One of the finest college football teams ever to play in Milwaukee will trot onto the gridiron in Marquette stadium tonight in the form of the College of the Pacific Tigers. It is only fitting that this kind of opposition should be afforded the Hilltoppers for their traditional Industrial night battle. The Tigers are one of the finest teams to come out of the coast for years. They are presently ranked as a coast power along with California and USC. In

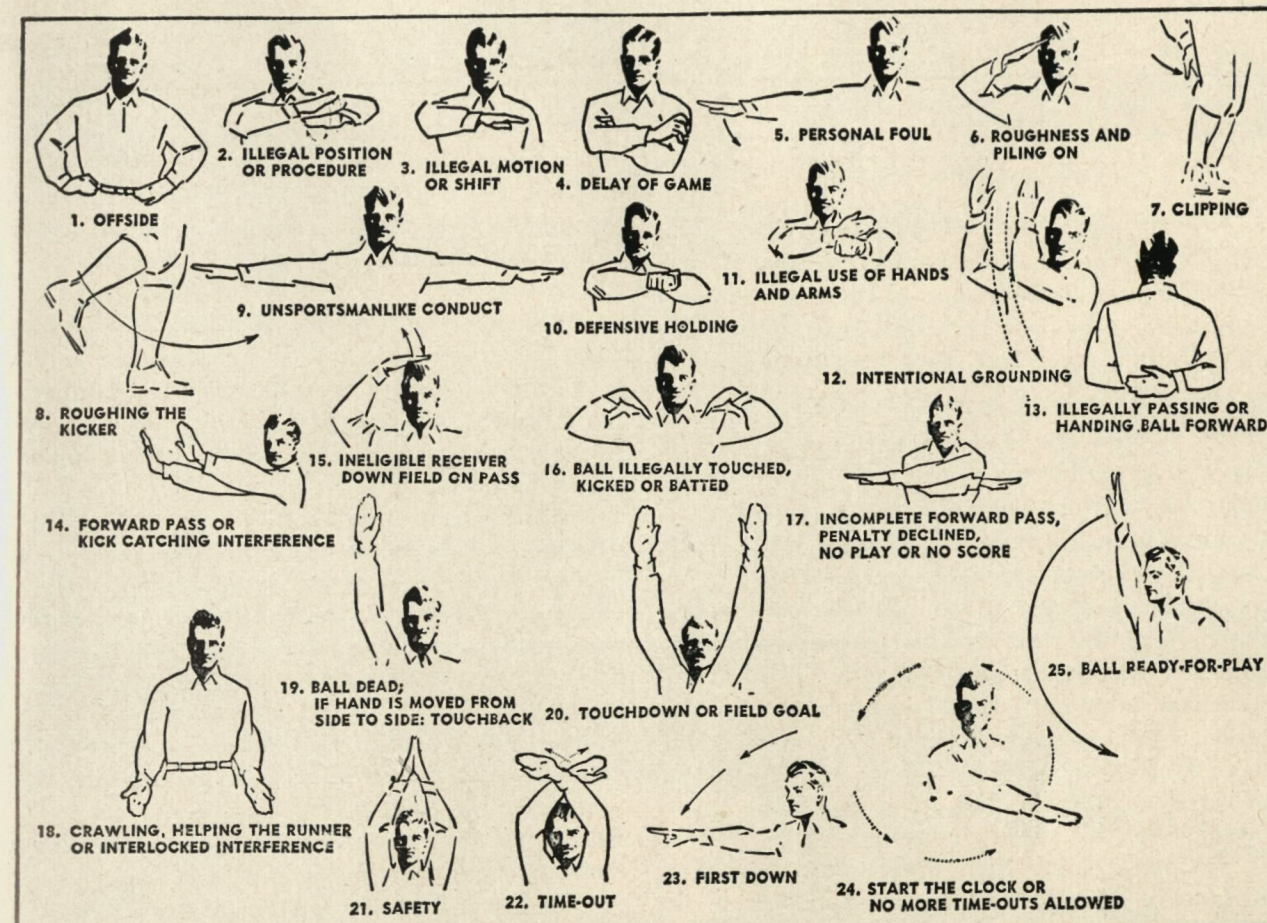

Two veteran tackles, Bob Stoner and Burt Delevan, however, tip the scales at 244 and 228 respectively, and speed has always been a trademark of Jorge coached ball clubs.

