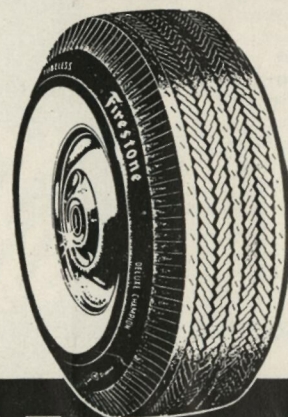

College of the Pacific

Although the College of the Pacific football team has had only a so-so season up to this point, tonight's game is an important one for COP coach Jack (Moose) Myers.

Myers has had only one losing season as Tiger coach, that back in 1954, when the Bengals went 4-5. But he needs a win tonight to escape a second minus record; Pacific has won only four of its first nine games, dipping below the .500 mark last week with a 14-6 loss to Iowa State.

Comparative records give Fresno a slight edge. The Bulldogs whipped Hawaii, 17-7, and San Jose State, 27-12. COP beat the same teams, 28-20 and 26-20, respectively. However, the Tigers have played considerably better opposition overall, their schedule including Washington, Washington State, and Utah State.

Season records mean little when these teams meet, however. Only last year, an underdog Fresno State team led 13-0 going into the final quarter and Pacific pulled out an 18-13 victory only by scoring three times in the final period, the last TD coming with just 55 seconds left.

Indicating the closeness of this rivalry over the years, that hairline win gave COP a 17-16 edge in the series. Two games have been ties.

This season, Myers has faced the task of trying to replace All-American halfback Dick Bass and such other standouts as end Ole Murchison, tackle Bob Denton, and fullback Henry Wallace. The job proved impossible but the Tiger still has plenty of teeth.

Carl Kammerer, a 240-pound guard who was out last year with injuries, was the second draft choice of the San Francisco 49ers last winter. His running mate, Willie Hector, is a 9.9 sprinter who weighs in at a hefty 215 pounds.

In the backfield, COP has an outstanding passer in Bob Gatiss and a pair of top-flight runners in Herman Urenda and Dick Scott. FSC fans who made the trip to Stockton last year will remember Mr. Scott; his breakaway runs set up two Tiger TD's in that wild fourth period and sparked the winning Pacific rally.

Fresno State

Fresno State College will be trying to end 14 years of football frustration when the Bulldogs take the field against College of the Pacific tonight.

Not since 1946 has an FSC team whipped Pacific on the gridiron. That was the year Jackie Fellows, Mickey Masini & Co. squeezed out a 13-12 victory over Amos Alonzo Stagg's last Tiger team which featured a 16-year-old freshman quarterback named Eddie LeBaron.

The current crop of Bulldogs has its share of bitter memories of the FSC-COP series. As sophomores two years ago, the veterans on the team endured a horrendous 52-6 lacing; last year in Stockton, they seemed about to turn the tables when the Tigers rallied for three last quarter touchdowns and an 18-13 win.

Ten of the players have still further incentive to beat COP tonight. They're winding up their Fresno State football careers and they'd like to go out in style.

Foremost among the seniors is the brilliant Mid-Bracket All-American halfback, Dale Messer. Already named to the East-West Shrine game, Messer has rewritten a large portion of the school record books.

Bowing out with him will be six other regulars, including the entire first string backfield — quarterback Bob Van Galder, right half George Ragsdale, and fullback Larry Iwasaki as well as Messer.

Right end John Webster, left tackle Lou Popelar, and guard Dick Rohrke are the other seniors on the first team. Alternate unit quarterback Nick Papac and reserve tackles Mac Mechem and Richard Womack round out the list of seniors.

The Bulldogs will still have plenty of bark and bite next year although coach Cece Coleman would love to have any or all of these 10 back. Little All-Coast guard Doug Brown and tackle Sonny Bishop spearhead a list of returning veterans which includes 14 of the first 22 and which will be augmented by some good frosh and the expected influx of junior college talent.

