## Business Games For High School Students

The first "Pacific Games," a unique business simulation competition for high school students, is planned during this school year by the School of Business and Public Administration.

The games, funded primarily through an \$18,900 grant from Burroughs Company, will involve extensive use of computers in business decision making, said Dr. Newman Peery, a professor at the school who is the faculty administrator for the program.

Teams from 12 Northern California high schools will simulate a breakfast cereal company to make business decisions on pricing, production levels, research and development, advertising and sales.

"The emphasis of this competition will be on operations of the company, not stock trading," said Peery. "We hope to stimulate interest in business at the high school level, promote the use of computers for analysis and decision making, and generate enthusiasm for this program on the part of the Stockton business community."

Several local business leaders are expected to participate as judges and guest speakers for the event.

Preparation for the "Pacific Games" began with a conference in October for teachers from high schools throughout Northern California.

Twelve high school teams will start the "Pacific Games" in January. Each team will make one business decision per week for eight weeks. The final competition will be held on the UOP campus in March. Awards will be presented to the winners in three divisions, with a prize valued at \$1,000 going to the top high school.

## Alumna Janet Leigh Visits Campus

Actress Janet Leigh returned to the campus in October to sign copies of her just released autobiography.

She was honored at a reception in the Gold Room on Oct. 15 and signed copies of her book, *There Really Was A Hollywood*.

The book, published by Doubleday, includes comments about her life at Pacific, where she was known as Janet Morrison in the mid-1940's.

The Associates of the University of the Pacific Libraries arranged the reception.

## Liskevych To Coach Olympic Volleyball

Terry Liskevych, the volleyball coach who has taken the UOP women's program from nothing to a national power, has been named coach of the United States women's national team.

Liskevych, whose UOP teams have been ranked among the best in the nation for five years, will be leaving the Tigers at the end of December to assume his new responsibilities.

He has agreed to a four-year contract with the United States Volleyball Association to prepare the women's team for the next Olympics in South Korea in 1988. The 36-year-old coach, who is also assistant athletic director at UOP, will succeed Arie Selinger at the national position. The U.S. women took the silver medal at the recent summer Olympics in Los Angeles.

This year's UOP team is ranked among the top five in the nation, and Liskevych hopes they can win the national title in early December. That is one goal he has yet to achieve at UOP. However, his teams have recorded a 249-82 mark during the last nine years. Under his leadership the Tigers placed second in the nation once, fourth three times and fifth once. They have earned six league titles, and he has been selected coach of the year on four occasions.

## Music Television Viewed In UOP Course

The success of MTV (music television) doesn't come as any surprise to Dick Etlinger.

"We are a very visual society," he says, "and I think MTV will continue

to increase in popularity."

MTV is important to Etlinger, the assistant to the dean at the Conservatory of Music, because it relates to a course he is teaching: anatomy of a record company.

Students in the class, part of the music management/business program that Etlinger directs, are learning about the 163 different job categories within a record company. Topics for class sessions include sales forecasting, record clubs, payola, tours, motion picture sound tracks, and the independent producer.

"This course emphasizes the business considerations involved in signing talent, manufacturing, graphics, promotion, advertising, distribution and retail sale of records and tapes, as well as the emerging market for home video software and its status in the marketplace," explains Etlinger in a course outline.

He is speaking from experience, as the UOP faculty member is a lawyer who spent 24 years in the music management field. He came to UOP in 1982 from Casablanca Records in Hollywood to develop a program in music management/business that now has 27 majors.

"Video is the biggest thing going right now in the record business," says Etlinger in reference to music television.



## Seminary Day Held At UOP

A Seminary Day to provide information on careers in the ministry was held on campus Oct. 10.

The Office of University Chaplain Rev. Gary B. Putnam arranged the event that included informal conversations with seminary representatives, a panel discussion, worship service, dinner and guest speaker discussing the ministry.

"This program was planned to interest a variety of people," said Putnam, "including UOP students, those interested in a second career in the ministry, active lay persons interested



in graduate education in theological studies, ministers who lack a graduate seminary education and clergy who seek more information to counsel inquirers about the seminary."

The dinner speaker was Donald Bossart of Iliff School of Theology in Denver, who spoke on the topic of "The Possibilities for Ministry."

