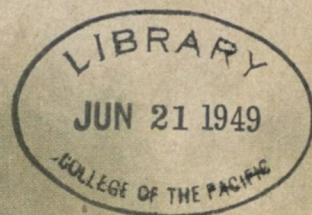

... THE GAME ...

Larry Siemering's Striped Cats will attempt to sew up their second Bowl bid of the season here tonight.

Already set to play in Lodi's first annual Grape Bowl game in Lodi on December 13, the Tigers tonight go after the Battlin' Bulldogs from Fresno State and if they win, the Rasin bid is theirs for January first.

That, plus the fact there is tradition galore surrounding tonight's Pacific-Fresno clash, makes tonight one of the most important of the season for Tiger adherents.

For the first time since going into the San Jose game, the Bengals are at something approaching top strength. Return to the fold last week of guard George Brumm and tackle Tommy Atkins, both sidelined by the Spartans, knocked the injury list down to one. Center Collie Kidwell reinjured his knee in last week's South Dakota contest and may play just a little tonight.

Siemering and his assistants, Ernie Jorge, Hugh McWilliams, and Bob Ijams, have been practicing the Bengals all week long with an eye to the terrific passing mark hung up thus far by the Fresno combination of Bill Montgomery to Bob Hoffman. The Tiger staff, naturally, wouldn't trade "Excellent Eddie" LeBaron for any other back on the Coast, but they still have a healthy respect for this combine. To combat this potent threat, Pacific will probably take to the air tonight. LeBaron has been throwing regularly in rehearsals for tonight's game and the catching of Roy Kirsten, Jean Ridley, Bobby Heck, Don Brown and John Rohde, plus some sensational catches by Phil Ortez, has been satisfying to the staff.

On the rushing side of the ledger, last week's game showed up some terrific running by Harry Kane and Ray Hunter. Kane impressed the coaches with his drive and Hunter was a great crowd-pleaser on his 50 yard TD dash.

Still around to carry most of the running load are the standby's, Bruce Orvis, John Poulos and Don Brown. Between them they have carried the ball 190 times this season, nearly as much as the rest of the backfield combined.

Whether the Bulldog can stop the Tiger on his Rasin Bowl march is a question to be answered before the lights go out tonight. Tradition usually tossed away past performances. Look for as tight a game as we've seen all year in Baxter Stadium.

Fresno State College Bulldogs, still undefeated in conference play, are prepared tonight for their most important game of the season.

It's the traditional battle with the College of the Pacific Tiger!

The Bulldogs retained their undefeated status in CCAA conference circles last week by battling the Santa Barbara Gauchos to a 7-7 tie, the deadlock gave them a conference record of one victory and two ties.

College of the Pacific has a record of four conference wins with no defeats and is heavily favored to annex the CCAA title and the attendant bid to the Fresno Raisin Bowl January first.

Comparative scores give the Tigers a decisive edge over the Bulldogs tonight, but previous games in the long series have shown that anything can happen in this traditional clash. The two teams have met 25 times, with the Bulldogs winning 16, Pacific eight, and one game ending in a scoreless tie.

Although the Bull dogs will be psychologically geared high for the crucial Tigertilt, the game with Santa Barbara last week cost them heavily in man power. Millard Mitchell, all-conference tackle, suffered a dislocated shoulder in the hard-fought game and will probably be out for the rest of the season. Other injuries incurred by tackles Delmar Hanner and Jim Wolfe and by quarterback Ivan Allain will hamper them tonight but not keep them out entirely.

Good news was the return to action of end Wilson Hanna, who has been injured since the New Mexico game, and fullback Earl Smith, thought lost for the season.

The passing of Bill Montgomery and Suge Carter to ends Bob Hoffman and Hanna, and halfback Bill Robinson, plus the running of Carter, Vince Palme and Hal Wheat are the main offensive threats Coach Kenny Gleason will send at the Tigers.

"EXCELLENT EDDIE"

In "T" football, the man under the center holds the key to the team's offense and, in this respect the College of the Pacific has been fortunate in having Quarterback Eddie LeBaron handling the job.

