My Position in Tule Lake.

Mrs. Long

I Arrived in Klamath Falls Sunday, August 12 and reached Newell in the afternoon. Monday morning I made my appearance at 8:15 in the personnel office before Miss Lorex who kindly assisted me around the project introducing me to the personnel.

That afternoon Mr. Cook made me acquainted with my new co-workers and placed me in my position as "filling-in" the unexpired term of Mrs. Tanaka who relocated. The subjects assigned me was fifth period typing, sixth and seventh period shorthand I and II and eighth period second year shorthand II. No classes in the morning.

Three weeks went by, then Mr. Russell Hayashi decided to relocate to the east. I then was asked to take his bookkeeping classes the first, second and fifth period, Junior Business the fifth. This I was glad to do. So Mrs. Johnson took fifth period typing and sixth period shorthand. The fourth period I gave to students who wished to spend extra

time in taking shorthand for dictation to gain speed. No credit given but I enjoyed doing it as much as they enjoyed taking the speed test.

The new semester began with me starting out with sociology first and fourth period, second free, third and sixth bookkeeping, fifth typing. As so many students were relocating Miss Inurse took over the class so I was to be free to type transcripts in the office which I have really truly enjoyed.
