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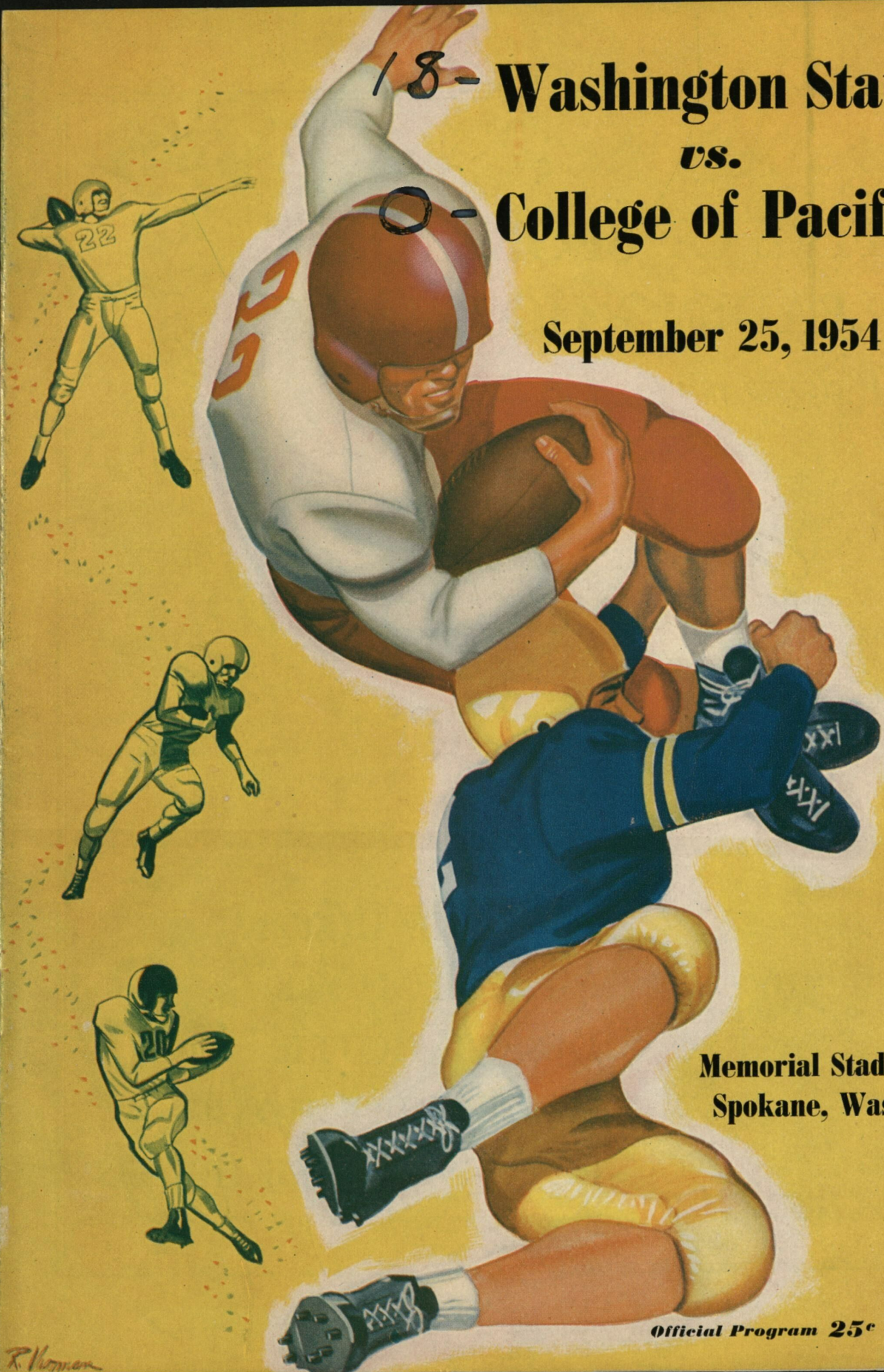