The 17-yr-old sophomore from Valley Home, via Oakdale High School, is having a brilliant season not only as a ball handler and as a forward passer, but as a punter and as a tackler as well.

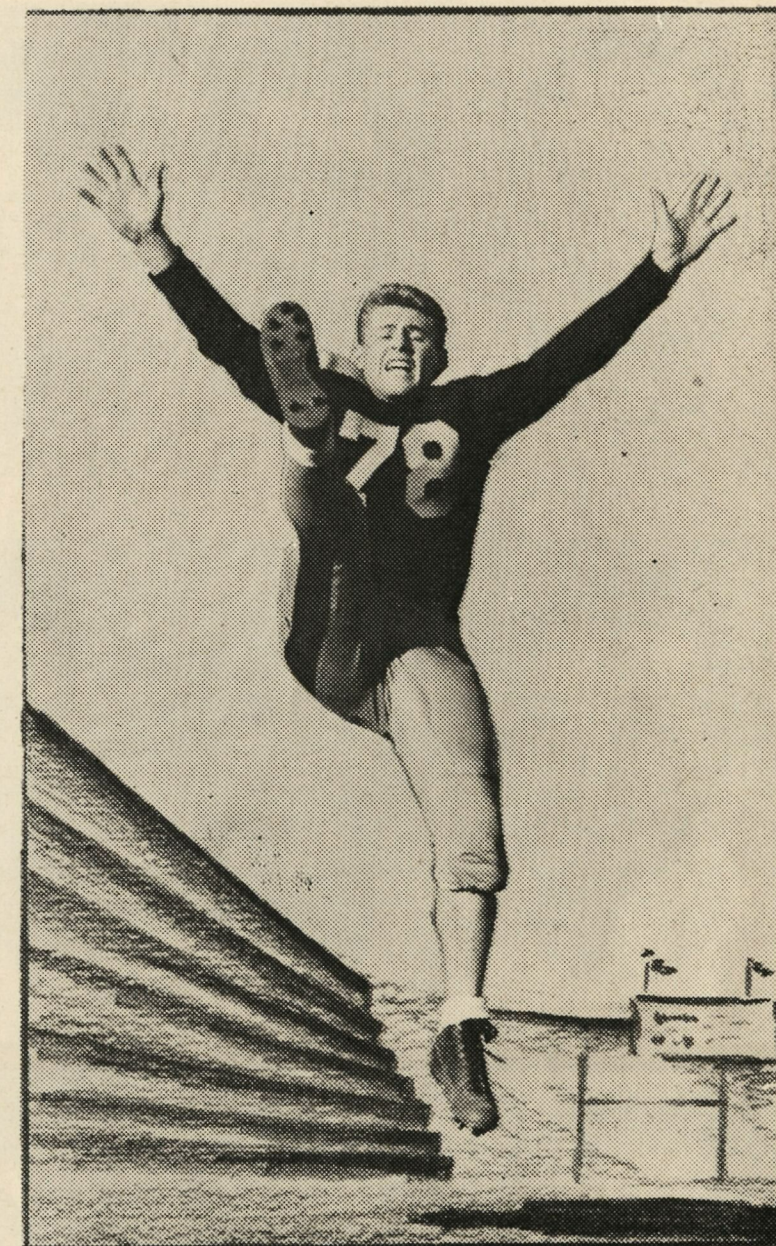
Coach Len Casanova of the Santa Clara Broncos, against whom "Excellent Eddie" played the full 60 minutes, said after the game that "LeBaron is the best faking "T" quarterback that I have ever seen and a tremendous passer, too".

Eddie was just as effective against San Jose State, where his kicking as well as his faking was an important factor in Pacific's victory.

The Valley Home youngster who will not celebrate his 18th birthday until next January has been outstanding in every game played by the Tigers and he is being strongly recommended for a place on the 1947 Little All-American as well as for All Coast laurels.

His record shows 29 completed passes out of 66 for 574 yards gained and eight touchdowns, plus two touchdowns scored by running. In punting he has averaged 33.85 with six kicks placed out of bounds inside the opponent's 10 yard line.