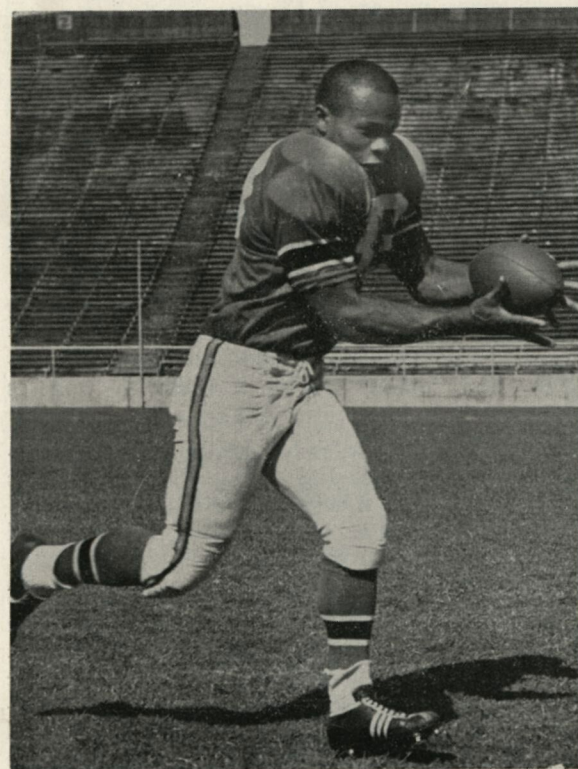

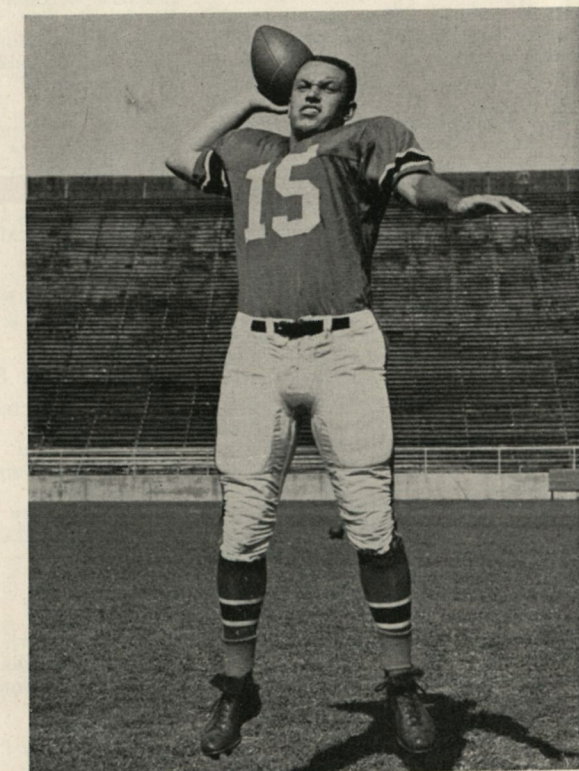

REMEMBER WHEN...

... Polly Wilhelmsen was one of Fresno State College's first great basketball players...

It takes a fairly long memory. The newspapers advertised do-it-yourself crystal radio sets; girls who actually smoked cigarettes were considered "daring"; a man named Calvin Coolidge was President of the United States; and the national password was "Joe sent me."

To use the cliché, it wasn't yesterday nor even the day before. Yet there are those who insist to this day that Paul "Polly" Wilhelmsen was the best basketball player that Fresno State ever produced.

In the present era of seven-footers, a 5 foot 9 inch, 145 pound forward probably wouldn't get a second look from a junior high school coach. But in the 1920's, the emphasis was on speed, ball handling, and defense rather than size and scoring.

Which suited Polly just fine. Primarily, he was a flashy dribbler, a fine ball-handler, a persistent defender — and a perennial all-conference selection.