## Colliver Lectures Held At UOP

The thrust of religious responses to 20th Century psychologies was the theme for the 28th Annual Colliver Lectures.

The Sept. 17-18 lecture series featured Dr. Donald S. Browning and Dr. Harmon Hartzell Bro as the guest speakers.

Browning, a professor at the University of Chicago Divinity School, concentrated on the theme of Christianity and modern psychologies. He showed how many different contemporary psychologies, when linked with different life situations, become quasi-religious and quasi-ethical.

Bro, who has served as a visiting scholar at Harvard's Center for the Study of World Religions, discussed spirituality in a psychological age. He examined the promise and peril of contemporary American rediscovery of spirituality, and this included comments from research work on altered states of consciousness.

## Overnight Programs For Prospective Students

Three overnight visits are planned this academic year at UOP for prospective students.

Arranged by the Admissions Office for high school seniors from throughout the state, the programs were on the Sundays and Mondays of Oct. 21-22 and Nov. 4-5. The third will be Feb. 10-11.

Approximately 125 students are planned for each session, which includes presentations on various aspects of college life, the overnight stay in a residence hall, visits to classes, and discussions on admissions and financial aid. Parents of the prospective students also were invited to the programs.

## Recent Graduates Dominate Survey

More than 20 percent of all living alumni from UOP have attended the University since 1980.

Figures compiled by Thomas W. Mooney II of the Development Office show that 21.6 percent of the alumni earned degrees from 1980 through 1984. Pacific has a total of 21,680 alumni, and 4,697 of these graduated during the last five years.

The growth of the University through recent decades also is evidenced by the finding that 74 percent of the alumni attended from 1960 to 1984. Only 26 percent of the living alumni were represented from 1900 through 1959.

Mooney's study also shows that nearly 82 percent of the UOP alumni reside in California, and 62 percent of these live in the Northern California region that includes the Bay Area, Stockton and Sacramento.

The study reports that 15 percent of all Pacific alumni are married to another UOP alumnus, and the number of "lost" alumni with no current address totals 5,160.

## Men Featured In Calendar

A hot item on the campus this fall has been a calendar with pictures of men.

Entitled the "Pacific 10", it features ten UOP male students photographed in a variety of campus settings. Because the calendars are geared to the school year, there are no pictures for the months of July and August.

Those photographed reflect mostly the traditional collegiate look in their dress, although some are in swim wear. They were selected after a survey of 1,000 University women.

"We really wanted to picture women, but marketing surveys told us we would have better sales with men," said Bob Berryman, a recent UOP graduate who did the photography. Berryman and UOP business student Ubaldo Rodriguez formed Bulldog Productions for the project, which was sponsored by Anheuser-Busch. Two other UOP students, Kristin Mohr and Brent McGinnis, assisted with the art direction.

"We did the project to have fun and as a good learning experience," said Berryman. Their work has been successful, as the campus bookstore quickly sold nearly 400 of the 1,000 that were printed. The calendars, priced at \$4.95, also are available at several Stockton locations. Berryman said even local high schools are interested, with the cheerleaders at Stagg selling the calendars as a fund raising project.

## History Center Staff Changes

A realignment of personnel at the Holt Atherton Pacific Center for Western Studies has been announced by Academic Vice President Dr. Oscar T. Jarvis.

Dr. Ronald H. Limbaugh, a UOP history professor, has been named director of the Center, director of the Center's special collections and publications, and archivist and curator of manuscripts.

Organizationally, the Center will report to the Director of Libraries, which, Jarvis said, will make the Pacific Center "an important wing of the main University Library. Ron Limbaugh is well qualified to assume this new leadership role."

Limbaugh, a UOP professor in the History Department since 1966, will continue to teach up to two courses a year as part of his new assignment. He also is the director of the John Muir Papers Microform Project which, in 1985, will result in the publication of all the original works of the famous naturalist whose papers are on deposit at UOP. Limbaugh has been part-time archivist and curator of manuscripts at the Pacific Center since 1970.

