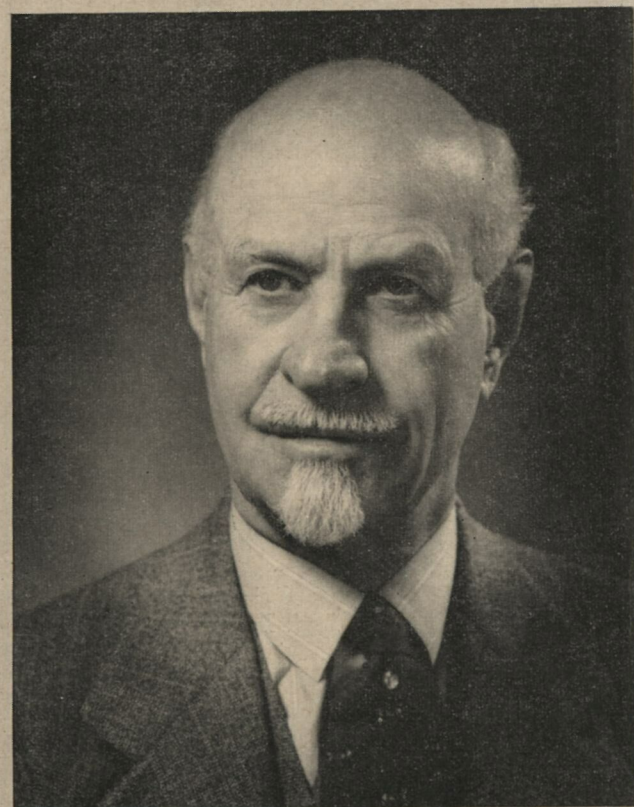

## THE GAME

Something new is in store for the 1952 brand of College of the Pacific Tigers tonight as they tackle a mixture of professional and college football stars all bound together under the title of San Diego Navy.

Realizing they will be up against the strongest service team in the nation, the Striped Cats will be out to win this one — if for no other reason than to avenge, in some way, last week's loss in the San Jose State thriller-diller. That game hurt the Tigers in more ways than one and San Diego Navy is the team tagged to suffer vengeance.

The Bengals realize they are bucking up, in person, against such professionals and greats as Jim Monachino, Verl Lillywhite, Odie Posey, Bob Boyd, Skip Giancanelli and George Musacco. All put together they spell trouble, football trouble, and that is what the Tigers hope they are ready for tonight. They've worked hard this week mending the faults learned against the Spartans and a stiff battle can be assured from begging to end.

The style of pigskin packing the Pac-Cats display in this game can well equal that of the game "they don't have to apologize for", their season opener against the University of California Bears.

Every yard chalked up in the yards gained column behind the name of the Tiger's ball-packer-in-chief, Tom McCormick, goes toward setting a new record that may well stand for years — possibly for all time. Last week, "Atom Bomb Tom" tied and passed the three-year running mark for an individual player at COP. He now stands at 2129 yards with five more games on schedule after tonight. Anything he adds to it in this gridiron conflict means it will be just that more difficult to break. If you are one of those persons interested in the running side of the game, keep an eye on Number 48 in the orange and black.

Something else that has been adding fire to the Tiger's troubles this week is the predictions of the so called experts who are listing the locals as the underdogs. No football team enjoys that and the Bengals are no exception. They want this one. It's fun to win; it's fun to upset the experts.

No matter how the game turns out, win, lose or draw, a gridiron ussle of the best variety is in

store. Maybe it will be another of those close, see-saw, heart weakening affairs that have been on the Pacific Memorial Stadium agenda ever since its opening in 1950. Remember that one, when Loyola upset the orange and black, 35 - 33? They have been just like that ever since.

Two of the men who fought in that battle are here on the field again this evening. They are San Diego's Halfback Giancanelli and Fullback Musacco. Again, they perform for COP's opposition.

Coach Ernie Jorge figures this game to be a "toughie" for the Tigers, even more so than the battle with San Jose, because of the experience resting on the Navy side. That's something else to be tested this evening, the Bengals "know-how" of the game when pitted against a team of players having football experience to spare.

That's the game picture; sit down and enjoy it. We guarantee you will.

## THE GAME

Undoubtedly the greatest array of talent ever to assemble at the San Diego Naval Training Center will be meeting the College of Pacific Tigers tonight. This team, coached by Comdr. Tay Brown, a former All-American at the University of Southern California, rivals the terrific clubs during the World War II era.

Take a pair of backs from the San Francisco 49ers (Jim Monachino and Verl Lillywhite), add two more from the Los Angeles Rams (Odie Posey and Bob Boyd), two additions from the Dallas Texans (Breck Stroschein and George Musacco) and top that off with a marvelous group of college stars and we present the 1952 edition of N. T. C. football.

The gridiron education of Boyd, Lillywhite, Bucky Curtis and Dewey McConnell, the last two All-Americans, is hard to match. Boyd, who was one of the main defensive cogs for the Rams, can play either offense or defense and has run back many punts and pass interceptions this year for long gains — one for 95 yards and a touchdown.

Oddly enough, it's a former junior college boy, Jimmy Waddell, of Compton, who is the top runner on the team. Waddell, the team's leading ground gainer and scorer last season, may duplicate the feat this year. Having explosive speed and a brilliant broken field runner, Waddell should be the pride of the college and/or professional ranks when he receives his discharge.

Although the quarterback situation has been the major problem, you can't deny that Wilbur Robertson, of U. S. C., Don Bahrman, of Compton, and Earl Stelle, of Oregon, would be welcome on any club. However, it's the big glue-fingered ends, who perform so excellently, that have made the pass plays click.

Curtis, an All-American at Vanderbilt, and McConnell, who was defensive end choice on the Associated Press rankings at Wyoming, are the No. 1 set. Backing them up are Gallie McCormack of Southern Methodist; Ken Vakey of Texas A & I; and Mose Clay of Compton, offensively.

Defensively, the Navy has a terrific crew, which for three games did not permit an opponent to

advance beyond its on 28. Boyd, Stelle and Lillywhite usually cover the backfield with Stroschein and George Pelonis, of California, at the ends.

The line is deep in tackles, guards, centers and linebackers. From tackle to tackle offensively, Comdr. Brown usually sends out Russ Faulkinberry of Vanderbilt; Bob Zelinka of U. C. L. A., Mickey Adza of Santa Clara, Bob Griffis of Furman, and Owen Cox of Mississippi.

Fans can expect anything from this talented Bluejacket football team from triple and quadruple laterals to basketball passes. It rivals the razzle-dazzle football which has been so famous in the Southwest. In a sense, it's a circus to watch — but pleasing.

This is not — in essence — laying any ball game at the feet of a so-called grid giant. College of Pacific, always known for its tremendous football teams, will be respected by the Navy tonight, to be sure.
