How to Cut Top Notches

Top Notches are cut in this manner X, and any Son of Daniel Boone winning one of these notches may have them recorded on the left sleeve with pieces of green tape sewed on—a single notch thus,—, a double thus, X, and a top notch thus, X.

Any Woodcraft Scout who joins a fort of the Sons of Daniel Boone and brings with him a certificate of a "coup" or "grand coup" is immediately awarded a notch or double notch, as the case may be. Simon Kenton at the same time cuts the record on the Tally Gun.

But the Sons of Daniel Boone award no notches for the killing

of anything.
