This game has brought a lot of thrills and exciting plays in its short history. Look for a free-wheeling passing circus today by both teams.

The Varsity has only won one game in the series, 1961. The Alums lead three wins to one with one tie.

QUARTERBACK CLUB MESSAGE

In 1958 the Stockton Quarterback Club sponsored the first spring football game played on the Pacific Coast that featured Alumni professionals in a full regulation game. Featured on the Alumni team that year were players who were then prominent in the N.F.L. such as John Nisby and Gene Cronin, now of the Washington Redskins, Clyde Connor of the 49'ers, Bill Streigel, then with the Philadelphia Eagles, A. D. Williams of the Green Bay Packers, now the property of the Minnesota Vikings, Bob Denton then with the Cleveland Browns, now with the Vikings. Also, Tom Flores now with the Oakland Raiders.

On the Pacific Varsity that year were Dick Bass of the Rams, Carl Kammerer of the 49'ers, Jack Larscheid later with the Raiders, Wayne Hawkins now with the Raiders, Willie Hector now with Calgary, and Ola Murchison of the Dallas Cowboys.

The game captured the imagination of the fans and for the past five years the attendance has averaged over 6,000 for each of the spring games.

Today, every major university on the Pacific Coast feature this type of game at the conclusion of their spring practice. Pacific is proud to be the leader in this trend. The popularity of this spring game is exceeded only by such schools in the nation as Oklahoma, Notre Dame and Minnesota.

Today we have the excellent Manteca High School Band to provide our half time entertainment.

In another "first", we are holding a drawing at half time for some valuable prizes such as a trip to Hawaii for two persons, two halves of beef, Movie camera and projector and a weekend at Lake Tahoe for two persons.

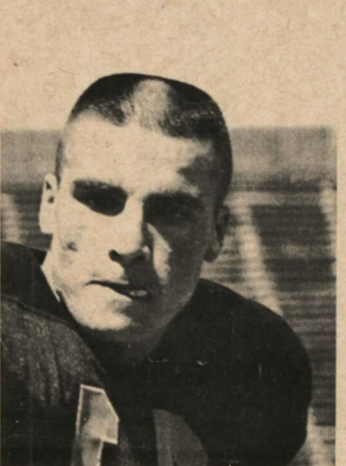
