## THE GAME

Possibly more important than any of the outstanding features about tonight's game is the tremendous stimulus it offers for Northern California Independent football. The capacity throng in attendance here this evening affords concrete evidence that there is definite interest in colorful and evenly matched Independent elevens in this area.

College of the Pacific's Bengals have carved themselves a solid place in major grid competition. With San Francisco's unbeaten Dons as their opponent we find ourselves with one of the most talked about Independent football clashes in years. Such healthy area rivalries should certainly mean sound athletic programs for local schools in the seasons to come.

Joe Kuharich's 1951 edition of the USF Hilltoppers has been called the finest to ever represent the institution. Whether it succeeds in reaching its objective of a perfect season and a possible bowl invitation or not there is much to support the thought.

In All-American fullback Ollie Matson the Dons

have a youth who is possibly the finest football player ever developed in San Francisco. It was a little over two years ago that Ollie made his collegiate debut against these same Tigers in neighboring Lodi. Since that time he has harvested plaudits from Coast to Coast for his amazing exploits.

Little more can be said of Matson that wouldn't be repetition. Needless to say he is pure gold in the eyes of his coaches, teammates and followers and their chief hope to turn the tide in San Francisco's favor.

While Mr. Matson is probably the difference between a good team and one that ranks as one of the nation's best, this is far from a one man gang. In Quarterback Eddie Brown the Dons have one of the country's truly outstanding passers. He was seen as a left halfback when these two teams last met in 1949 but since then has blossomed into an extremely competent qb. Against the Tigers' burly forward wall it could easily be that Brown's rifle throws will be more extensively utilized than Matson's plunges and sweeps.

One of the most colorful USFers is diminutive left half Joe Scudero. His pony-like dashes and fine defensive play have been key factors in their success. It was Scudero, kept out of most of the game with an injury, who dashed from the bench in the second half to provide a spark that helped turn the tide in the Don's 26-7 victory over Santa Clara 2 weeks ago.

# THE GAME

Somewhat less than terrific in their last outing, the COP Bengals, under the guidance of Head Coach Ernie Jorge, play that BIG ONE with Univ. of San Francisco's undefeated and untied Dons before an overflow crowd in Pacific Memorial Stadium tonight.

Because of lickings handed them by Boston and Denver, Pacific's battle with USF doesn't carry the terrific importance it was supposed to, but nevertheless, this is going to be a battle from start to finish.

For Head Coach Joe Kuharich's Dons this is perhaps their most important game of the season from every standpoint. For if his lads bring home the bacon tonight, the possibilities are unlimited.

For Coach Jorge's Tigers, this also is their most important game of the year. A win here would right the two previous wrongs and the Pacific team could legitimately lay claim to the Far Western Independent title. San Francisco figures to be favored, and rightly so. But these Tigers who have looked to impotent in a couple of games, have shown that they can get out and go with the best. Wins over teams of the reputation of Clemson, Marquette, Oregon, Loyola and Hardin-Simmons earned for COP for a little while a high ranking on the national scale.

For several of Pacific's brightest stars of the past three seasons, this is the final home performance. Boys like Eddie Macon, Duane Putnam, Keever Jankovich, Doug Scovil, Al Smith, Pat Ribeiro, Bob Stoner and Doug Smith have performed admirably and Stockton and the College of the Pacific will miss them.

Pacific and San Francisco dot the national statistics as the season ends, lending a lot of reason for tonight's mammoth throng. This game seems by all means destined to go down as Central California's top sporting event of all time.

San Francisco is eight in total offense in the nation ninth in rushing, third in total defense and leads in rushing defense. Pacific is sixth in total offense, third in rushing and tenth in rushing defense.

Individually, the stars are here, too, USF's great Ollie Matson leads the nation in rushing, is sixth in

total offense. Pacific's Tommy McCormick is fifth in rushing and Eddie Macon is 18th.

The figures aren't available, but this must certainly be the only time this season that three of the nation's top 18 running backs have performed together.

Macon and McCormick lead the Tigers in practically every department of advancing the ball goalward. They are the big offensive threat for the Bengals tonight and in all probability will carry a great deal of the load. Pacific's other speedsters Art Lieb-scher, Al Smith, Johnny Cobb, Phil Flock, Hank Welch and Hal Spencer — have important rolls to play and each has come in for his share of glory as the season has progressed. But as things have gone previously, Kealoha Eddie and Cowboy Tommy are the pork chop boys.

The Tiger backs get crushing help from their line-men partners in offense — such as Duane Putnam, Burt Delavan, Jim Fairchild, Keever Jankovich and Bob Stoner. What this crew can do against the USF line which has given but 37.4 yards per game rushing remains to be seen, but if Pacific is to keep its record against the Dons perfect, the running attack will have to produce and upon their shoulders rests the responsibility for giving the Bengal runners an opportunity to move.

In stopping the Dons, COP has more problems than it has faced so far this season. USF is the first team the Tigers have played with an outstanding running attack augmented by an almost equally efficient passing arm.

If the Tigers can contain Matson and his cohorts on the ground, they still have to contend with Ed Brown's aeriels. Viewing Pacific's pass defense record, it apparently would seem likely that there is where San Francisco's best chance would lie. And that is probably the reason Coach Jorge has been working behind locked gates all week — searching for the answer.

Both teams want to win this game. Both will be very "high" for it. Mistakes will be made, dramatic moments will take place, spectacular plays will be executed, and one team will win.

Whichever it is, the fellow who pays his two-and-a-half, whether he sits on the 50 or in the end zone, might do well to think that less than two years ago this couldn't have happened in Stockton and that we're all sitting in on a high spot in Stockton and Pacific athletic history.
