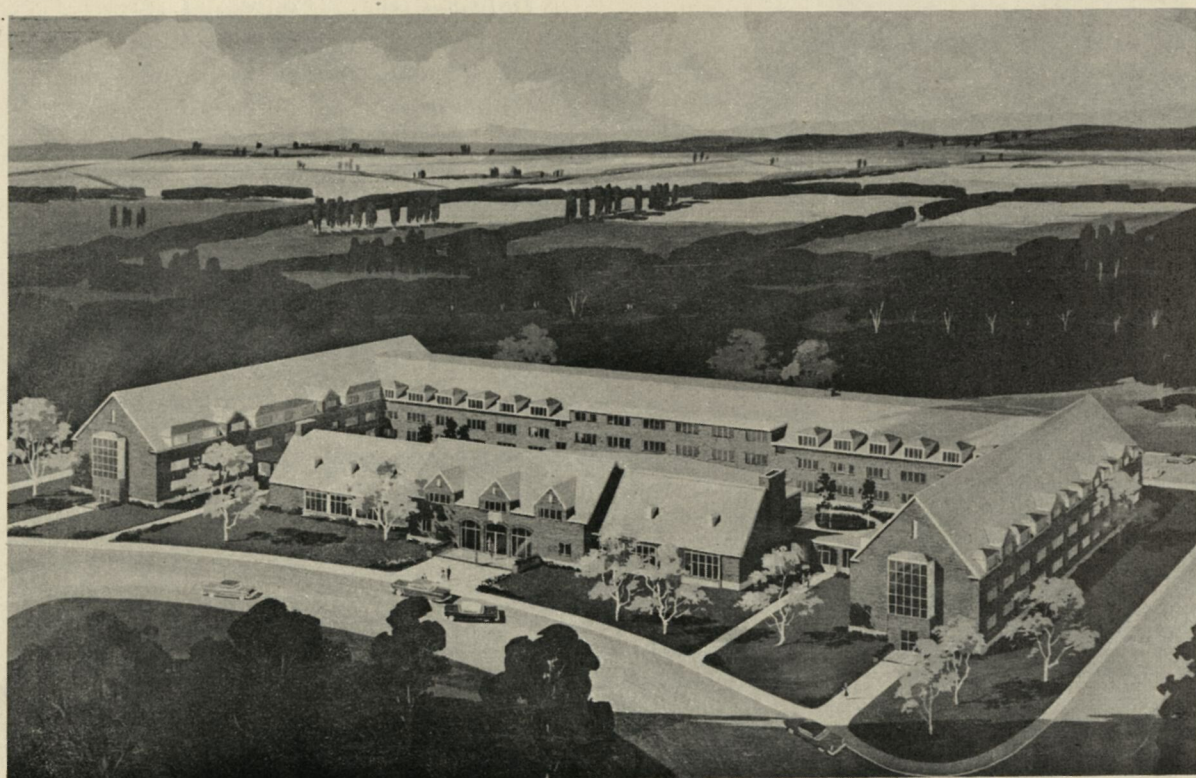

C. O. P. DEPARTMENT OF ART HAS 40 STUDENTS IN OWN BUILDING

Now housed in its own building with 9000 square feet of floor space, the College of the Pacific Department of Art claims some forty full-time major students—but the large majority of all C.O.P. undergraduates will take one or more courses here before they get through college.

Pacific requires at least one unit of art work for a Bachelor of Arts degree, which seems fair enough. A large group of credential candidates in the School of Education study special art courses in preparation for teaching. Scores of students from other departments select from the many interesting art production classes in rounding out their college courses.

Pacific has offered some sort of art instruction throughout its 106 year history. In the 1850's coeds enrolled in Pacific's "Female Collegiate Institute" were taught the intricacies of hair work design, an art form now relegated to the museum.

But the modern art curriculum at Pacific is geared both to the pure creative art spirit, and to the application of art principles in teaching, industrial production, advertising, or in the appreciation of art for the layman. Thirty-five different courses of study are now given in the areas of art history and theory, painting, sculpture, drawing, design, crafts, advertising art, and photography.

Richard H. Reynolds joined the Pacific art faculty in 1939. World War II and the US Navy provided four years of his career from 1943 until 1946 when he served as an intelligence and operations officer on the Philippine Sea Frontier. He returned to peace and Pacific as chairman of the Department of Art, and the division has seen its greatest expansion during his

decade of leadership, climaxed by the occupation last spring of the newly remodeled Pacific Art Center Building. The structure used first for the Engineering Department, provides spacious classrooms, exhibit gallery, craft rooms and workshops, painting studios, photo laboratories, and offices for the department. Reynolds principal faculty associates are Earl Washburn (crafts and advertising), and Helen Dooley Hodgins, (art education).

The product of the department demonstrates its quality. More than fifty school art teachers trained here are now in service. These include such as Jim Kaneko, now establishing an art department for the new American River Junior College; Regalada Valderama, returned to teach in her native Philippines; and Arthur McAlpine, visual aids artist for the Stockton Unified School District.

Several are successful in industrial design, including Bob Wilson of Stockton, (PSA president in 1950) who now is head of the interior and lighting department for the Harndon Corporation, Industrial Designers of Los Angeles; Arden Farey, '55, chief designer for the Bogen Company (high fidelity sound equipment) of New Jersey; Willard Cotton, '49, lithograph layout artist for the Mills Press, Stockton; and Bill Chappell, 1945-46, now designing those lavish looking cosmetics containers for Coty products, New York.

Pacific Art majors have been well represented in football. Clint Ward, one of A. A. Stagg's quarterbacks, is manager of the Western Lithograph Company, San Francisco. Other former Tigers who were art majors include Robin Rush, Walt Polenske, and Tony Ortega. As for Jack Myers 1957 team, expect artistic work from Joe Malpasuto — art major.
