## BAXTER STADIUM OPENER

The second page of Mr. Amos Alonzo Stagg's nine-page grid booklet, 1943 edition, "How to Win Football Games and Pass the Enemy Dizzy", is open to the public today, as the now "Roaring Tigers of Pacific" face St. Mary's Pre-Flight in Baxter Bowl.

Stagg, blessed with a Navy V-12 unit, is looking toward his most enjoyable season since he has been head mentor at Pacific; but grid fans must remember that although C.O.P.'s present team is loaded with talent from all over the coast, they are also playing in one of the fastest football leagues in the nation, barring none. As the Tigers progress, so does the opposition.

Stagg and his Marine and Navy varsity have one important advantage over the Air-Devils from Moraga Valley in the respect that they have already played and won their first contest of the season, last week's victory over the Coast Guard in San Francisco, 14-7.

Little is known of this year's Pre-Flight eleven, other than the fact that their roster won't blossom with the "Name Players" who last season made the flyers one of the most feared outfits on the Coast. This year only one officer who played here last season appears in the line-up. He is Dale Gentry, former Washington State end.

Stagg, since he has been coach at C.O.P., has been using his own famous system of football; and this year, now that he has the material, his style of play should click.

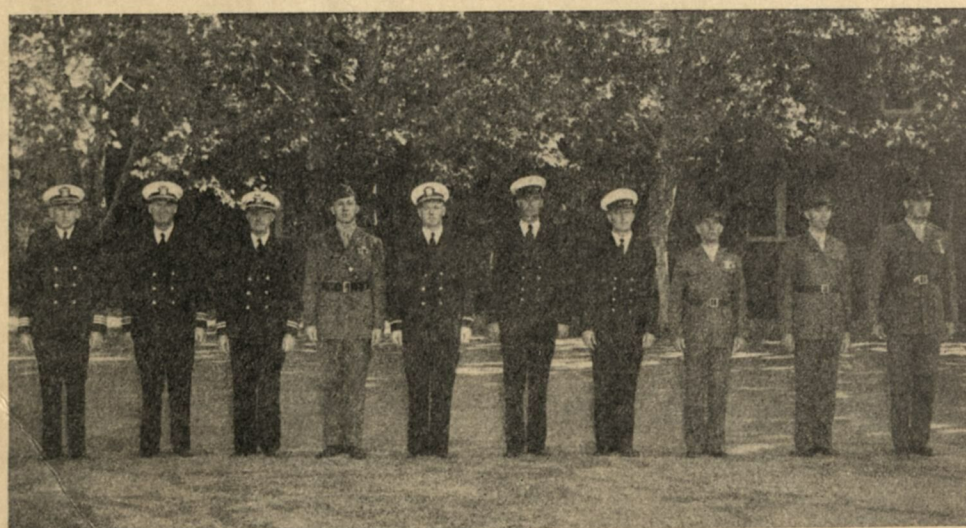
Headlining this second page will be new pass patterns that will not only include the Johnny Podesto to Jack Verutti act, but may well also include the fullback passing from his short tailback spot and new lateral plays to force the Air-Devil wingmen to play wide at all times.

To offset this type of formation, Lt. "Spike" Nelson, former Yale man, now head mentor at Pre-Flight, will use a modified "T" and a single wing formation. This is more or less a variation of U.C.L.A.'s much talked about "QT."

Key man in this new system is tricky Floyd Priske, a smart left-handed passer who fires a fast pass over center with better than average accuracy.

One item that the grid fans this afternoon can be certain of is a wide open game with touchdowns coming at the least expected moment. With both teams having break-away threats, the game can go off like TNT; and whenever Stagg's Marines have the ball, anything can happen at anytime.

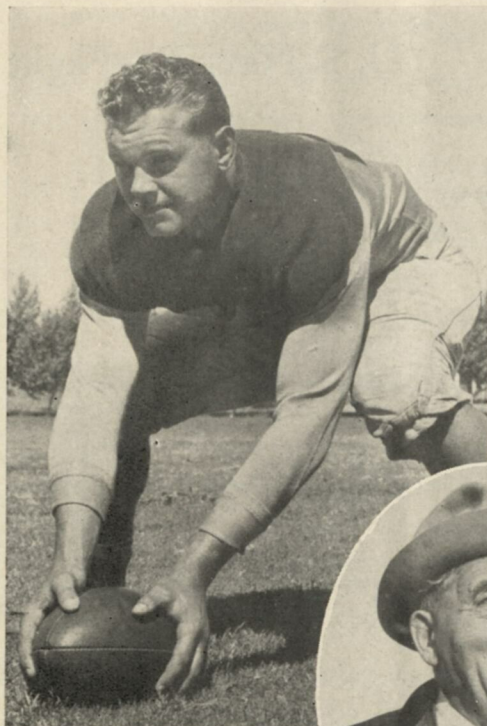
