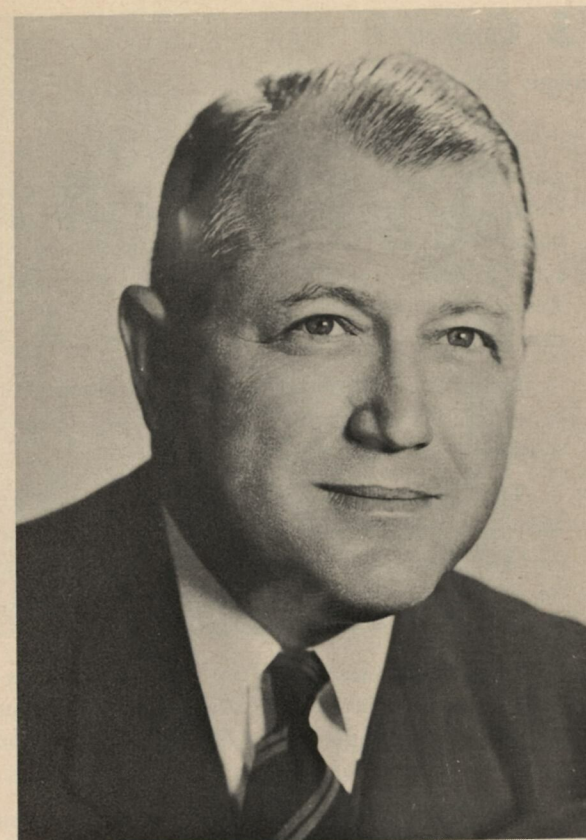

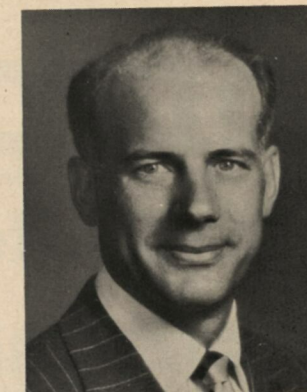

## TONIGHT'S GAME

Tonight's game is a very important one. This game marks the return of Santa Clara University to the Pacific football schedule after an absence of ten years.

1952 was the last time the Broncos and Tigers met on the gridiron.

Tonight's game is important because it is another step along the trail in Santa Clara's rise to the higher echelons of intercollegiate football.

For the past few years the Broncos have been playing low pressure games traveling within a radius of 100 miles. Through the guidance and ability of Pat Malley the school has not come back too strong nor tried to bite off more than it can chew.

Now Santa Clara can travel within the state of California. A larger and more ambitious schedule faces the Bronco eleven this season. Previously playing only six games, now SC is slated for eight.

Traditionally, the Pacific-Santa Clara game was one of the big ones in northern California.

This is the eighth meeting of the two schools, having first tangled in 1925 with then College of the Pacific winning 13-7. In successive years Santa Clara beat the Tigers three times: 17-0 in 1926, 36-6 in 1927 and 12-7 in 1928. That was the end of the series until after the second world war.



Then in 1947 these two teams hooked up in a game that hasn't been forgotten. A powerful Pacific eleven under Larry Siemering stormed out to a 20-0 halftime lead only end the game on the short end of a 21-20 score in old Baxter Stadium (John Rohde, Tiny Campora and Eddie LeBaron were members of that Tiger eleven).

In 1950 and 1952 the Bengals downed Santa Clara by scores of 33-14 and 27-0, respectively. Thus the series stands at 4-3 in favor of the Broncos.

Tonight Pacific brings a 1-1 record in to Pacific Memorial Stadium having defeated Brigham Young 26-7 and losing to New Mexico State 28-6. The Broncos are 0-1, losing to the Cal. Aggies last week in dedicating the new Buck Shaw Stadium.

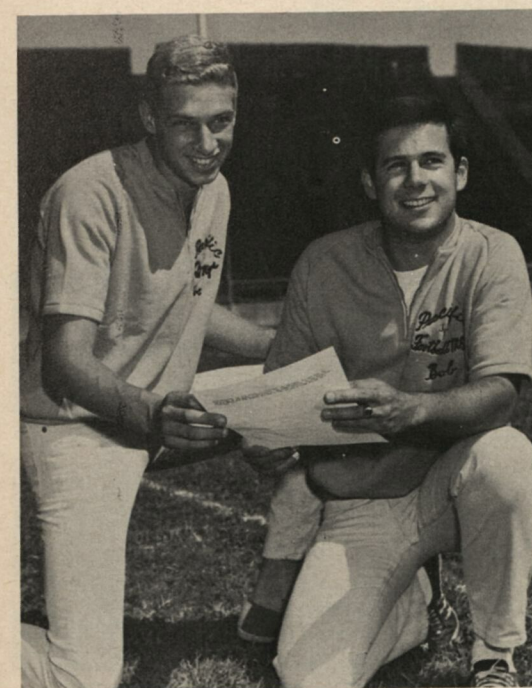

The Tigers will should be roaring mad after losing to the Aggies last week at Las Cruces and Santa Clara will be looking to knock off a major football school on their comeback trail so this should be a hard-knocking ballgame.

And we all hope the start of a great new series.

