Dear Sir -

I have not, I am sorry to say, any record of temperature & weather of this place. Nor do I know of any having been kept hereabouts. The highest temp. that I have observed at the ranch is  $105^{\circ}$  on the north side of a wooden building. The lowest  $28^{\circ}$ .

The young vines are never nipped by frosts in the spring. The first light frosts in the fall usually kill the grape leaves at the bottom of the valley some time in December.
