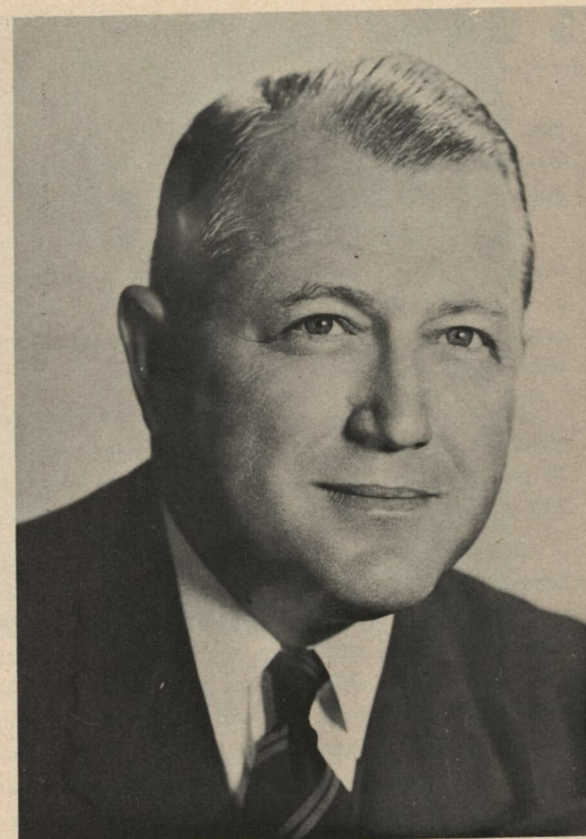

## TONIGHT'S GAME

"America's finest pass receiver for the past two seasons now enters his senior year at Washington State shooting for his third consecutive national title."

These are the words describing Hugh Campbell, All-American end of the Washington State Cougars.

The six foot-one inch, 180 pound senior from Saratoga, near San Jose, is holder of every national pass receiving record for total receptions and yardage. Although he is not the national leader currently, Hugh is uppermost on the minds of the Pacific football squadmen.

The Tigers looked at the national leader last week. Vern Burke of Oregon State, and now must face an elusive, clever and glue-fingered flanker who has only been shutout twice in his career.

Throwing to him tonight will be Dave Mathieson, a junior quarterback who has had only one pass intercepted this season.

This combination has brought the Cougars into tonight's game undefeated in five games. Pacific sports a four win-two loss record.

pass combination, WSU is a running team. The Cougars will stick to the ground game for 70% while going to the air 30%.

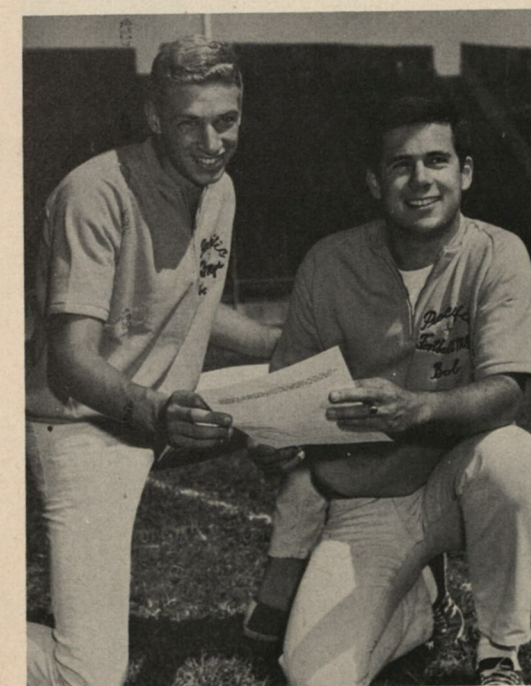
This attack will give John Rohde's eleven all they can handle this evening as Washington State is now a member of the Big Six and thereby eligible for a berth in the Rose Bowl, should they continue their winning ways.

But the Bengals found a passing attack at Oregon State last Saturday as Jack Sparrow completed 10 of 15 passes while Johnny Alsup hit on 8 of 15 good for 255 yards.