Eddie Macon and Tom McCormack are two of the finest halfbacks on the coast this season. Macon is a 9.7 sprinter and once past the line of scrim-

Krueger, 190 pound stalwart from West Division high school, has been termed by Edward Prell of the Chicago Tribune, one of the best defensive ends he has seen all year. This was after Gil's terrific play against Wisconsin. His running mate at end is sophomore Hosea Sims, from Ross high school in Fremont, Ohio, who came to Marquette heralded as an offensive standout but has blossomed into a hard tackling defensive star.

Kick-off specialist and tackle Joe Masnaghetti, three letter winner from Bessemer, Mich., is anchoring the left side of the defensive line for the third consecutive year. Joe has played good ball to date and was highly praised by the Tulsa World sport staff after the Tulsa-MU game. At the other tackle is Johnny Linnemanstons, 220 pound sophomore from Messemmer high school. With two years of varsity competition left, great things can be expected from this stellar performer.

Scrappy Tommy Kelly, little guard from New Richmond, Wis., is the man in the middle of the Avalanche five man line. A midget in comparison to his partners, Masnaghetti and Linnenmanstons, Tom has come to the fore this year with his smashing play.

Phil Daly, punter, and left linebacker in the Hilltop defense, is in his third year on the Hilltop

varsity, returning last season after serving with the armed forces. "Jarrin" Johnny Backman, 195 pound, five foot eleven inch senior from Ramsay, Mich., is the middle linebacker. John saw a lot of action last season and is one of the top defensive men this season.

Freshman Jim Brookins, Oshkosh, Wis., is the right linebacker. Jim is the only freshman in the starting defensive line-up. He came to Marquette last February and took part in spring drills, so impressing the coaching staff that he earned himself a starting berth.

Scat Al Thomas, a 9.8 man in the century, is the defensive left halfback. Al hails from Gary, Ind., Froebel high school, where he starred in football and track. He was a standout on last year's freshman squad and also performed on the freshman track squad. Hard tackling has marked his play this season. Lyle Klein, 20 year old junior from St. Francis high school in Milwaukee, is the other defensive halfback. Lyle started playing regularly this season and has played well, often coming across the field or up from his secondary post to haul down backs on their way to pay dirt.

The last man in the Hilltop defensive unit, but by far not the least, is Capt. Art Lastofka, 20 year old 165 pound senior from West Allis Central high school. Art is completing his third year as a varsity performer and his election to the captaincy was a fitting climax for a fellow who has played such outstanding ball during his three years on the squad.

PENALTIES

Loss of Five Yards

1. Taking more than five times out during either half (except for replacement of injured player).
2. Illegal delay of game.
3. Failure to complete substitution before play starts.
4. Violation of kickoff formation.
5. Player out of bounds when scrimmage begins.
6. Putting ball in play before Referee signals 'Ready-for-play'.
7. Failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team when ball is snapped. Also, backfield man illegally in motion.
8. Offside by either team, or encroachment on neutral zone.
9. Attempt to draw opponents off-side.
10. Illegal use of hands or arms by defensive player.
11. Crawling by runner.

12. Failure to stop at least one second on shift play.
13. Illegal forward pass (includes intentional grounding of forward pass. Also loss of down).

Loss of Fifteen Yards

14. Team not ready to play at scheduled time.
15. Violation of rules during intermission.
16. Illegal return of suspended player.
17. Interference by member of offensive team with defensive player making pass interception. (Also loss of down.)
18. Interference with opportunity of player of receiving team to catch a kick.
19. Illegal use of hands or arms by offensive player.
20. Tackling or blocking defensive player who has made fair catch.
21. Roughing the kicker.
22. Piling up, hurdling, clipping.