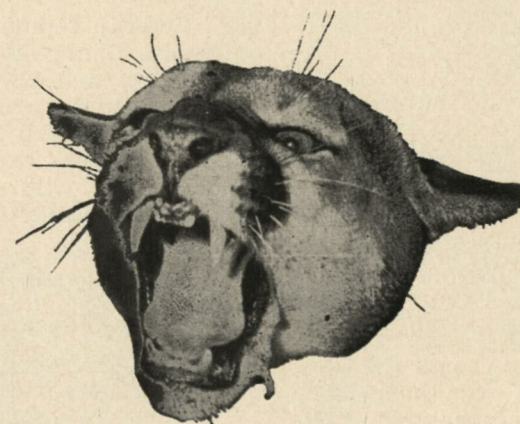

Pacific To Attempt Aerials Against Cougars Tonight

A replay of last year's thrilling contest between College of the Pacific and Washington State could very well be what is in store for Spokane grid filberts in Memorial Stadium tonight as the Tigers and Cougars claw it out to see which one gets victory number one of the 1954 season.

Tigers vs Stanford

Last weekend in the opener the Bengals battled furiously to make it two in a row over Stanford but had to settle for a one point defeat, 13-12, before 28,000 fans in Stockton's Pacific Memorial Stadium.

Pacific, second ranking aerial team in the nation in 1953, wasn't able to unlimber its passing artillery against the Indians but did show good potential while operating on the ground.

All of which gave Tiger adherents the idea that with normal improvement over the season, the Bengal attack will be much more diversified than in 1953. The passing game is there and if it develops tonight, COP could be mighty tough.

Star Quarterbacks

In Quarterback Bill Jacobs, and his sophomore replacement, J. B. Girard, Coach Jack "Moose" Myers has two good throwers. The receivers are there, too, in Ends A. D. Williams, Roger Linn, Darrell Haynes and Ed Griffith and Halfbacks Dewey Tompkins, Don Cornell and Ken Swearingen. On any given evening they are capable of putting on quite an aerial show.

Pacific's running game has good speed, though lacking power. Most of the COP running backs are of pony size, with Tompkins at 149 pounds, Cornell at 168, Swearingen at 161 doing most of the halfback work and Fullbacks Ted Case at 186 and Lynn Swanson at 170.

The Bengal line, averaging only around 195 pounds, is nevertheless very mobile though not especially deep. Across, from left to right, A. D. Williams, Jack Meeks, Neven Hulsey, Captain Jim Timms, Buzz Williams, John Nisby and Roger Linn present a forward wall which is appreciably stronger than last year.

Veteran replacements are Left Tackle Gene Cronin, Center Ben Cahill, Right Tackle Bing Downing and Right End Ed Griffith. Rookie replacements are Left End Darrell Haynes, Left Guard Bob Lee and Right Guard Galen Laack. Myers expects the second line to gain in strength with each succeeding week, but it hasn't reached its potential yet.

Pacific will present basically a junior ball club in Spokane tonight. Of the 41 players on the Tiger squad, there are only eight seniors, 20 juniors and 13 sophomores. Meeks and Timms are the only senior starters and Nisby is the only sophomore in the opening eleven.

Rough Schedule

Tonight marks the second contest on COP's toughest schedule of all time. After opening with Stanford and meeting Washington State here this evening, the Tigers meet, in order, Indiana in Bloomington, Idaho in Stockton, Colorado A & M in Fort Collins, Texas Tech in Stockton, Cincinnati in Cincinnati and San Jose State and Marquette, both in Stockton.

It was encouraging to see the Tiger running game show potential in the opener and a clicking aerial game could have won it. Which probably means that the Bengals will be tossing the ball around more than somewhat tonight.

One thing is certain. Both teams want this one badly. So, in the long run, it will be the paying customers who will benefit by seeing a contest where both clubs have all the stops pulled out.

