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## THE RAYMOND GRADING ARRANGEMENT

Beginning with the evaluation of student work for Fall Term, 1965-66, Raymond College professors will use only two designations - "Satisfactory" or "Unsatisfactory" - in summarizing their Term Letter Reports. Thus, within the College we will have a two-point grading scale. The official student transcript will carry only these designations.

However, the Raymond faculty will also keep an informal A-F grading record of student work. These letter grades will not be submitted to the Dean of Student Life and they will not go on student transcripts. They will be presented to the Dean of Student Life whenever the specific request of a graduate school, transfer institutions, or special need makes it necessary for the Dean of Student Life to request the letter grades.

On leaving the College, the faculty member will deposit the letter grades for his students with the Dean of Student Life in order for them to be available to meet future contingencies.

This arrangement is an attempt to put the emphasis in the College on the learning experience, and a detailed evaluation of the learning experience will always be available in the Raymond Term Letters.

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
