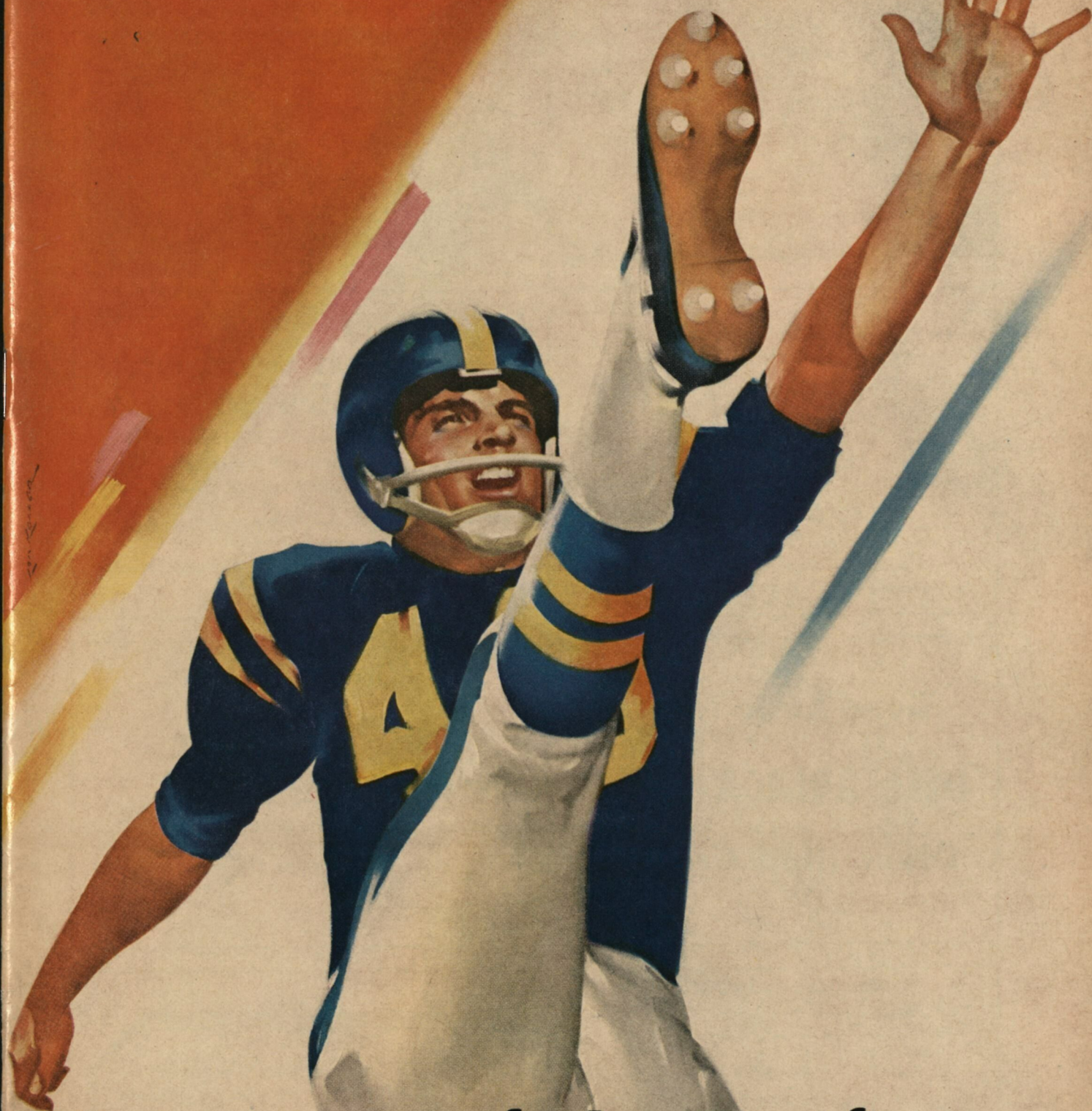

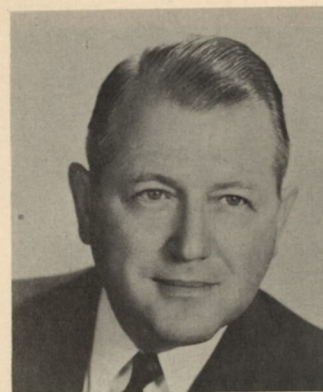

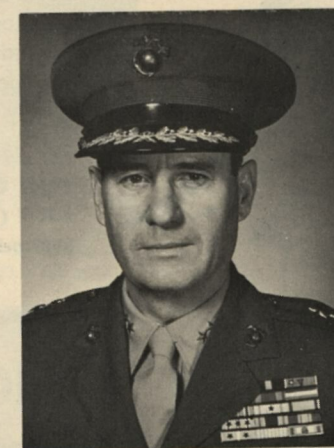

## TONIGHT'S GAME

As they have throughout their illustrious career the San Diego Marines are landing again, this time on the turf of Pacific Memorial Stadium.

