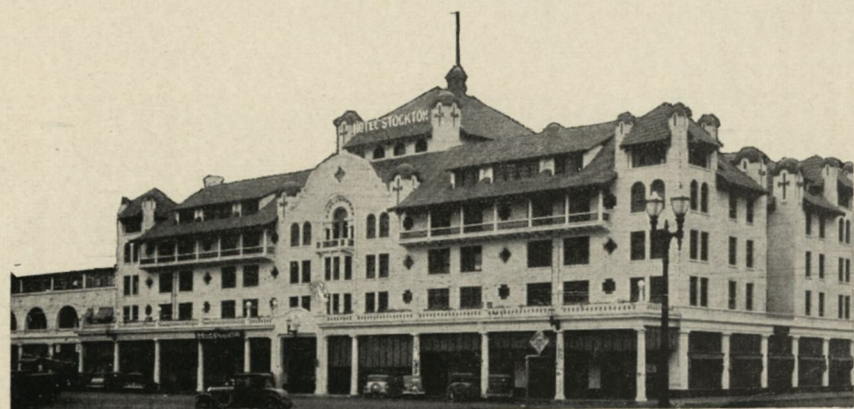

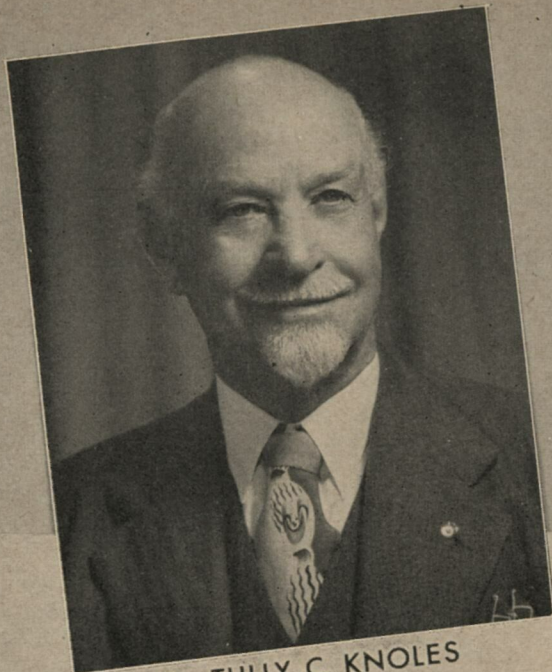

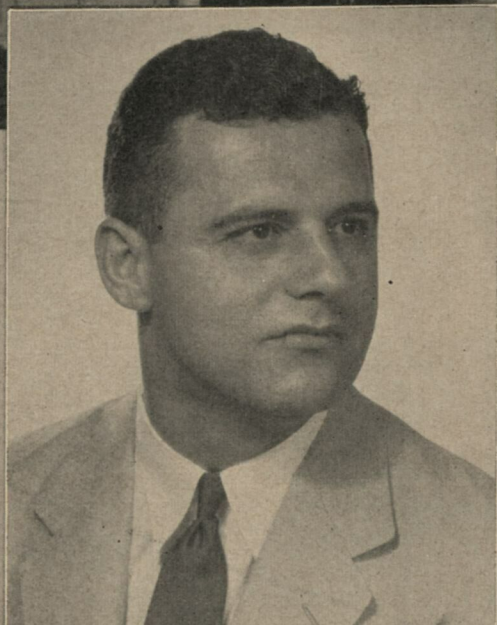

## THE GAME

San Jose State, potentially one of the better football teams on the Pacific Coast, one again invades the home lair of College of Pacific's Tigers. Will it be the same old story for Pacific's loyal supporters?

They hope not, but some of the spectators sitting in the stands tonight have children playing varsity football, and neither they nor the children can remember beating the Spartans on the home field. The clock must be turned back to the depression era of 1931 to find a Tiger victory in Stockton. That year the Tigers chalked up a 27-0 triumph and it has been a long, dry spell ever since.

In all these years the COP boys have been able to gain only two ties—0 to 0 in 1935 and 7 to 7 in 1950. San Jose appears to hold a phenomenal jinx over Pacific and things don't look bright for the Tigers tonight.

Coach Bob Bronzan brings over a better than average football team to Stockton. The Spartans, beaten only by California and Oregon, must be given the favorite's role. The San Jose squad has a host of good backs, any one of whom might shake loose for a long touchdown run. Foremost of these is Roy Hiram, star of San Jose's sensational 26-21 victory in 1952 when he scored on a 39-yard run in the final 24 seconds of the game.

Hiram has been handicapped by injuries most of this season, but the speedy little Hawaiian appears healthy once again. Hiram helped his teammates knock off North Texas State last Saturday night in Denton, Texas, and his rambling antics hold special attention in Pacific's scout reports.



But Hiram is not the only man the Tigers must worry about tonight. There are others. Stan Beasley, a Modesto J.C. transfer, who was unheralded and worked his way up to a starting role; Herman Stokes, Fred Delgadillo, and Mel Soong are other halfbacks who might break the game wide open.

San Jose has two excellent quarterbacks in Benny Pierce and Tony Teresa. Pierce is among the nation's leaders in passing. Teresa is also a good passer, but often runs effectively from the perplexing Split-T. Unfortunately for San Jose, Pierce was injured in the North Texas game and may not get into the renewal of this old classic. Teresa did an excellent job against the Texans and Pierce's loss is not the blow it might seem.

