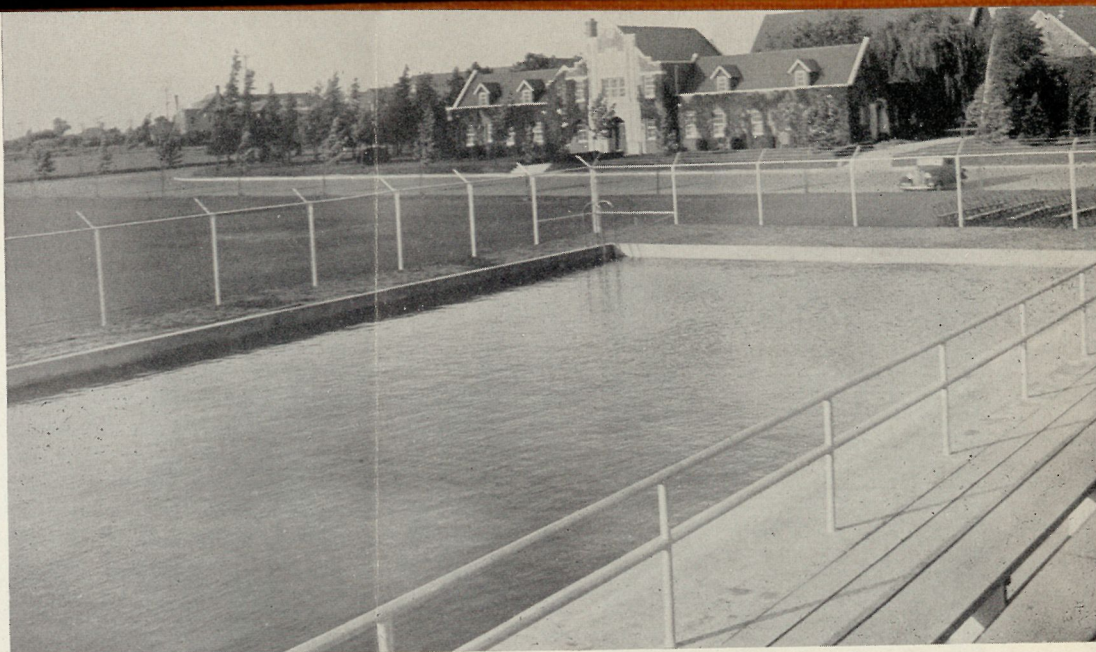
## Boss Appointed Librarian Emeritus

### Schilpp Accepts Northwestern University Lectureship

Professor Paul A. Schilpp has accepted a call as lecturer in philosophy to Northwestern University for the year 1936-37. He has been granted a leave of absence from Pacific for the year. He expects to leave shortly after the close of Summer School to take up his new duties.



Schilpp has also recently been honoured by an appointment as Mendenhall Lecturer at DePauw University for the year 1937-38. These lectures have uniformly appeared in book form and Schilpp's lectures will come from the press immediately after they are delivered. He has also been appointed Conference lecturer of the Idaho Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church which will meet inocatello, Idaho, August 26th to 30th.

Since he came to the College of the Pacific in 1925 he has written and published four books: "Do We Need A New Religion?", "Higher Education Faces the Future", "Contemporary Morality", and "Commemorative Essays." He has published more than sixty articles mostly in technical philosophical and educational magazines.

During the last year Schilpp has been Associate Professor of German Language and Literature. He received his Ph. D. from Stanford University on June 14, 1936.

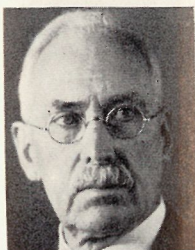