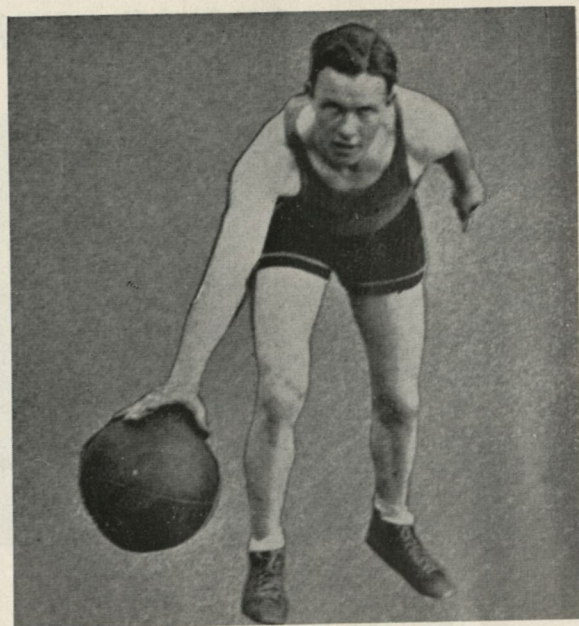
Not that he couldn't score points with the best of them. In the four seasons he played, he led the Bulldogs in scoring four times. He was a deadly two-hand shot and he even flipped up an occasional hook, approximately a decade before Hank Luisetti was supposed to have invented the shot.

Curiously, Polly had never practiced on an indoor court until he reached FSC. During his prep days at Fresno High, the school had no gymnasium and his basketball experience was almost completely confined to outdoor play.

The Fresno State gym of those days fell considerably short of modern standards itself. Affectionately called "the old crackerbox," it was even then too small for big games which were played in the old L Street Auditorium with temporary baskets held down by sandbags.

Unused to indoor courts or not, Wilhelmsen wasn't long in being "discovered" by Coach Arthur Jones. As a freshman in the 1924-25 season, he stepped right into the startling lineup and nearly sparked the Bulldogs to a conference championship, San Jose State edging them in a playoff.

The next year was to prove more successful. Fresno State tied for the Far Western Conference



with St. Mary's and when the Gaels declined to play off the tie, was awarded the championship.

The critical games came in mid-season; the Bulldogs lost the first, 18-16, with Wilhelmsen's six points for the game. The following night while the St. Mary's defense concentrated on the flashy little forward, teammates Bob Baxter and Fred Telonicher paced Fresno State to a 23-8 victory.

Several stars graduated from that team and the 1926-27 club couldn't repeat as conference champion although Wilhelmsen had another fine season. The Bulldogs' third-place finish was redeemed somewhat, however, by a last-second win over Stanford.

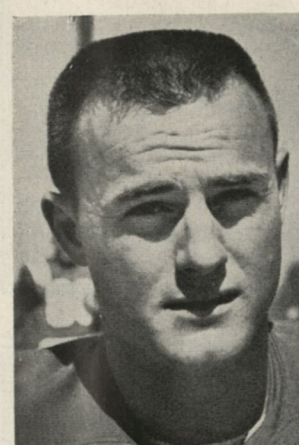
Hopes were high the next winter but they were to be dashed hurriedly. Polly reached double figures in scoring, then a sensational figure, three times and was usually good for about eight points per game. It wasn't enough.

St. Ignatius (now the University of San Francisco) developed a powerhouse team and the Bulldogs, despite Wilhelmsen's brilliance, could finish no better than .500. Further frustrations came in close losses to Stanford and U.S.C.

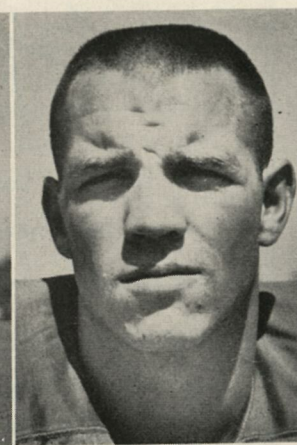
His playing career was over but Polly's contribution to Fresno State College basketball was just beginning. In 30 years as athletic director and basketball coach at College of the Sequoias, he has sent his alma mater a steady stream of athletes right down to Ray McCarty and Earl Smith of last year's CCAA basketball champions and including such stars as Rolland Todd, now with the St. Louis Hawks.

Old-timers among the ranks of Fresno State College basketball fans, however, are still awaiting the day he'll produce another Polly Wilhelmsen.

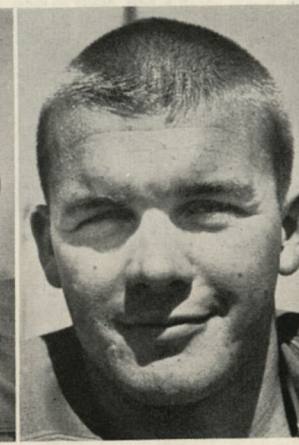