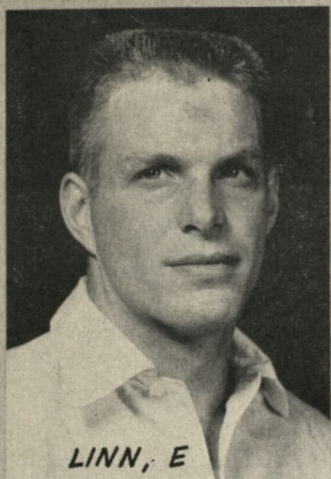

Cougars Meet COP Tigers In Second Game of Series

College of the Pacific has joined the ranks of Washington State's "traditional rivals" on the football field with this second appearance against the Cougars. The Tigers were hosts to the Cougars last year in Stockton, California, where more than 30,000 fans saw WSC gain a narrow 26-20 victory. For the next two seasons the Cougars will travel to Stockton to complete the four-year schedule.

The opening contest wasn't decided until the final two minutes of the game and the game tonight promises to be equally thrilling. The colorful Tigers boast one of the finest aerial circuses in the realms of the Pacific Coast football with Bill Jacobs throwing from the quarterback slot in the T-formation and A. D. Williams at left end a top flight receiver.

Ground Game

Despite their emphasis on a passing game, the Tigers moved to two touchdowns on the ground in losing a thrilling 13-12 decision last Friday night to the Stanford Indians of the Pacific Coast conference. The running of left half Don Cornell was instrumental in powering the Tigers to two touchdowns.

Backed by 18 returning lettermen, 11 Junior College transfers and nine standouts from a strong Freshman team of 1953, the Tigers will more than match the Cougars in manpower as well as speed and experience. An even dozen lettermen are available for line positions and three veterans are expected to start in the backfield.

20 Cougar Lettermen

To offset the invading Tigers, Coach Al Kircher will have 20 lettermen available after loss of Don Gest, Spokane left end, and Doug Leifeste, Sunnyside guard, by injuries in the opening game against the University of Southern California. Mistakes in pass coverage and the terrific speed of the Trojan backfield ac-

counted for three touchdowns in the first half although USC trailed four first downs to WSC's nine and had totaled only 25 yards net from rushing.

On the basis of performances in the opening game, football fans of the Inland Empire should watch these Cougar stalwarts for outstanding play tonight: Tom Gunnari, 200-pound junior left tackle from Kelso; Skip Pixley, 200-pound junior center from Spokane; Jim Welch, 200-pound junior right guard from Seattle; Arnie Pelluer, 200-pound junior right end from Bremerton.

