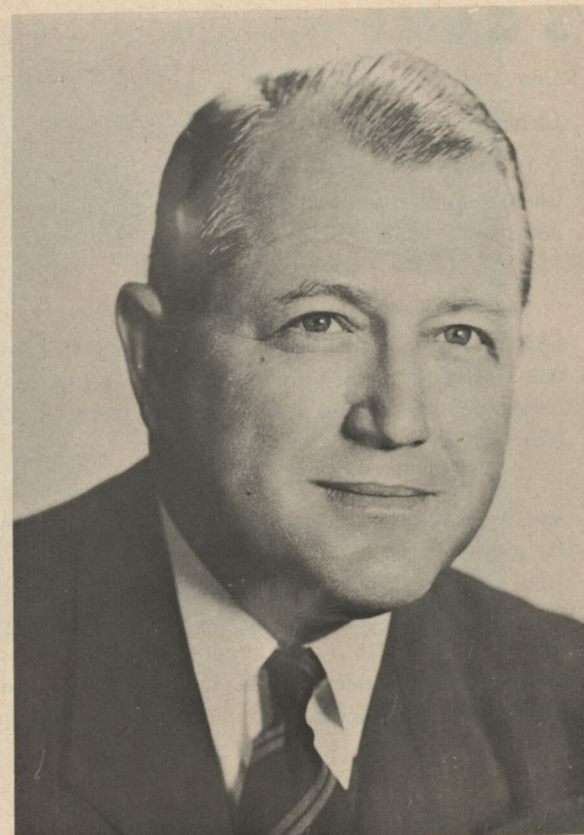

TONIGHT'S GAME

Homecoming 1962. Welcome grads to the University of the Pacific-San Jose State football game.

One of the nation's oldest rivalries has its renewal tonight between the Spartans and Tigers, a series that started in 1921, according to Pacific, or in the 1800's, according to San Jose State.

Pacific claims the series record stands at 17-14-3 in favor of the Spartans. SJS feels the series is now 19-14-3 claiming, there were two games played before the turn of the century although research has not been able to turn up any evidence of those two contests.

This series has been one of streaks. Last year San Jose stopped a Tiger string of seven consecutive victories spanning 1954 through 1960. The Spartans held a twelve game win streak over the Bengals from 1932 through 1946 (no games were played in 1943-44-45).

Last season San Jose State defeated the Tigers two times, 16-0 at San Jose and 29-26 here at Pacific

Memorial Stadium.

If comparative scores mean anything, and they usually don't, Pacific should be favored. The Tigers defeated Washington State last week 13-12 while San Jose lost to the Cougars 49-8.

This has not been a very successful season for the Spartans having a record of no wins, six losses and one tie. But a victory tonight over the Tigers would certainly bring a great deal of delight to the Spartan eleven. This will be another titanic.

This is also the final home game of the 1962 season for Pacific. That means that 16 Tiger seniors will be playing their final game in this stadium. Seniors John Gamble, Roy Williams, Dan Silva, Jack Sparrow, Greg Stikes, Aaron Youngblood, Lionel Sequeira, Mike Porter, Larry Leitch, Roger Higdon, Mike Smith, Steve Olds, Dick Henander, Bill Kutzer and Rick Gordon are wearing the orange and black for the last time.
