The Pacific Alumni Story

Seated in the stands tonight are hundreds of Pacific alumni returning to the scene of their college years to reminisce with former classmates about the times when—, to observe the institution's present, and to get a glimpse of their alma mater's future.

Statistically, Pacific has upwards of 8,000 degree winners, plus almost an equal number of students who have attended but did not graduate from the college. This enormous potentiality is bound together in the Pacific Alumni Association.

The Association, to which each former Pacificite belongs, sends to each former student whose address is known the "Pacific Review," published eight times yearly, and other announcements.

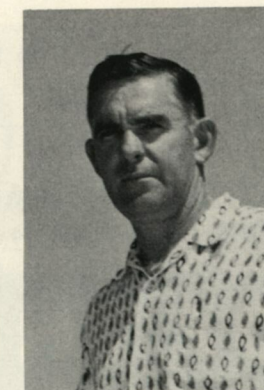
The organization, which is dues-free, also spearheads the Homecoming activities each fall, the annual Alumni College in the spring, and the alumni clubs located throughout the state.

Special reunions and banquets were on the Homecoming agenda this year for the "old grads" of 1919, 1924, 1929, 1934, 1939, 1944, 1949, and 1954. The gala weekend for all the returning students will climax tonight with a reunion dance at the Stockton Golf and Country Club.

Alumni and former students return to the campus again in the spring for a one-day refresher course in "campus life." Given in conjunction with the annual Parents' Day program, the Alumni College gives them a chance to see the campus in action: they can tour old and new campus facilities, hear talks by professors, and attend departmental demonstrations. The yearly business meeting of the Association takes place at the evening banquet, with election of officers for

the 20-member Alumni Council which heads the organization's program.

Alumni activities are not limited to these two big campus events, however. Throughout the year, alumni gather in 12 area clubs up and down the state from Sacramento to Los Angeles. And the number of local clubs is growing as more and more alumni show an interest in having closer and more frequent contact with other Pacificites and with the College.

The alumni are not just passive "takers" of College offerings, however. They also take an active interest in the welfare and future of their alma mater.

The number of contributors to the 1958-59 annual Alumni Fund soared from 6.2 per cent to 26.4 per cent, 4 per cent above the national average, under the direction of Fund Chairman Monroe Hess '50 and C.O.P. staffman Donald Smiley. The outlook is bright for even greater participation this year as alumni become increasingly aware of their importance in Pacific's "pursuit of excellence."

Through the alumni clubs, Pacificites band together to interpret the College to their respective communities, entertain or make arrangements for visiting College delegations such as the A Cappella Choir, help acquaint high school students with Pacific, and extend a friendly hand to Pacificites new to the club's area.

The Alumni Association also extends a helping hand to the Pacific students of today by sponsoring two half-tuition scholarships awarded to worthy undergraduates.

Pacific is proud of their alumni. To them, on this their day, it extends a hearty "Welcome Home."