And there will be a friendly rivalry waged tonight between quarterbacks of these two teams. Johnny Alsup and Dave Mathieson played against each other during their high school careers in southern California and were teammates on all-star teams after their prep days. They are close friends but will be out to determine neighborhood supremacy tonight. These teams have met seven times previously with the Cougars leading the series five games to two. The last meeting was in Pullman, Washington in 1960 with WSU downing UOP 51-12.

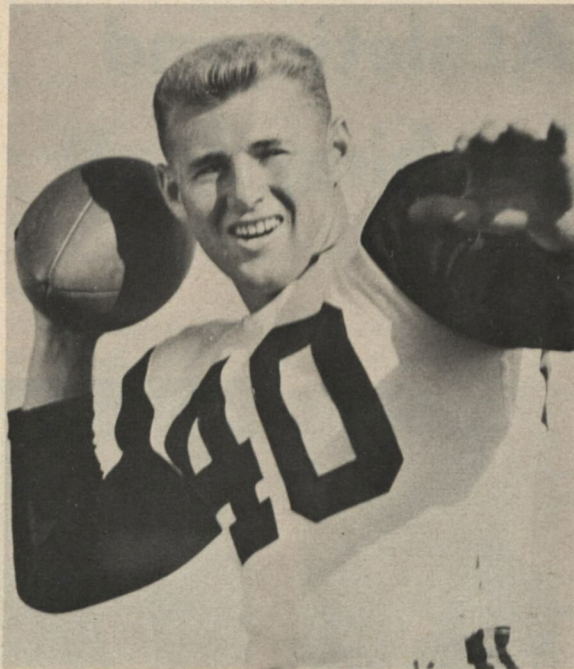

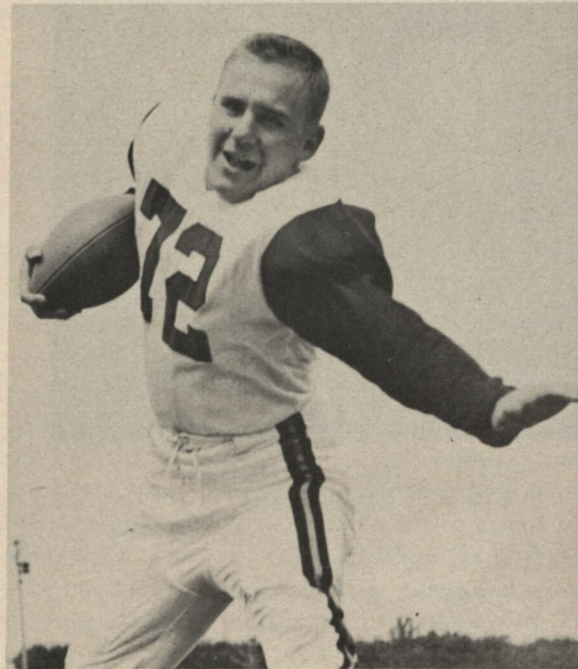


## TIGER QUIZ

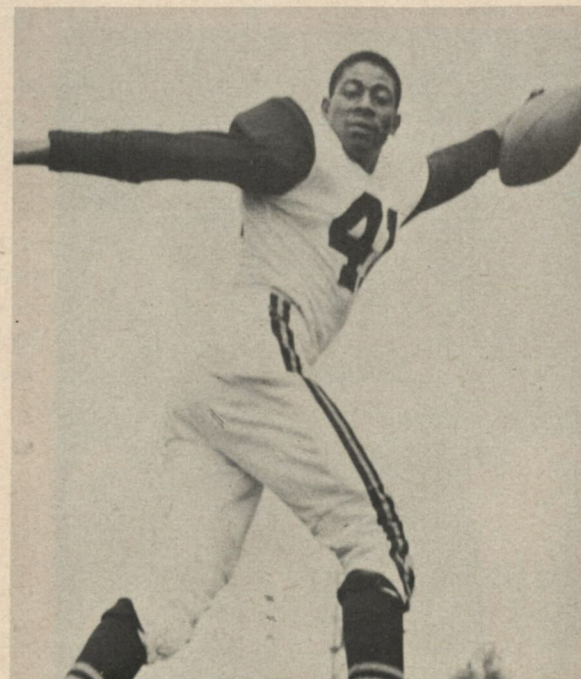
This one is easy. He played on the 1949 undefeated team and is now a member of the Dallas Cowboys. His number has been retired.

