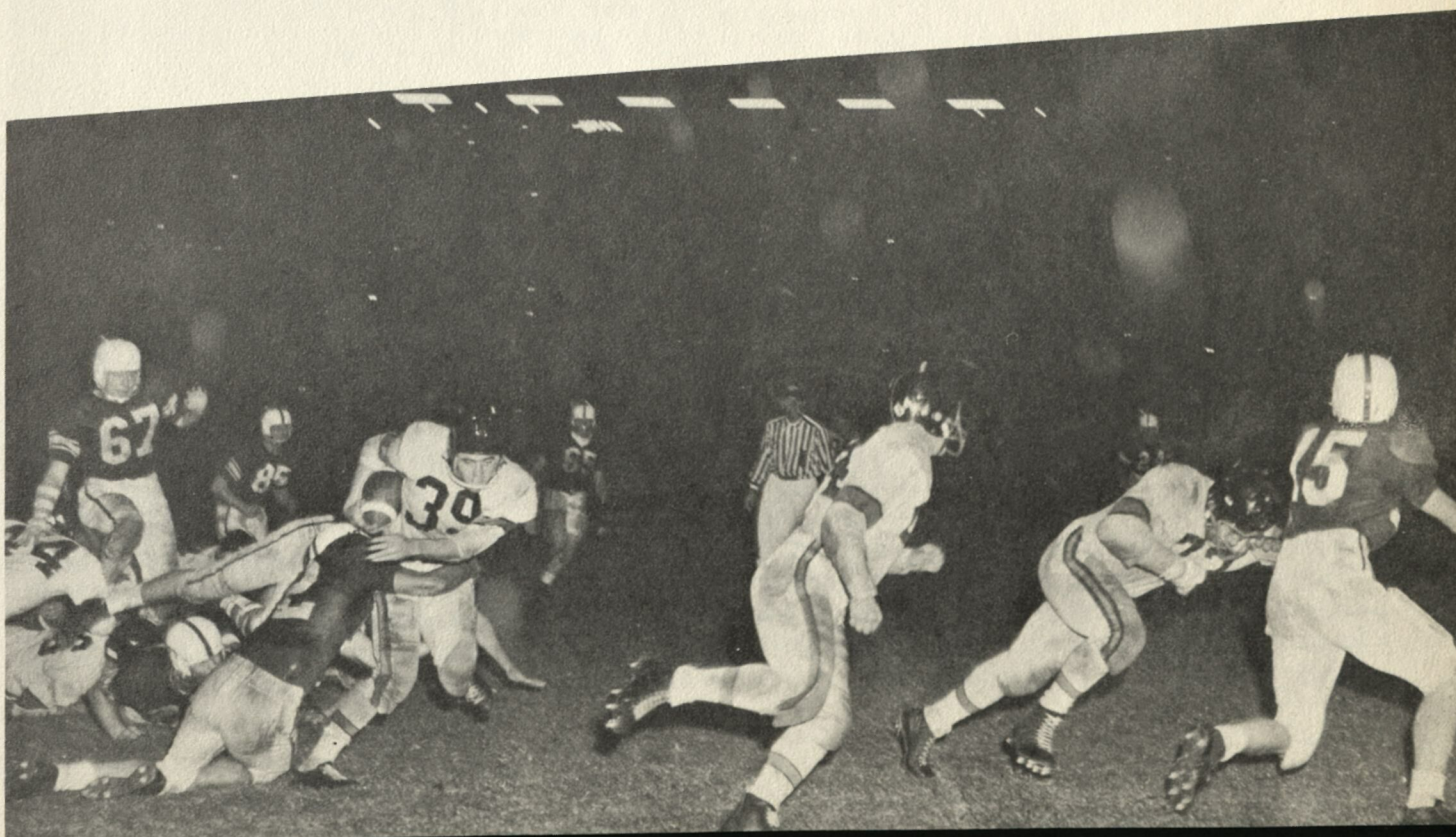


COP-21 Tulsa-13

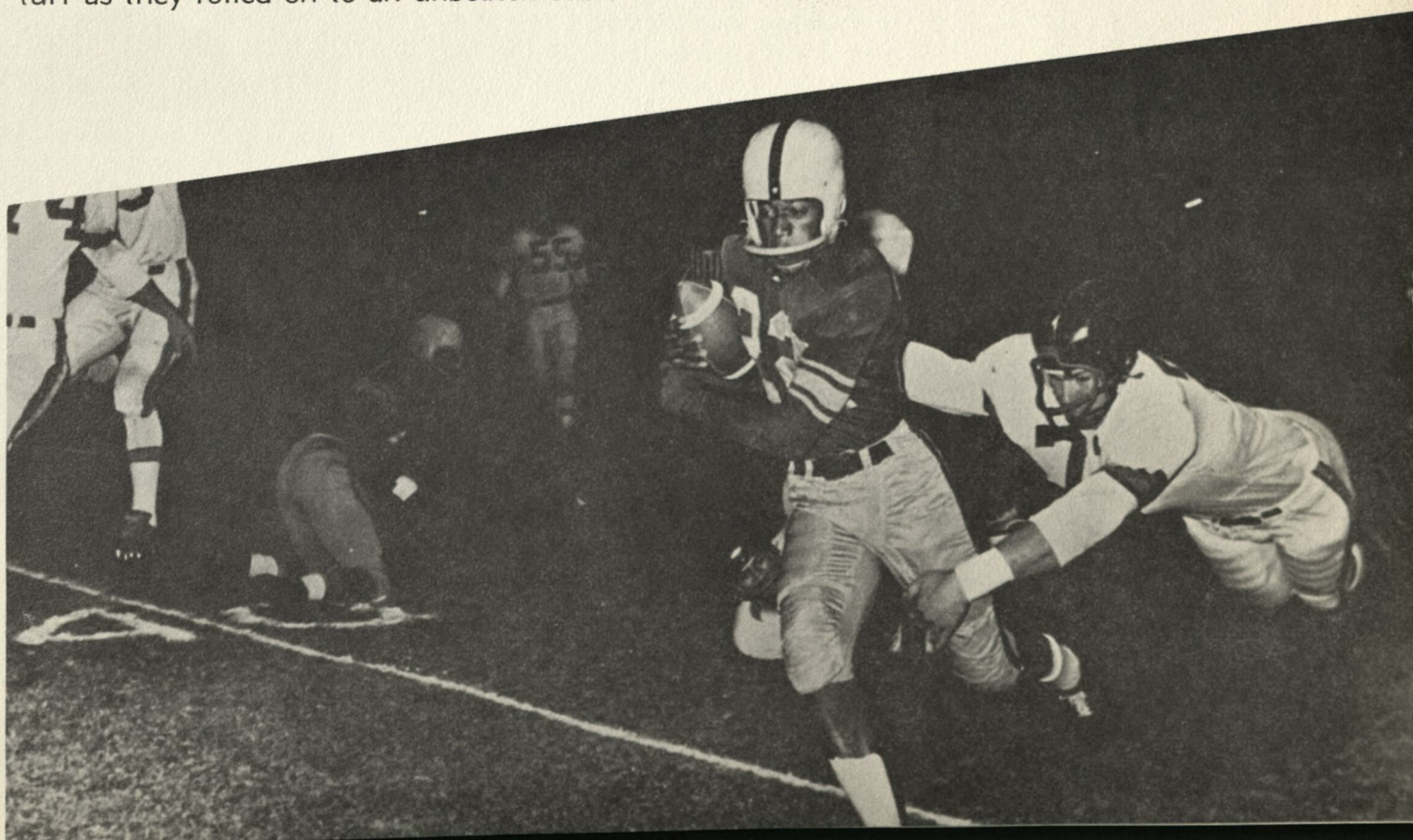


COP-0 UCLA-21

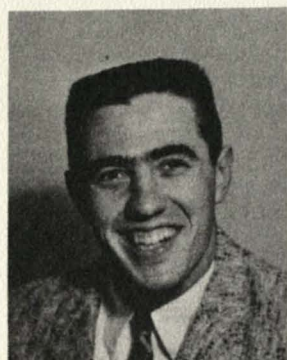
COP-0 Arizona State-41