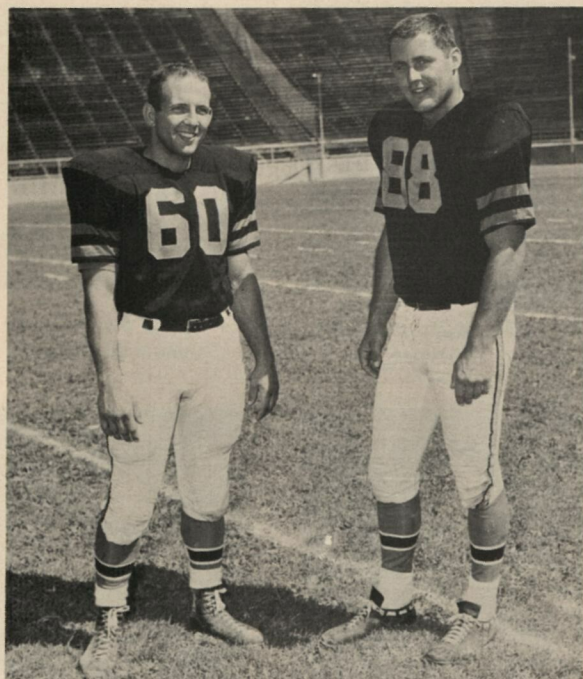

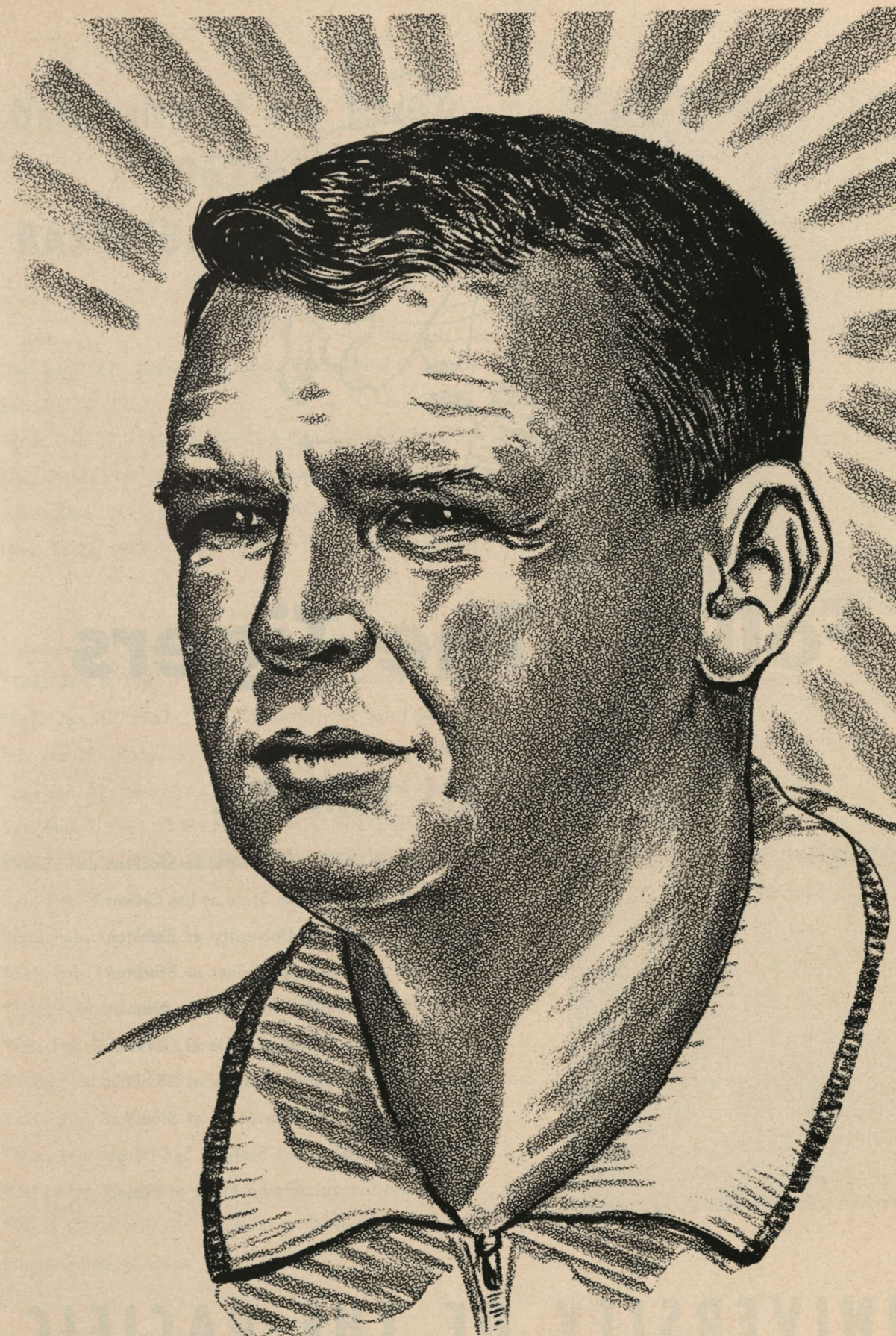
