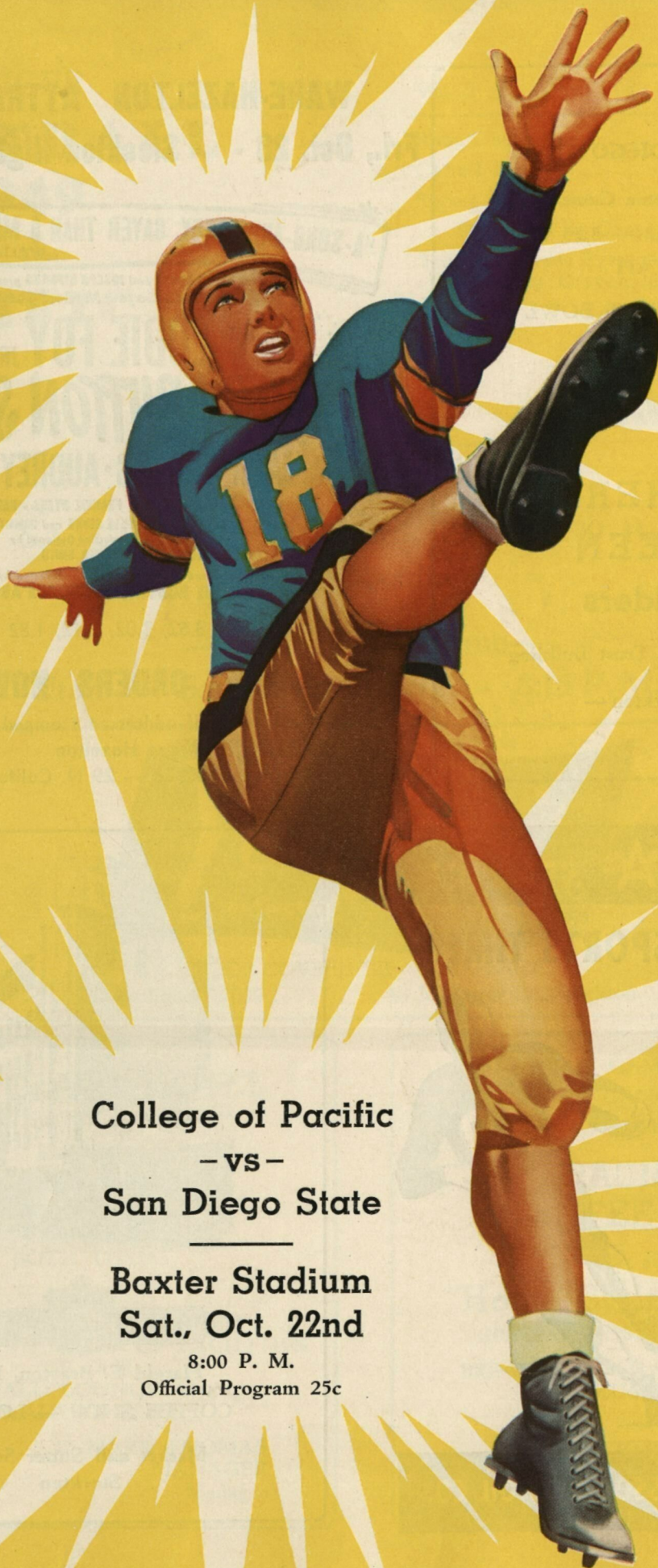

THE GAME

A good indication of how Pacific would have fared in California Collegiate Athletic Association play this season will show up in the final result of tonight's battle between San Diego State's unbeaten Aztecs and the equally unblemished Bengals.

Around the southland they are saying that Bill Schutte's Montezumans have it this season and will challenge the perennial CCAA favorite, San Jose State, for the league crown.

The Aztecs have done nothing to disprove that notion to date, breezing through to three convincing wins in their first three games.

Pacific's record now stands at five wins and no losses and Larry Siemering and Company would like nothing better than a convincing win this evening to send the Tigers into next week's big one with the Prune City Spartans riding high.

Offensively the Bengals have rambled for 2298 yards thus far, an average of 459 yards gained rushing and passing per game. Their 215 points puts them among the scoring leaders of the nation.

On the defense side of the ledger, the Tiger forward wall has held five opponents to an average of 72 yards gained running per game.

Reserve right halfback Paul Williams ran like a wild man last week against Portland, scoring five times, and is the team scoring leader with 30 points. Behind him come Bruce Orvis and Al Smith with 24 points each off four touchdowns. Bill McFarland has converted 22 times to stand fourth.

Through the air, Pacific has completed 51 of 101 passes for 845 yards and five touchdowns. All America prospect Eddie LeBaron has thrown 38 for 75 for 634 yards and Doug Scovil has completed 13 of 26 for 211 yards.

On the ground, Bruce Orvis is back in the lead again with 259 yards gained, followed by Don Hardey at an even 200 and Don Brown with 169. Those three, plus Eddie Macon, Jim Price, Al Smith, Ernie Bobson and Paul Williams, have all gained over 100 yards.

Alertness has been one of the prime factors in Tiger successes and it shows up in the fumbles recovered statistics. Pacific opponents have bobbled the ball on 15 occasions so far and the Orange and Black has come up with the ball on 11 of those times.

