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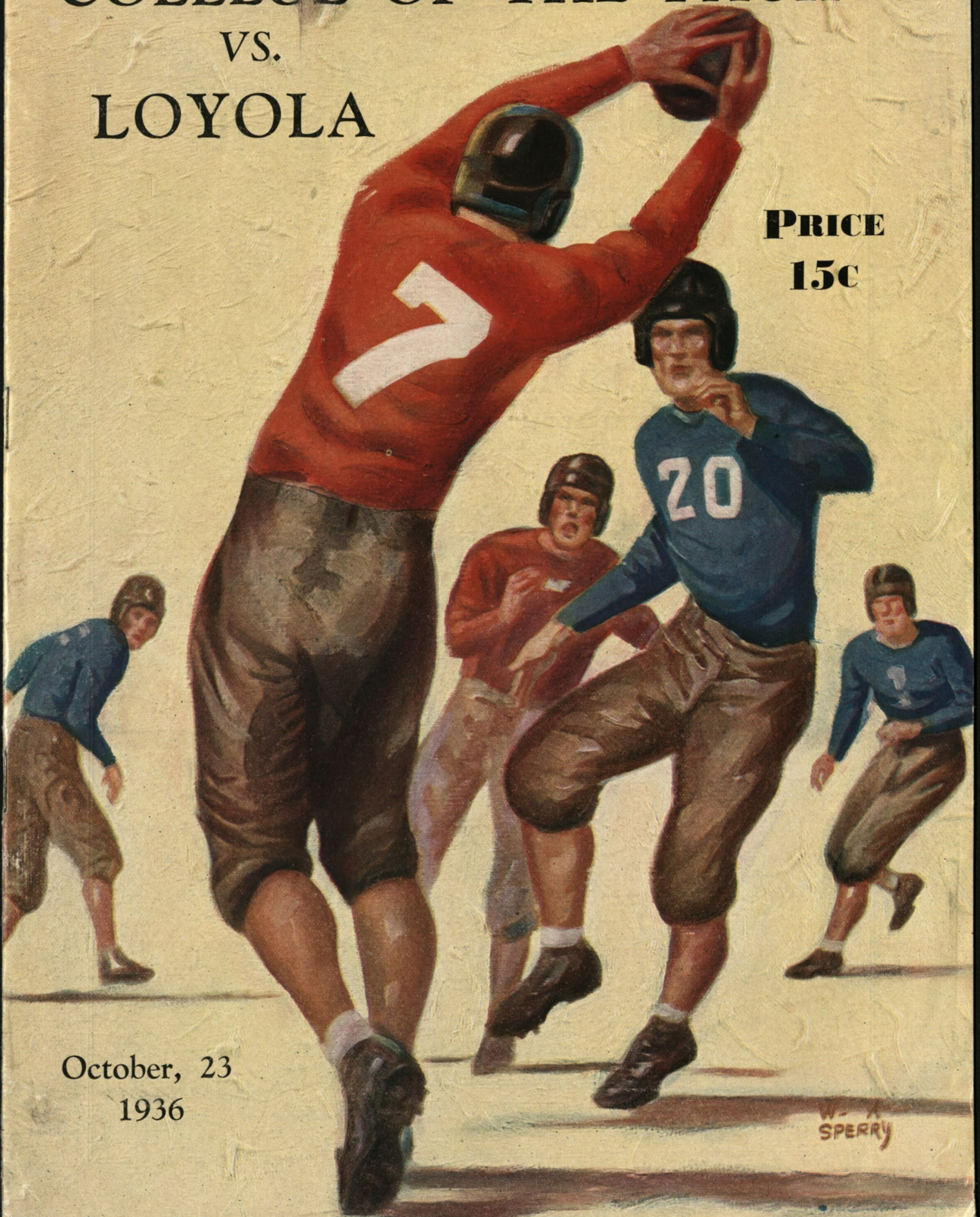