Rounding out the Spartan backfield are two good fullbacks—Dave Fanner and Matt Vujevich.

Charlie Hardy and Merv Lopes, a pair of light, but talented ends, feature a rugged Spartan line. These boys make up for lack of size, with sharp tackling and blocking. Tackle Jack Adams, Guard Tom Louderback and Center Tom Yagi spearhead the rest of the line, both offensively and defensively.

San Jose has good reserve strength and when the final gun sounds the reserves may have been the difference.

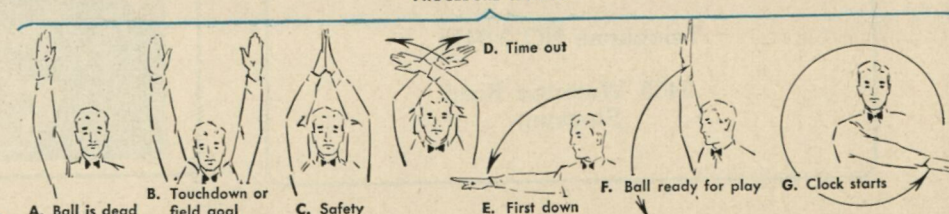
Lateral fake trap, against a six-man line overshifted to the right.

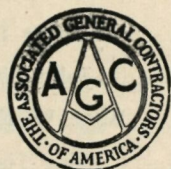

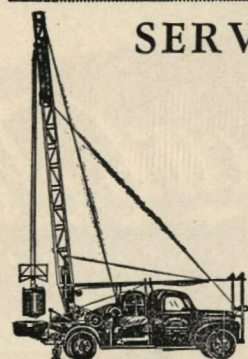

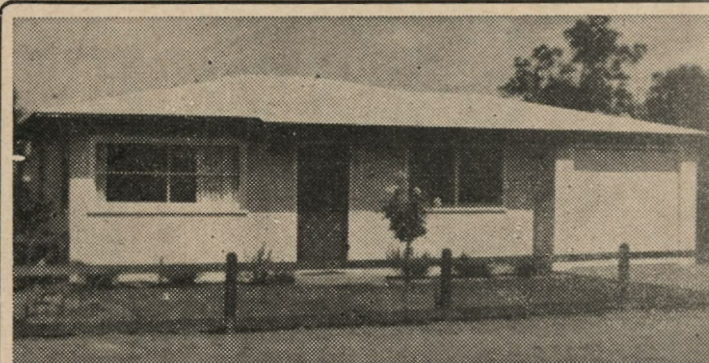

**THE GAME**

When it has come time to write the final story of every College of the Pacific football season since 1931, barring the "exception years" of 1947 and 1949, a line of type stating that "Pacific was again unable to defeat its traditional rival, an Jose State" has gone into such a summary.

By any standard the hold the Spartan has on the Tigers' tail is one which is phenomenal. And for it to be so, when the rivalry is so intense and the tradition so much in evidence, is all the more amazing.

Not since the year 1931 has Pacific been able to defeat its old friend from the Prune City, in Stockton. True, the Tigers did manage a pair, a 14-0 upset in 1947 and a 45-7 thumping in 1949, but they were both pulled off on the Spartans' home ground. And since that time the Staters have pulled off a pair of upsets down San Jose way to make up for it. The scores were 7-0 in 1951 and 7-6 last fall.

As any C.O.P. fan or alum will tell you, it all gets a little frustrating. But as they say in Brooklyn, "leave us wait 'til next year."

Well, next year is here once again and Coach Bob Bronzen is bringing another rugged bunch of Golden Raiders into Memorial Stadium. And the big question is, will it be another "wait 'til next year" for the Bengals or is this finally the year?

Coach Jack Myers has himself a fast-improving bunch of Tigers who have surged along the comeback trail from three consecutive early season lickings to the point where they are rated a "good" ball club. But Bronzan's Spartans are a king-sized (without a filter) stumbling block boasting as fine a collection

of material as ever has been assembled under the banner of the Gold and White.

A point which has been made much of, is that each season the Tigers roll into their San Jose State game anywhere from one to three touchdown favorites but almost never come away on the long end of the score. This year things are different. an Jose rates the favorite role in 1954 and many Bengal adherents point to that as a good omen.

Pacific isn't in exactly the greatest shape for such a traditional clash. With Left Halfback Ken Swearingen and Fullback Lynn Swanson racked by injuries, Myers is faced with some serious backfield problems. Where Swearingen and Don Cornell previously could alternate, now most of the load will be thrown on Cornell. The same holds true with Swanson and Ten Case at fullback.

The Tigers have come along well this year, putting a terrific feather in Myers' coaching cap. They gathered steam with wins over Idaho and Colorado A. & M., and drove right into an upset over mighty Texas Tech. Last week they played outstanding football in losing a one touchdown decision to Cincinnati, the nation's thirteenth ranking team.

You cannot say enough about the job Myers and his youthful staff have done with the Bengals this year.

It goes without saying that tonight's contest will be a gilt-edged thriller, for it is always so. This department's advice to you is to sit back and see if it is this year, or next!
