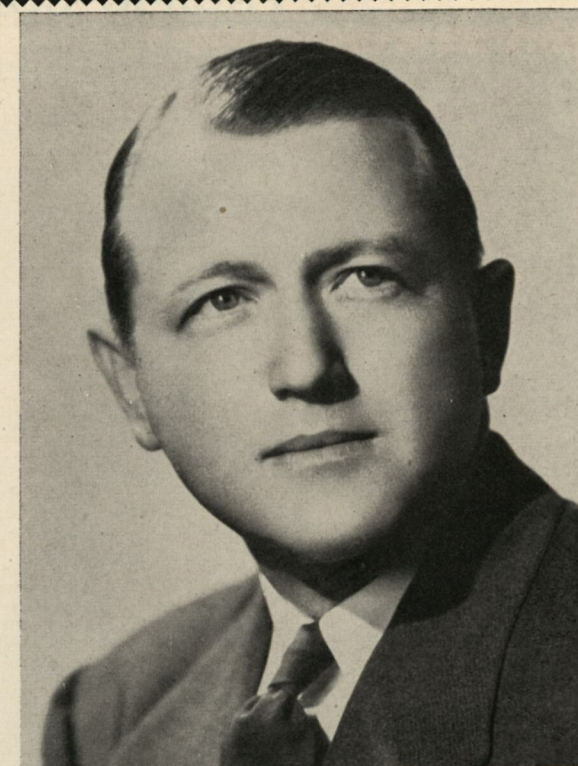

California State Polytechnic College this year enters its second season of California Collegiate Athletic Association conference competition. With 22 returning lettermen plus some heavy and excellent material from the freshman squad, the Mustangs should field a better aggregation than last year's which won but one game out of 10 tries. Cal Poly failed to bounce into a conference win.

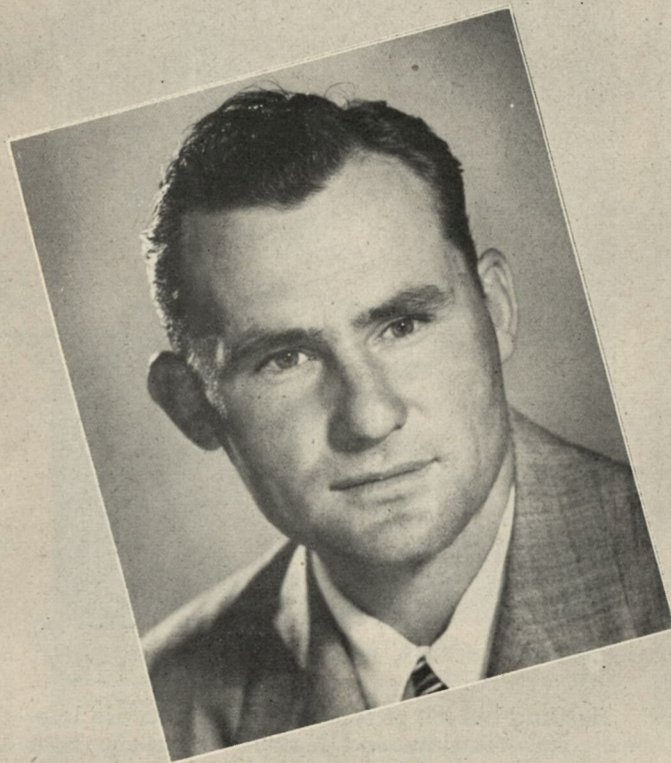
Heading the list of returning lettermen are linemen Hal Winslow and Marshall Samuels. Both received honors for their standout line play last year. End Winslow was named the team's most outstanding player and was given honorable mention on the CCAA conference all star team. Samuels, a 230 pound tackle, was listed on several all opponent elevens.

Bolstering the varsity line this year, which was tabbed the weakest part of the Mustangs last year, will be upcoming freshman Charles Haynes, 204 pound, 6-2 tackle; Rolf Harader, 205 pound guard; Howard Heilman, 200 pound tackle; Don Chambers 212 pound tackle; Dave Martinez, 200 pound end, standing six feet; Dave Faddis, tackle and Keith Mickelson, rugged guard. A transfer guard from Pasadena City College, John Kunkle, 195 pounds, will also give plenty of aid. This lot, joining hands with veterans, Fred Adams, guard; Joe Griffin, guard; Bob Croce, center; John Fitzgerald, center; Jack Bolton, tackle; Samuels, tackle; Roy Bethel, tackle; Deane Anderson, center; Don Dulitz, end; Don Dutcher, end; Bill Hume, end; and Winslow, end, will give Cal Poly more of a chance in their second year in fast conference.

Other lettermen back are Reg Jespersen, Emil Padjen, Bob McCutcheon, all halfbacks; Shunro Nomura, fullback, who has been shifted to halfback; and quarterbacks Vernon Bebernes, Lee Rosa, Jerry Carter, and Dale Gill. Up from the frosh is a promising back, Gene Seminario, quarterback. Transfers Bill Sanders, fleetfooted halfback from Pasadena City College, and Al Gomes, T quarterback from San Luis Obispo JC will give considerable help.
