THE ANDERSON Y CENTER

When a desperate appeal was telegraphed to the College of the Pacific last December for aid to refugee Hungarian students, it was Anderson Y Center leaders who organized a way to help: every student on campus accepted a bowl of soup and a scoop of rice for his dinner one evening, and C.O.P. kicked-back the difference—\$400—to the World University Service Fund.

This is a typical example of the function of the Anderson Y Center—A United Crusade Agency—in campus life and community service. Thomas J. Clagett directs this social and service center, open to all students, men and women, on-campus and off-campus. The Y building and its program give a special opportunity to Stockton resident college students, enrolled both at Stockton College and C.O.P.

Students find fun and fellowship here—with a purpose. The cultural program includes debates and discussion sessions on vital local, national and world issues; theatre party trips to San Francisco for modern drama, and the production of plays with social significance.

Observation trips to the State Legislature, the County Jail, and other civic institutions are a part of the citizenship and leadership training experiences provided by the Y Center. Parties, film forums, and work project days are other features of the Y program, combining sociability with social service.

At the Anderson Y a student can make campus

friends, have the personal counsel of the director, use a typewriter, telephone, or mimeograph machine, or look for misplaced articles in the lost-and-found-department. In a pinch, he may even be aided with a small cash advance from a special emergency loan fund.

Volunteer leadership for other Stockton United Crusade Agencies is provided by the Anderson Y Center, notably for scouting, the Camp Fire Girls, and the downtown YMCA. Director Clagett serves on the Community Council committee on juveniles in conflict with the law. The Anderson Y building is often used by other community organizations: World Affairs Council, San Joaquin County Medical Society, Community Alcohol Clinic, and others.

Several Stockton and central valley area citizens serve on the Anderson Y Board of Directors, along with C.O.P. faculty members. Dr. Harold S. Jacoby is new President of the Board. Student officers for the year are headed by Don Dunns of Bakersfield. Aside from the United Crusade apportionment these groups must finance the Anderson Y budget. Many Pacific professors, and friends in the community make annual gifts. Hundreds attend the annual Strawberry Breakfast in May, one of the most popular Y fund raising events.

On the research side of the subject, Mr. Clagett has dug through the archives and come up with the advice that this is the 75th year of organized Y work at Pacific.

Stockton's Fire Department has been below both the recommended and authorized manpower strength for many years. Long working hours (67.2 per week) have resulted in frequent resignations of trained fire fighters and made it difficult to recruit qualified replacements.