A great team player, Eddie enjoys the confidence of his mates and he has confidence in their ability to score touchdowns as 265 points tallied by the Tigers this year convincingly prove.



LeBaron is only a mighty mite with 168 pounds and 5 feet 7 inches, but he is rugged and can take the beating that a quarterback must take when he is in the forward passing slot.

Tonight Eddie will be in there pitching for the ninth time this season and his admirers are confident that he will be pitching the Tigers to another victory.

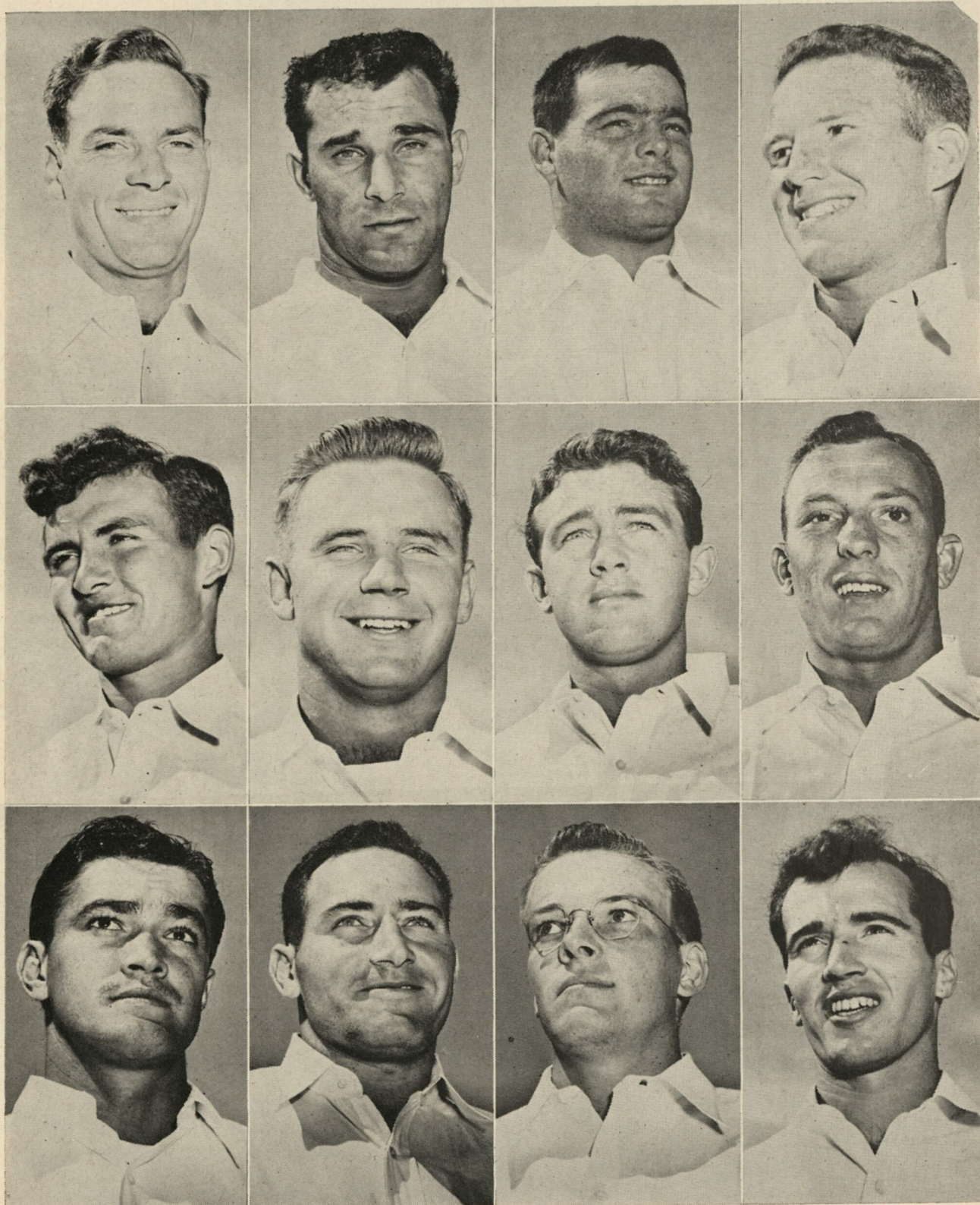

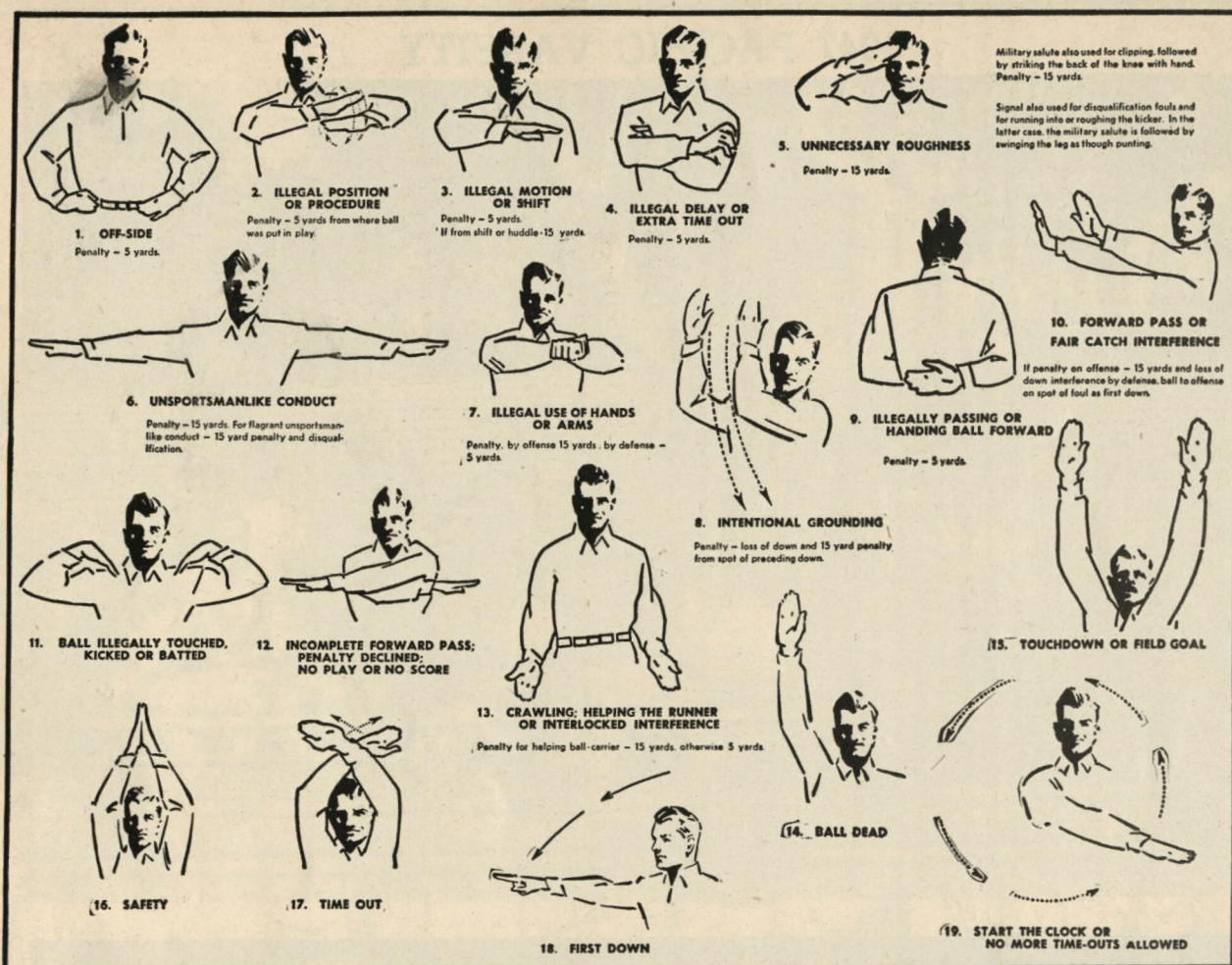