23. Tackling player out of bounds, or running into player obviously out of play.

24. Coaching from sidelines.

Other Penalties

25. Striking, kneeling, or kicking opponent—disqualification of offending player plus loss of fifteen yards.
26. Foul within the one yard line—half the distance to the goal.
27. Interference by defensive team on forward pass—passing team's ball at spot of foul.
28. Flagrant roughing of kicker or holder—disqualification plus fifteen yards.
29. Forward pass being touched by ineligible receiver beyond the line of scrimmage—loss of fifteen yards from spot of preceding down and loss of a down.
30. Illegal touching of kicked ball within opponent's ten yard line—touchback.

How to Keep a Statistics Chart

First Downs: When Marquette scores a first down on passes, penalties or scrimmage plays, place an X in the quarter in which it is made. Follow the same procedure in the succeeding quarters.

Penalties: If Marquette loses five yards on an off-side penalty and then another five yards, total the two (10). For each penalty add the loss to the preceding total. This will enable the recorder to know at a glance how many yards were lost on penalties.

Punts: If Daly punts 45 yards, place the total in the No. 1 column. If on his next punt he kicks 55 yards, add the 45 to the 55 and place the total (100)

in the No. 2 column. This also will help the recorder to know off hand how many yards were made.

Passes: In the line captioned "completed," record the information as follows: (Leahy to Tobias 10), the 10 designating the yards gained. Use X marks after each pass "attempted" and "incompleted," and under "intercepted" also record the name of the interceptor.

Individual Records: Follow the same procedure as in the punting records, adding the yards gained in the down to the preceding down. On losses circle the number.

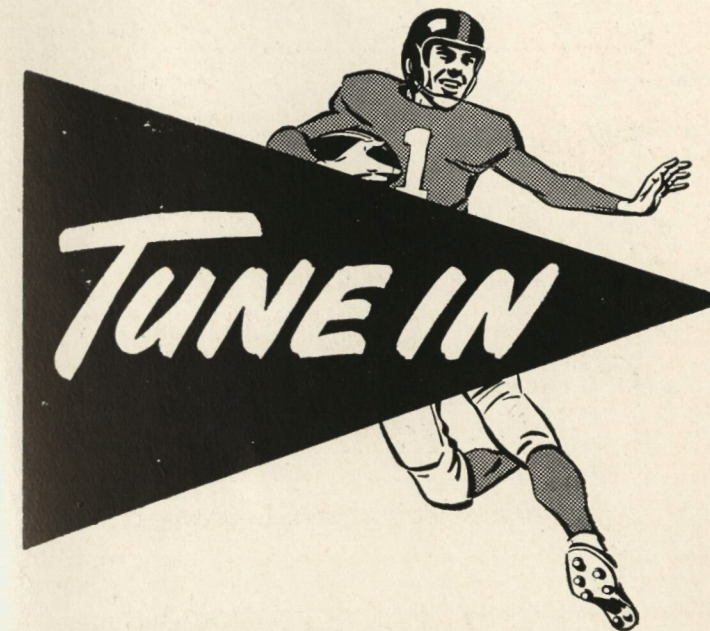

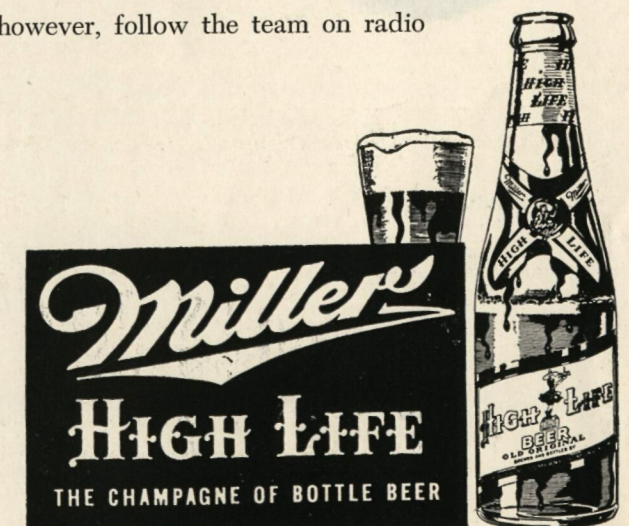
