HISTORY OF UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

University College was established in 1972 to provide academic and support services to adult students starting or returning to college at a non-traditional age. Originally, most students in the college pursued bachelor’s degrees in disciplines across the university, alongside traditional students in mostly daytime classes. In 1999, University College began offering the Organizational Behavioral degree-completion program in a cohort-based, evening-only format for working adults. Moving into its third successful decade, this program has been adapted to meet the changing needs of our students and employers and, starting in fall 2019, the Bachelor of Science in Organizational Behavior will become the Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership.
