THE GAME

Down through the years, College of the Pacific and San Jose State have waged one of the most intense football "wars" in Central California. And there is no indication that a truce will be signed before tonight's game.

Football records show clearly how the two teams have battled long and hard through 22 games, with Pacific winning eight, losing 12 and tying two.

They also show, much to the dismay of local fans, that Pacific has not won over San Jose in Stockton since 1930, when the Tigers emerged on top by 27-0. In the period beginning in 1932 and lasting through 1946, Pacific did not win a single game against San Jose. But the drought finally ended, and Pacific has won two out of the last three.

These two teams have waged some of the most disputed games in the annals of football history. Most of the fans sitting in the stadium here tonight do not have to be prodded to begin re-discussing the 1948 affair in Lodi's Grape Bowl, won by San Jose, 14-7.

That was the game when Referee Frank Powers blew his whistle as faking Fullback John Poulos plunged into the line, only to discover that Eddie LeBaron still had the ball and was throwing it far downfield to Roy Kirsten on the Spartan 30-yard line. But the play did not count because of the ill-fated and ill-timed whistle.

The 1941 game was another highly disputed one, again won by the Spartans. This one ended 7-0, but Tiger adherents insist that post-game movies show San Jose Fullback Allen Hardesty never actually crossed the goal line with the winning touchdown.

A little over a decade ago, 1939 to be exact, Coach Amos Alonzo Stagg of Pacific and Coach

"Pop" Warner of San Jose directed opposite forces in a game that was the climax of Mr. Stagg's 50th year of coaching. Warner's double reverses ruined the celebration, 13-3.

Bob Bronzan, now head coach at San Jose, took part in that 13-3 win, but only for a little while. "Battlin' Bob," a senior and star tackle for the Spartans in '39, was ejected from the game for some unscheduled fisticuffs with "Bud" Linschied, Pacific end.

Only once have the two teams gone scoreless. That was in 1935, when both teams came close but missed. The highest score of the series was in 1923, when the Tigers came out on top by 46-0.

Tonight, another chapter is to be added. It could be just another football game, but the mixing of the orange and black of Pacific with the gold and white of San Jose usually sets off an explosion that can be heard for miles and is relived for many years to come.