Duke Plays Well

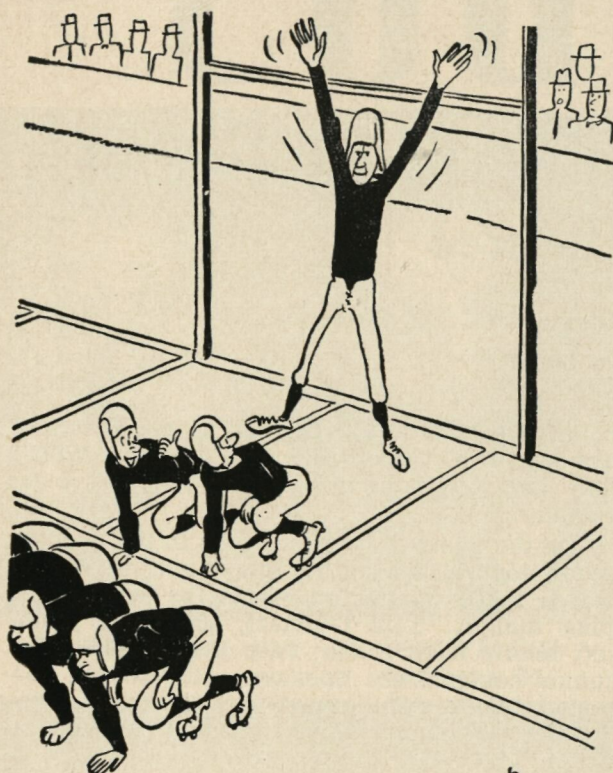

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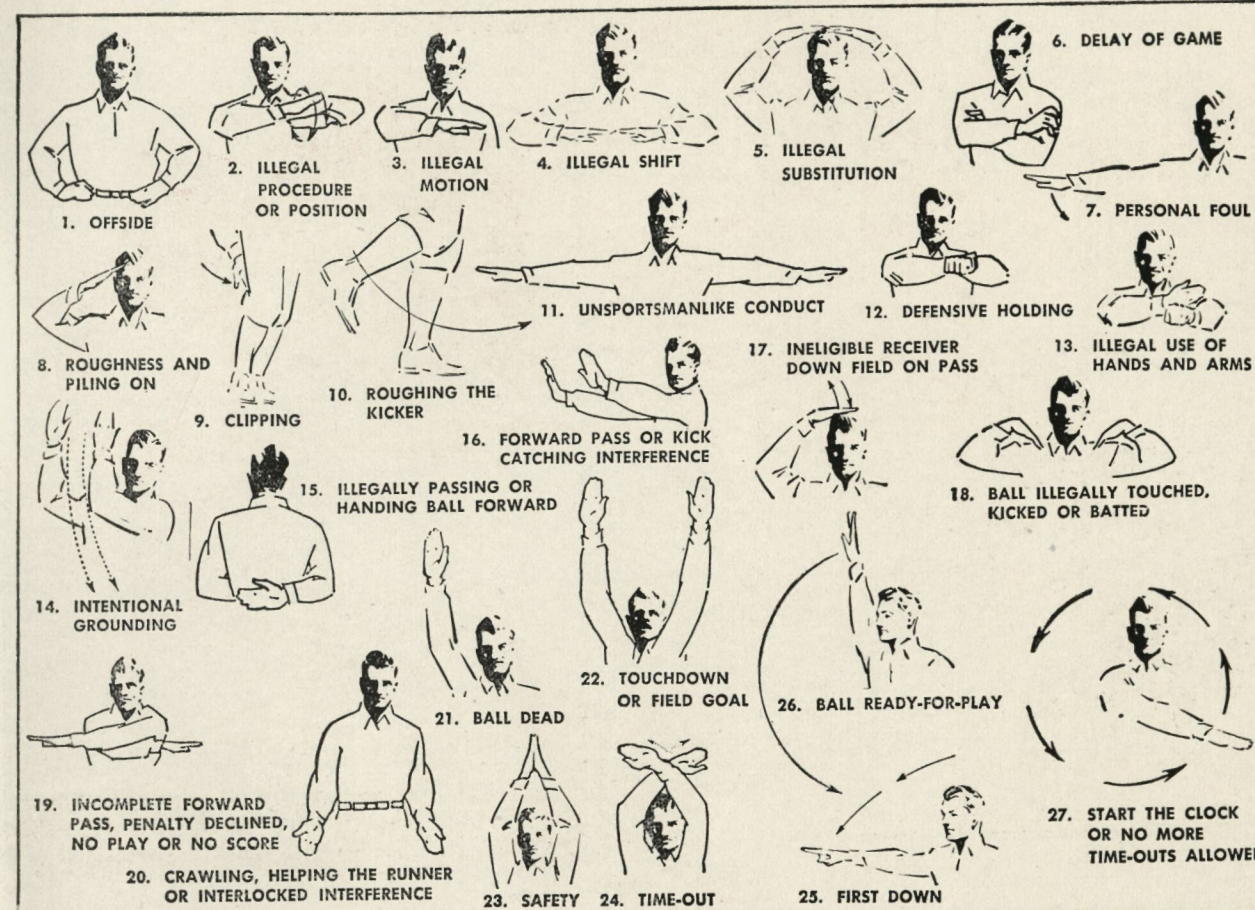