The Aztecs and Bengals have clashed five times previously, with Pacific winning four of the games. Last season the Tigers downed SDS, 41 to 14, in San Diego.

The only thing certain in football is the uncertainty of it all — and the fact that there will be one less unbeaten football team on the coast after tonight.

A colorful wide-open ball club which can strike with equal potency in the air or on the ground; a club which has a hard hitting, agile line.

That's the way the 1949 San Diego State College Aztecs have looked in their three games to date.

They have a record of three wins against no losses going into tonight's game and so far have shown a world of improvement over the '48 outfit.

Powered offensively by the strong left arm of Quarterback Jesse Thompson and the deft handling of Quarterback Wendell Weller, the Aztecs can throw an assortment of halfbacks and fullbacks at the opposition in the ground game.

Up front it's "the same old story." San Diego State, every season since the war (whatever the record) has been noted for its bruising lines. And this year is no exception. Top men on the forward wall are Center and Co-Captain George Coleman and Tackle Tom Dahms.

Coleman, who is playing his fourth varsity year at San Diego, has been tabbed the best on the Pacific Coast by his coach, Bill Schutte, and newspapermen have been quick to agree with that statement. Coleman's line backing prowess is little short of phenomenal. Against Pomona he was making his usual share of the tackles and came up with two pass interceptions as well.

Dahms, who last year was All-CCAA, Little All-Coast and a host of other "alls," also has been outstanding on the line. Despite his 230 pounds, the 6-ft. 4-inch giant has been moving like a cat. He has displayed even more skill in his line play than he did last year.

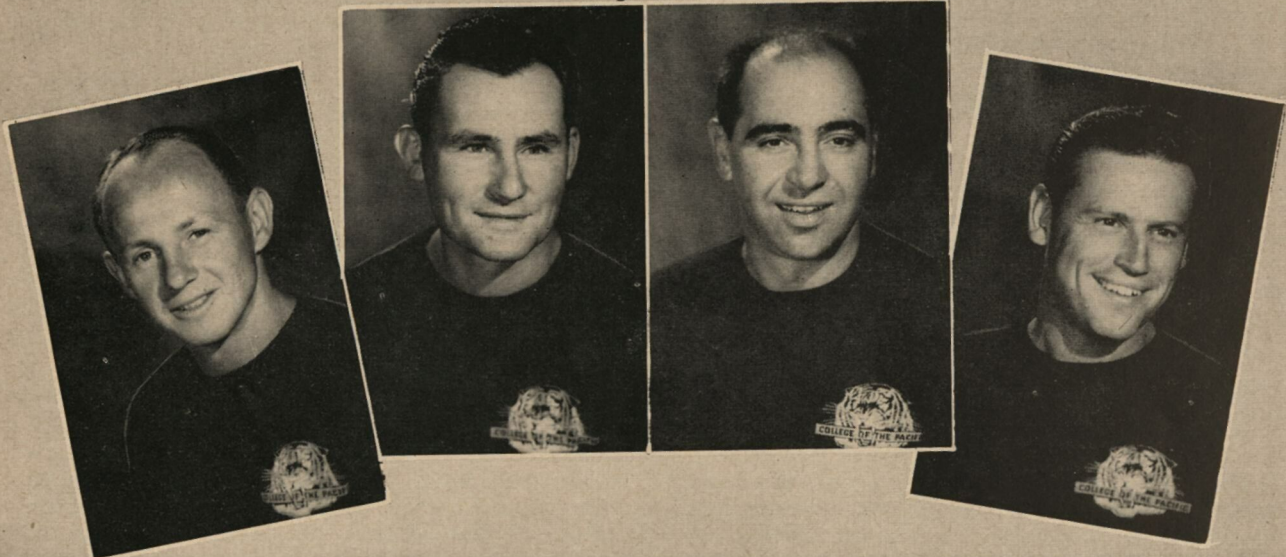
While all this good line play is accepted as a normal situation at San Diego State, the work of the backs has caused quite a bit of comment — all pleasant. With "Wizard" Weller and Jesse "The Arm" Thompson giving the quarterback ranks a shot in the arm, the whole backfield has come along.

In the halfback ranks Schutte has veterans Murry Callan (last year's top ground gainer), Bob Tomlinson, Chuck "Dancer" Daniels and Dick Adair all back in the fold. In addition, he has a new shot of power from "Agile Art" Preston, former Grossmont High flash, and Jim "Truck" Simmons, who literally tore the Pomona Sagehens to pieces two weeks ago.

In the fullback slot he has the other Simmons brother, "Rammin' Richard" for veteran power along with two transfers from Orange Coast JC — Brian Hanzal and Ralph "Bruiser" Freitag. Also in the fullback picture is Art Williams, the Aztecs' great sprinter. He is still green but has lots of speed and is coming along fast.

The Aztecs know they will be facing the battle of their lives when they try to match the offensive and defensive skill of COP's mighty Tigers — but the Scarlet Horde will be trying!

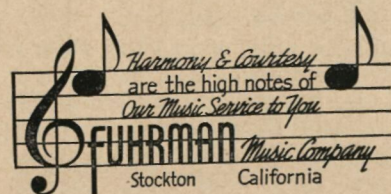