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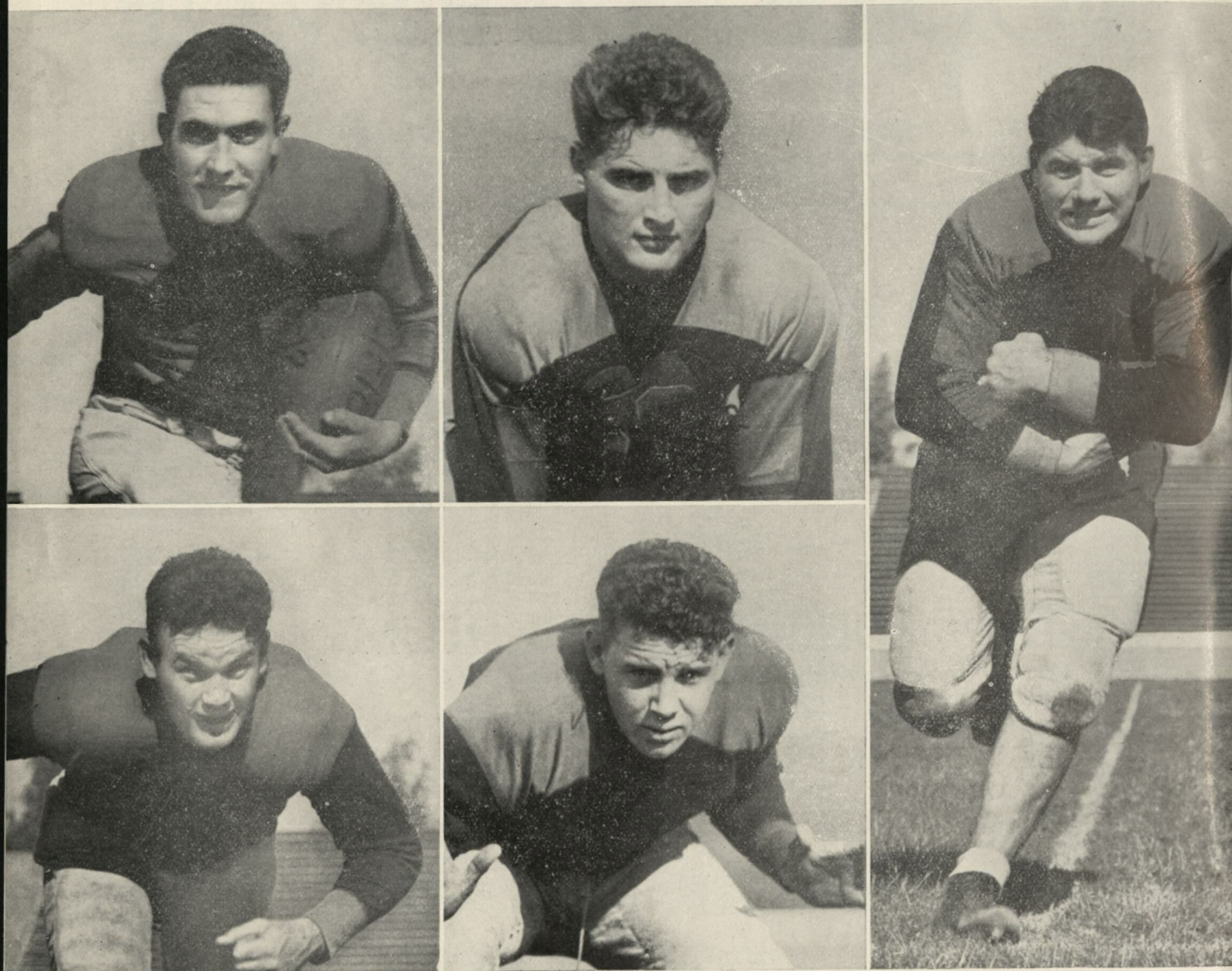

TIGER vs. LION

There is something about a College of Pacific football game that causes every Lion fan to sit nervously waiting for the opening whistle, and to remain more or less in that condition until the final blast ends the struggle.

