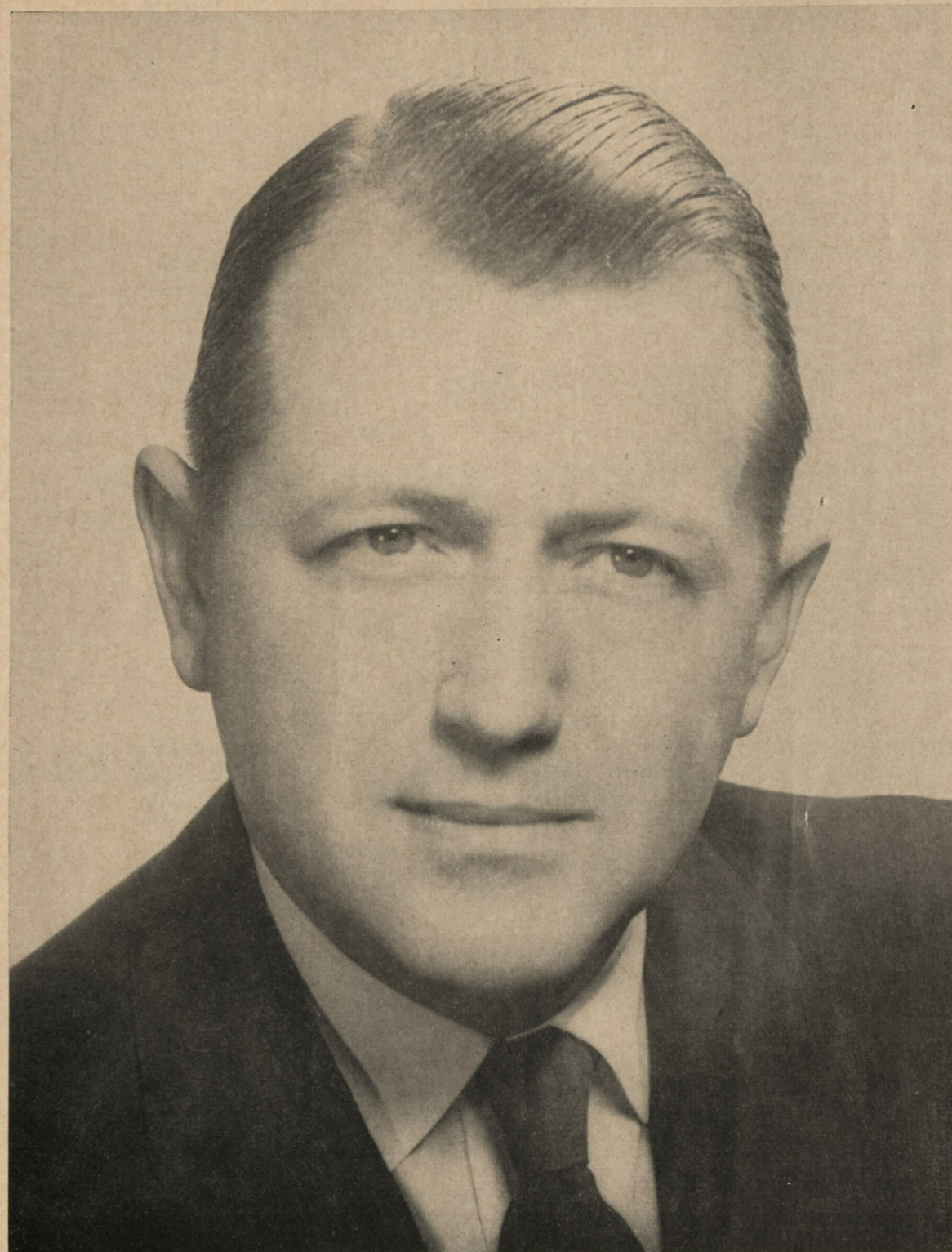

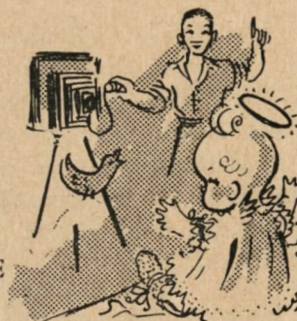

IN ADDITION TO THE GAME....

Stirring band music and twirling batons will feature this evening's colorful pageantry in the Showplace of the Valley, Pacific Memorial Stadium.

