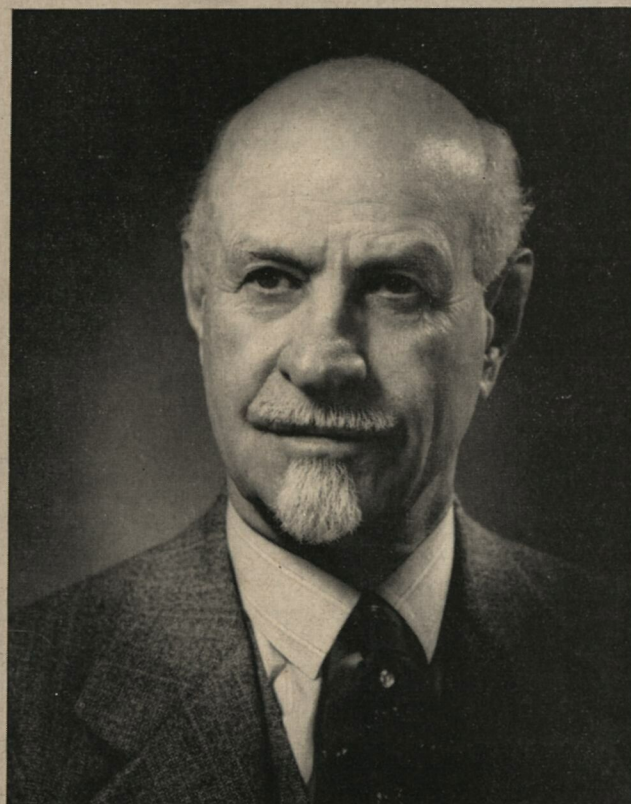

THE GAME

Welcome back. It's been a long time, hasn't it? And for those of you who haven't been here before, this Pacific Memorial Stadium and these College of the Pacific Tigers will provide a real evening's entertainment. When this place was contracted, they must have specified at least one king-sized thrill per contest.

The Tigers have picked a fine opponent for the opener of their five-game 1952 home slate. The Red Raiders from Texas Tech are perfect examples of the well-executed wide-open football played on the prairies of the Southwest.

True to the tradition of that region, DeWit Weaver's eleven is bringing an offensive innovation to the local plant, the split-T. You are undoubtedly familiar with the origin of the system—started in the war years at Iowa Preflight by Don Faurot, Bud Wilkinson and Jim Tatum with an assist from Moon Mullins. The originators went on in post-war years to use the offense with signal success—Faurot at Missouri, Wilkinson at Oklahoma and Tatum at Maryland.

The system differs from the regular T in that the quarterback steps forward after receiving the ball and moves parallel (and almost on) the line of scrimmage before disposing of it in several ways. The options plus the unorthodox line spacing make it difficult to defense and interesting to watch.

Some of the players on the Tech eleven to watch for: Number one is number 1 — Jim Turner, Tech's none-such left halfback who does everything well offensively and defensively.

Tech's promising sophomore quarterback, Jerry Johnson, number 16. As a frosh last year he threw the touchdown pass that put the Raiders in front of COP for good in the Sun Bowl game, the first meeting of the teams won by Tech, 25 to 14.

Others are versatile halfback Bobb Cavazos; End Paul Erwin, the top Tech receiver; and Guard Ray Howard, who gained much respect from the Tiger line in the Sun Bowl affair.

If you didn't have a chance to see Pacific in action in the opener against the University of California in Berkeley, the Tigers show promise of being another great COP eleven.

The attack is balanced and diversified with several reserves showing potential behind such veterans as McCormick and Leibscher. The defense is strong and quick to adjust; it gives ground grudgingly.

Coach Ernie Jorge and his assistants, Hugh McWilliams and Wayne Hardin, have also made innovations in the Pacific attack and promise to continue any and all maneuvers guaranteed to produce touchdowns.

Among the Tigers who are not so familiar but have done good jobs already this season are:

Defensive Halfbacks Al Dattola (56) and Jim Conover (53); Left Halfback Henry Welch (55), who scooted for 131 yards in the win over Utah State; Linebackers Lowell Herbert (77) and Ed Mendonca (63); Guard Gordy Johnson (79) and Tackle Dub Doshier (81).

There will be others out there tonight; it is bound to be a good show. Good spectating.

THE GAME

This could be one of the really great years for Texas Tech in football, but most observers believe that the Red Raiders of Coach DeWitt Weaver are a year away yet.

The genial, gray-haired Weaver frankly isn't sure yet what his 1952 squad will do. For it to live up to expectations, some top reserves will have to recover completely from early injuries.

Three major problems, caused by departing lettermen, face the Raiders. Quarterback Junior Arterburn, tackle Jerrell Price, and Center Red Phillips are gone. All three were outstanding. Arterburn was one of the finest quarterbacks in the nation. Price was in a class by himself, while Phillips was a great leader as well as player.

Weaver believes that the loss of Price and Phillips has been met by changes in personnel. Guard Marland Ribble has been shifted to defensive left tackle, backed up by Paul Barrington, to replace Price. Bobby Lambert, 230-pound All-American at Del Mar (Junior) College, heads the candidates for Price's defensive position.

To work in more beef in the defensive line, however, Lambert joins the lineup at a guard slot operating beside guard Ray Howard. They'll be flanked by tackles Ken Elmore, a starter last year, and David Brown, letterman in 1950, who laid out last fall.

R. B. Hodge, 220 pounder from Blythesville, Ark., should be the top center, but the transfer from Kentucky has been slowed by a leg injury. Little Don Funk, 186 pounds dripping wet, gets the nod, therefore.

Jimmie Williams, who played for San Diego Navy last fall after lettering at Tech in 1950, is taking Phillips' linebacking spot.

But Jerry Johnson, sophomore from little Hale Center, and James Odom, who didn't play a down

last season must fill Arterburn's shoes. And, with Tech operating from the split-T, that's the big problem. Johnson filled in for Arterburn for a while during the Sun Bowl, and looked good. Odom switched from halfback to quarterback during spring training and developed quickly.

The Raiders, with a strong group of freshmen and a seasoned, aggressive squad composed primarily of sophomores, face a rugged 11-game schedule.

Opening with West Texas State of their own Border Conference and closing with North Carolina State of the Southern Conference, the Raiders don't anticipate an easy game anywhere.

Right now a 7-4 record, the same as 1951, would appear to be a good achievement. Anything better than that would be so much gravy.