## Federal Grant For Supportive Services

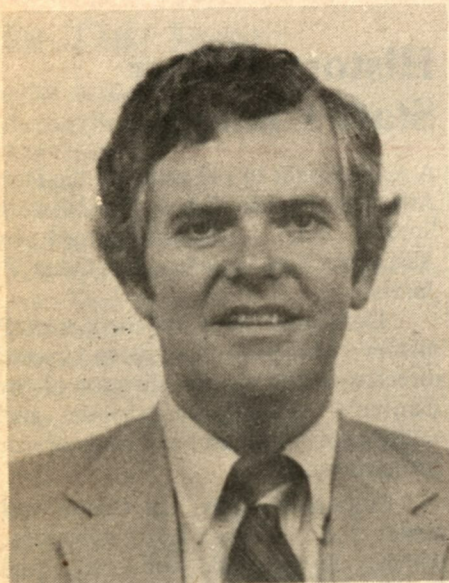
A federal grant of \$92,675 has been awarded to the Supportive Services Program at the University.

This program, which is administered through the Community Involvement Program, aids students in a variety of enrichment efforts, according to Tommie Ware, director of supportive services.

The funding, from the Department of Education's Special Services Program, helps finance projects in personal and academic counseling, a tutorial service, cultural enrichment and other educational support services.

Funding totaling more than \$400,000 has been awarded to the UOP program during the last five years. The current grant is expected to aid some 200 students.

## Dean Named For University College, Lifelong Learning

Dr. Donald F. Duns has been named to the newly created position of dean of University College and Lifelong Learning.

Dr. Oscar T. Jarvis, academic vice president, announced the appointment of Duns, effective Oct. 15.

The new dean has been a member of the UOP faculty since 1961 and is a 1958 Pacific graduate. He has served as associate dean of College of the Pacific for the last year. Duns previously taught for several years in the Communication Department and has extensive experience in administrative tasks and committee assignments at UOP.

Jarvis noted that one of the duties for Duns in his capacity at COP has been to administer the University College program. This provides local area adults with an opportunity to work toward a baccalaureate degree where some credit is possible for life experiences, and courses are arranged for the older, part-time student with a full-time job.

The Lifelong Learning program was previously directed by Durlynn Anema, who resigned recently to assume a full-time teaching position in the Communication Department.

Jarvis said establishing the position of dean is an outgrowth of a lengthy study of the University College by the Academic Program Review Committee. "This reorganization of University College makes it possible for the University to reach out to the community - especially the business sector - in an important way to make a baccalaureate degree available to the part-time student," said Jarvis.

He said Duns has considerable experience with the programs available through Lifelong Learning and is well-known in the Stockton community.

## Grant To Aid Special Education Teachers

A federal grant that will total \$150,000 over a three-year period to help advance the skills of special education teachers has been awarded to the University.

Dr. Hugh J. McBride, chairman of the Special Education Department at the School of Education, and Dr. Robert C. MacMillan, a special education professor, received the funding from the U.S. Department of Education. The grant totals \$50,000 for the current academic year, and an equal amount over each of the next two years.

"This grant will provide 80 percent of the tuition for 25 special education teachers to receive additional training," explained McBride. He said these teachers, all from schools in the San Joaquin County area, will take six units of coursework toward state certificate of competence requirements as a resource specialist.

Special education teachers work with children who have learning difficulties and who may be mentally retarded. McBride estimates there are more than 6,000 handicapped children and some 200 special education teachers in this county.

McBride, a UOP faculty member for nine years, annually generates approximately \$400,000 in grant funds to support special education programs at the University.

## Jedediah Smith Book Available

The Jedediah Smith Society at the University has just published "Monuments to Jedediah Smith."

The 48-page book includes illustrations and the full text of 31 commemorative plaques dedicated to the famous fur trader and explorer. The plaques are in seven states from New York to California, and the book describes the locations and other details on each monument.

The publication, edited by retired UCLA librarian Dr. Raymund F. Wood, includes an appendix that lists additional memorials to the American frontiersman.

The book is available to Society members for \$8, with a \$10 price for others. For details contact the Holt Atherton Pacific Center For Western Studies at UOP.

## National Physical Activity Conference

Approximately 400 professionals who deal with handicapped children and adults in physical activity met at UOP Oct. 25-27.

The 13th National Conference on Physical Activity for the Exceptional Individual involved participants from throughout the U.S.

Doris Meyer, a professor of physical education and recreation, and Floyd Bohnett of the adapted physical educational program for the Lincoln Unified School District, were conference co-directors.