History, which cannot lie, proves that Loyola fans have ample reason to sit tensely during this evening's performance of the Lion and the Tiger—a four act melodrama.

Never has there been a College of Pacific game which did not have more than its rightful share of thrilling moments, and at least on one occasion "those moments" proved the downfall of the Lions.

It was back in the year of the great crash—1929, in case you have forgotten—that the College of Pacific Tigers rolled down to Los Angeles from their home in Stockton to manhandle the Loyola Lions, 16 to 7. It was one of the largest scores made by an opponent against Loyola that year.

The following year, in 1930, the Lion and the Tiger again put on their little act, but this time old Mr. Lion reared up on his haunches and bit the Tiger right in the pants to the tune of a 7 to 0 victory. But don't think that the Loyolans didn't have to fight for that one.

The real thriller of them all came in 1933 out at fog-soaked Wrigley Field when the Lion and the Tiger mixed in the most exciting battle of their three game series.

College of Pacific lost, 14 to 7, but they put on one of the most sensational forward-passing attacks of the season and it took three determined length-of-the-field marches by Coach Tom Lieb's crew to bring the winning touchdown.

Both teams scored early in the first quarter and it was not until midway in the final period that Jack Bouchard broke loose around Pacific's right flank to dash 31 yards over the last stripe.

It was a whale of a battle all the way, but the real red-hot action of the evening was com-

pressed with pin-point heat into less than two minutes of actual play in the first quarter.

A thrilling 59-yard pass from Wilson, which Farina caught on the Loyola 5-yard line, paved the way for the first score of the evening. And it came two plays later when Bainbridge took a running pass from Wilson for a score.

But before the cheers for this spine-tingling exploit had died down, Eddie Atkinson grabbed the ensuing kick-off and ran straight through the heart of the Pacific team—88-yards for the touchdown.

Both goals were kicked and there the score remained, 7 to 7, until the final quarter when Bouchard packed the old nugget 30-yards around end for the winning touchdown.

And if you think the spectators at that game didn't have something to yell about then you're sadly mistaken. They screamed and shouted until the residents around the 42nd street stadium thought sure that somebody was committing bloody-murder.

Tonight you'll see two new and different football teams representing the two schools. But they'll still be fighting for a victory, for one side or the other, just as much as they have in the past.

You'll be watching the foremost "razzle-dazzle" team of the Coast this evening when Coach Stagg's boys spread into their famous flanker formation.

Coach Stagg, now 75 years of age and actively participating in his 47th season of football as a coach, was the originator of the flanker formation. He was also the one who brought about a greater use of forward passes in football and the abolishment of the dangerous flying wedge.

In fact the basic principles of his system, as employed when he coached the University of Chicago, were modified and used by the late Knute Rockne as the foundation for the famous Notre Dame system, now used by Coach Tom

Lieb of Loyola and hundreds of other coaches throughout the nation.

When Rockne was still a student in Northwest Division high school in Chicago he would go out to Stagg Field and watch the grand old man of American football put his boys through their paces.

Later when Rockne went to Notre Dame, Jess Harper, a star on Coach Stagg's University of Chicago eleven when Rockne was in high school was then athletic director of the South Bend school. After "Rock" graduated he was made an assistant to Harper and the two of them worked over the old Stagg system, added a few ideas of their own, and we now have what is known as the Notre Dame system of football.

The Loyola Lions will be using that system against Coach Stagg's eleven tonight, but the College of Pacific team should be well versed in what to expect, whatwith their own coach

being one of the originators of the basic principles of the system.

Coach Lieb admits that Coach Stagg's passing game is a real sixty-minute threat and the Lion eleven will obviously have to be right up to par in their pass defense, else you're bound to see either Albert George, 153-pound halfback, or Joe Olaeta, 165-pound quarterback, toss a nice long pass into the arms of a team mate for a touchdown.

