Consumer Protection; deceptive trade practices

AB 15 (Committee on Commerce); 1987 STAT. Ch 30

Existing law prohibits a person from engaging in a deceptive trade practice.¹ Chapter 30 expands the category of deceptive trade practice to include specific non-disclosures by persons who provide investment advice for a fee.² Under Chapter 30, the prohibited nondisclosures include: (1) That the person is selling a product and the identity of that product;³ or (2) that the person is licensed by a state or federal agency to sell investments or services for investments, or holds any other license related to the service provided.⁴