With a perfect record of seven wins and no losses the Leathernecks will be out to break a two game losing streak suffered in this stadium at the hands of the Pacific Tigers. In 1961 John Rohde's Tigers delt the Marines a 12-9 loss which was a turning point in that season.

Prior to that game UOP had lost a last second game to Fresno State 20-19 and submerged by New Mexico State, 70-19. Yet they came back to win a hard fought battle from the Marines and go on to a 5-4 season.

Last year with revenge spurring them on the Marines came to town undefeated and seldom scored upon. Yet Rohde again turned them away, 14-7.

So the stage is set for the third Pacific-Marine game in succession with Major Allen "Scotty" Harris leading

his Leathernecks against the young, inexperienced Bengals.

John Rohde's crew is winless in five starts and will know they have been in a ballgame after tonight is over. Last season and the year before, members of the Pacific varsity were unanimous in singling out the Marine team as the toughest they had faced, physically.

Leading the Marine attack is five foot-four inch halfback Cleveland Jones. The former University of Oregon speedster will give the Bengal tacklers all they can handle tonight as will rugged running Kelton Winston and quarterback Errol Yeager.

The Marines have landed and this important ballgame will be won or lost in the two outstanding forward walls each team possesses.

Watch the line play tonight and you will see where tonight's game is won or lost.

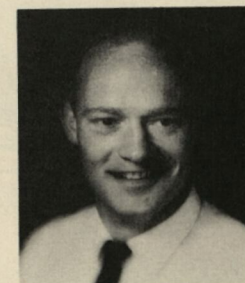

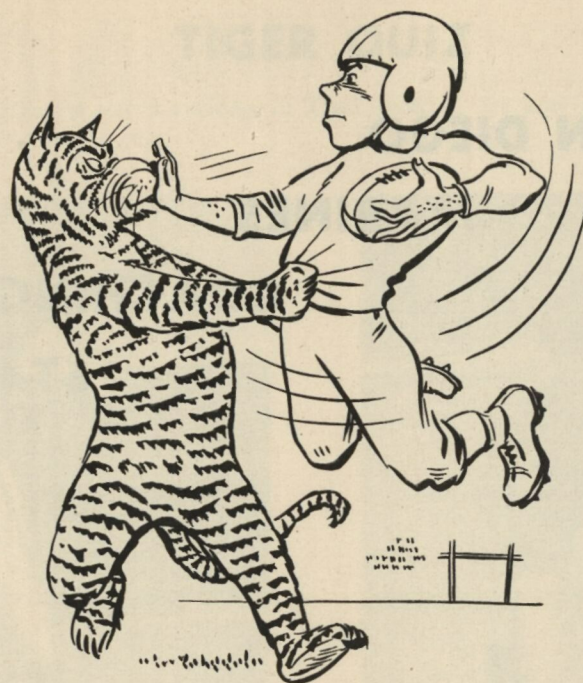

The youthful Edwards, only 32, won four league championships and nine tournament titles in only six years of prep tutoring. Including one season as Frosh coach at Pomona College his overall career record is a very impressive 143-30.

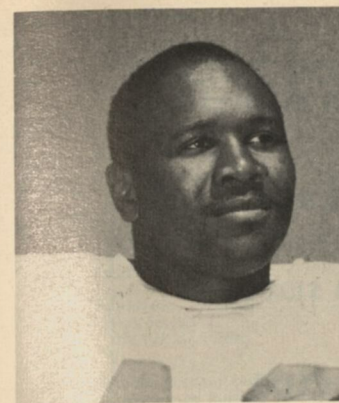
Last season he led El Camino High of Sacramento to a 22-2 season, a Metropolitan League Title and Camellia City Tournament Championship. The five-foot ten-inch native of Missouri leaves a 16 game winning streak at El Camino and a three year mark of 64-9.