And if their passing attack should bog down, the Tigers have a couple of 60-yard punters in Bob Coe, 157-pound halfback; and Clarence Cortez, 170 pound half, to boot some long ones that should keep the Lions in hot water.

The Loyola backfield will find Hank Sartoris, 190-pounder from Canon City, Colorado, in at left half. He has been shifted over to this position after playing in the fullback spot for the first four games of the season.

"Jumbo" Jim Colee, a 214 pound lad, will be back in the fullback slot to help the Lions plunge through the Pacific line.

Jack Foley, a pass catching threat, will be at his regular right half position, with Joe Labozetta, Lincoln high star, at quarterback.

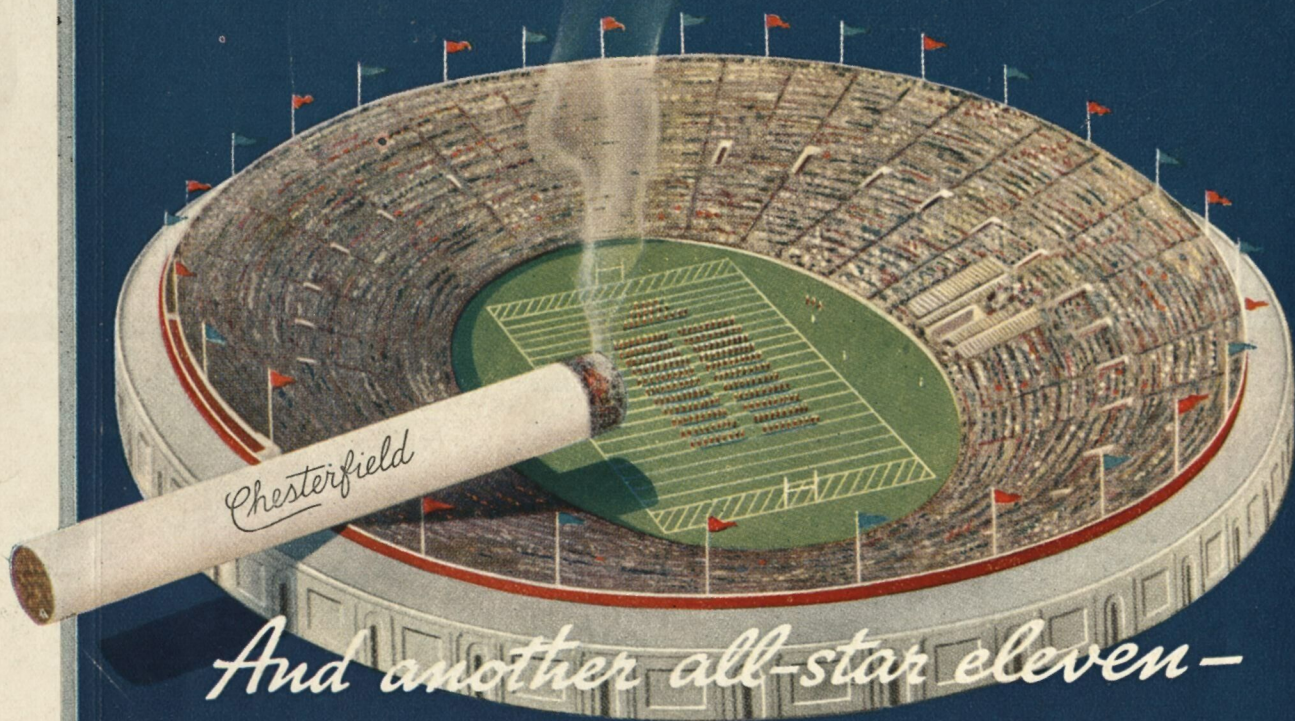
