things for the return of the person,<sup>1</sup> is guilty of first degree kidnaping.<sup>2</sup> Chapter 215 expands first degree kidnaping to include one who willfully seizes, confines, inveigles, entices, decoys, abducts, conceals, kidnaps or carries away any person for the purpose of killing the person or inflicting substantial bodily harm.<sup>3</sup>

Every person who leads, takes, entices, carries away, or detains any minor with the intent to keep, imprison, or confine the minor from one having lawful custody, or with the intent to hold the minor to unlawful service or perpetrate upon the minor any unlawful act is guilty of first degree kidnaping. *Id.*

NEV. REV. STAT. § 205.\_\_\_\_ (new).

SB 223 (Raggio); 1987 STAT. Ch 252

Existing law prohibits the possession of any tool<sup>1</sup> under circumstances which manifest an intent to use the tool in the commission of a crime.<sup>2</sup> Chapter 252 specifically prohibits the unauthorized possession of a key or other device used to gain entrance to a hotel<sup>3</sup> room under circumstances which indicate an intent to use such a device to commit a crime.<sup>4</sup>

1. NEV. REV. STAT. § 205.080 (includes any machine, engine, tool, false key, picklock, bit, nippers or implement adapted, designed or commonly used for the commission of a burglary or other crime).