Over 200 brilliantly uniformed high school musicians from Northern California will join together on the stadium turf, and Doctor Constantin Bakaleinikoff, Music Director of RKO Studios in Hollywood, will be the guest conductor in a magnificent medley of band music.

Baton twirlers will add to the spectacular picture and in the featured spots will be National Champion Bob Roberts of Hollywood, who handles a baton like an All-American quarterback juggles a football, Sylvia Lailey of Los Angeles and Jo Ann Burdick of Anaheim, two of the nation's finest feminine twirlers, and College of the Pacific's own top not performer, Bob Stegman.

This entertaining and stimulating exhibition of band workmanship and baton twirling will be the climax of an all-day clinic held by the Pacific Music

Camp under the direction of David Lawson, who also will handle the production and direction on the field this evening. The Music Camp has been established as an inspiration to youngsters interested in music, and also as a training period for further development in the field. Every summer several hundred high school students attend the Pacific Camp, and the pageantry this evening is just one of the many activities stemming from the highly regarded educational group.

Doctor John Lewis of the College of the Pacific Music Education Department, and Harold Heisinger and his College of the Pacific-Stockton College Band, deserve a great deal of credit for tonight's performance due to their fine assistance and cooperation both in the clinic and the actual pageantry itself.

The next home game, which will be the COP-Denver University clash on November 10th, will see a 1000 voice choir, taken from schools throughout the Northern California area, in an Armistice Day "Salute to America."

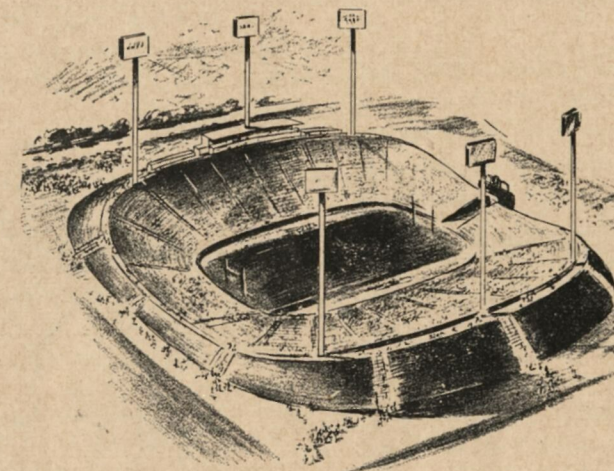

THE GAME

College of the Pacific today tangles with what is certainly the strongest Texas team outside the Southwest Conference this season and one which could play even with most of the Big SW loop — the North Texas State Eagles in their six 1951 games have shown themselves to be a free-scoring, high-yardage outfit with ample reserves.

Coach Odus Mitchell's club this season has found little trouble in rolling over opponents, and many second-string players have seen more action than the starters on offensive and defensive platoons. Strongest opposition was in last week's game with the Carswell Air Force Base, a team which could be termed the "all-stars of the Southwest Conference of 1950. This service outfit included the cream of last season's SW players.

This is the second meeting of the two elevens. At the end of his first NTSC season in 1946, Coach Mitchell took his team to the Optimist Bowl in Houston to defeat College of the Pacific.

A trackman halfback, Ray Renfro, and a 200-pound fullback, Kenneth Bahnsen, have been the big guns in Eagle scoring and yardage this season. Renfro, out last season with a bad knee, had a successful operation and has been gaining almost at will this year. Bahnsen, a converted halfback and last year's leading rusher in Gulf Coast Conference, has been a consistent gainer.

The Eagles' one big question mark at the beginning of the season was whether a new quarterback could be developed to replace Zeke Martin, a four-year letterman now quarterbacking for a Canadian

professional team. Richard Harvey, junior from San Angelo, Texas, has filled the need by averaging more completions and more yardage than Martin did last season, 60% completions and about 125 yards per game.

The Eagles' defensive unit may be one of the heaviest which the Tigers meet this season. The six-man line has played together since 1949 when Mitchell, short of material, took a group of over-size sophomores and welded them into a strictly-defensive line. Headed by such giants as 267-pound Jim Brewer at guard and 245-pound six-foot-four Bill Bishop at tackle, it averages around 225 pounds. Even the ends weigh 200 or more. Opponents have averaged less than 150 yards rushing through this group and about half this passing.
