In what promises to be the greatest football game on a Stockton football field, Santa Clara and Pacific renew their old-time Big Game rivalry. Previous to their last tussle in 1915, the Tiger-Broncho game rated as one of the Big Games on the Coast, and the rivalry between the two institutions was such as to make the game worth going miles to see. The game today will be of equal interest and one long to be remembered.

Santa Clara has this year defeated the strong Nevada team, which in turn defeated Pacific 14-0. They also held the strong Trojan team to the low score of 28-9. On the other hand Pacific has defeated the strong Chico State and Modesto Junior College elevens by decisive scores, being nosed out by Davis Farm, and enter the contest today fully determined to win.

Of additional interest to Stocktonians is the fact that Barsi, star fullback on the Broncho team, is a former Stockton High star, and will be opposed by "Pop" Stoltz, who has gained the reputation of being the best fullback in the Far Western Conference. Stockton High will be represented on the Tiger team by "Solid" Comfort, "Don" Carr, and Everett Ellis.

Another interesting duel will take place between Casanova, Broncho star punter, rated as one of the best on the Coast, who punted for 103 yards in last year's St. Mary's game, and King, Tiger captain, rated as one of the best in the Far Western Conference.