He is a Stockton product. Shifty runner who played in National Football League, Canada and American League.



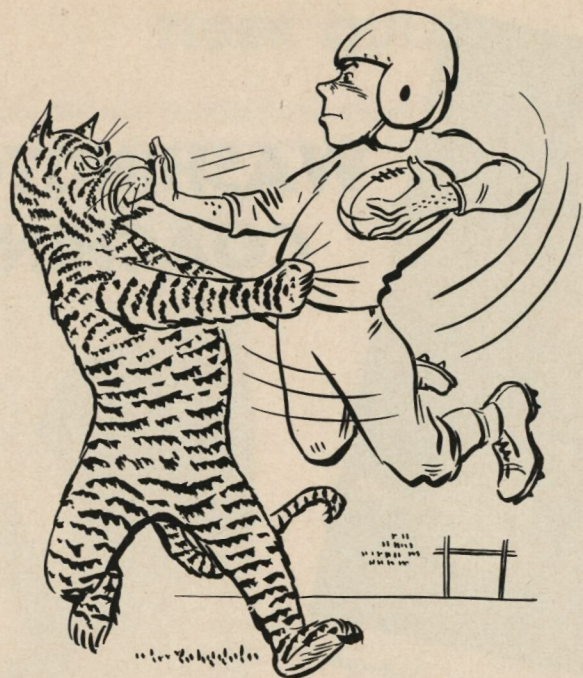

# PACIFIC PLAYBOX

## NEW INTIMATE THEATRE FOR UNIVERSITY DRAMA

A new dimension in theatre was added to the Stockton scene last Spring with the opening of the Pacific Playbox on Miracle Mile, adding another avenue for drama activities at the University of the Pacific.

A capacity audience of 100 becomes a part of the oldest form of theatre known to the human race, theatre in-the-round, as it watches the stories unravel on the center stage of the 48-foot-square theatre. The new theatre setting, designed by Curt Ennen, technical director of Pacific Theater, can be used in various arena-type productions. Individual Kona chairs, in square triangular or other arrangements on elevated carpeted floor around the center stage area, lends complete versatility to the theatre structure.

Coffee, served to the audience in white china service during intermission, is an added emphasis toward a more intimate approach to theatre, points out DeMarcus Brown, director and guiding light for Pacific drama for the past 38 years. The new theatrical outreach is in addition to the Pacific Theatre and Studio Theatre activities.

The "circus theatre" idea was conceived over a year ago. Housed at 157 West Adams at Pacific Avenue, previously the old bindery of Atwood Printing Company, the theatre itself is a small masterpiece of making

something attractive and serviceable out of unpromising material.

Audiences this fall have seen two productions since the opening of another repertory season October 3. The new venture will be kept in continuous repertory operation, Wednesday through Saturday nights in the same manner as Brown's phenomenally successful summer theatre, Fallon House at Columbia State Park.

Last spring's successful "Dinny and the Witches," which also was presented before capacity audiences at Columbia during its 13th Summer repertory season, was the opening fall production. The second production of the Playbox, the hilarious comedy "Breath of Spring," has just completed a successful six-day run.

Shakespeare's comedy, "As You Like It," will open November 7 and will be repeated on November 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, 17, 29, 30 and December 1. Curtain time is 8 o'clock.

Admission is \$2.00 week nights, \$2.50 on Saturday nights. Students visiting the University campus will be admitted any night for \$1. Admission for Pacific students with PSA cards is 50 cents on Wednesday and Thursday, \$1.00 on Friday, \$1.25 on Saturday. Reservations are advised and may be made by calling HOward 2-8676.