In addition to presentations by national experts, the conference included several demonstrations and visits to the Easter Seals Therapeutic Center and

California Youth Authority O.H. Close School.

Those attending heard presentations on current trends in physical education, how special physical education teachers can work with the classroom teacher, athletic activity for those in wheelchairs, the role of music therapy in physical activity, water activities for stroke patients, newly developed games for the physically handicapped, and numerous other topics.

More than 150 handicapped children from this area were involved in demonstrations during the conference.

# Pacific Profiles

## Carolyn Jackson

**H**OME economics instruction in California high schools may see some changes in the next few years because of the work of Dr. Carolyn Berry Jackson.

Jackson, who received a doctorate in education from UOP in 1983, is a professor of clothing and textiles at California State University, Fresno. She recently received a \$300,000 grant to direct the writing of a new curriculum in clothing, textiles and housing for use in high school home economics programs throughout the state.

"We want the students to learn more than clothing construction skills, as they all need essential living skills," says Jackson, who has 20 years of experience in teaching home economics. Her three-year grant involves federal funds administered through the State Department of Education Vocational Home Economics Program.

"We want to get the students involved in consumerism and be able to compare prices of material when determining whether to purchase clothing or make their own." She is also interested in recycling clothing - "Americans don't wear out their clothes, they just throw them away" - and the special needs in clothing for the handicapped, elderly and children. Jackson's work also will deal with an area she terms conservation clothing. "If we can dress in ways to keep the thermostats a couple of degrees lower, we can save energy and lower fuel bills," she says.

She will be aided in her project by two graduate assistants at Fresno. Assistant Director Barbara Blackie, a home economics teacher in Elk Grove, will concentrate in the area of housing, including interior decoration.

Jackson received her doctorate from UOP in administration. Her dissertation, which relates to her grant project, was titled "An Intensified Workshop on Grooming and Clothing Selection for Student Teachers as an Approach in Homemaking Administration."

## Philip Guthrie

**A**LTHOUGH Philip Guthrie (COP '51) studied journalism when he was a student on the campus, he could never have visualized the amount of media exposure he would receive in his career.

He spent approximately 20 years as chief spokesman for the California prison system during a period of turmoil and notoriety. As assistant director for public information for the State Department of Corrections, Guthrie was regularly informing the media about such incidents as the Eldridge Cleaver parole violation and flight to Algeria, Marin County courthouse shooting that left a Superior Court judge and three others dead, the Soledad Brothers escape attempt from San Quentin that saw George Jackson killed, Charles Manson imprisoned at the Vacaville Medical Facility, incarceration of Sirhan Sirhan for shooting Robert Kennedy, the Patricia Hearst kidnap by the Symbionese Liberation Army and the parole of Dan White, who killed San Francisco Mayor George Moscone and Supervisor Harvey Milk.

Guthrie's career as a prison spokesman spanned the terms of four governors and five prison directors. It brought him considerable respect from both the news media and his colleagues in the profession for his honesty and cooperation. Last May, he received the Freedom of Information Award from the Sacramento area chapter of Sigma Delta Chi, a professional journalism society. It is an honor he cherishes deeply because of the respect from the press that it conveys.

The Pacific graduate retired from the California position last summer, but it was short lived. Raymond Procunier, a close friend and one of the state prison directors he served under, was named head of the Texas prison system. He asked Guthrie to serve with him again - as the director of public information. Guthrie accepted and is now residing in Huntsville, Texas with his new wife, the former Mary Lesperance, a 1952 Pacific graduate.

## Les Dabritz

**C**HAMBER of Commerce work is changing, and Les Dabritz (COP '57) has a firsthand view of this process.

Dabritz, executive vice president of the Fresno Chamber of Commerce, has spent 25 years in chamber work with four California cities.

"Chambers are getting away from the boosterism, parades and social activities to take more of a role in creating jobs, pursuing economic development and becoming active - from a non-partisan basis - in the political arena," says Dabritz.

He feels chamber work is becoming more people oriented than in past years. "The main role of the chamber of commerce is to enhance the quality of life and economic well-being of the community," he explains. "You achieve this by harnessing the talent of individuals interested in bettering the community and then consolidating their efforts through one organization."

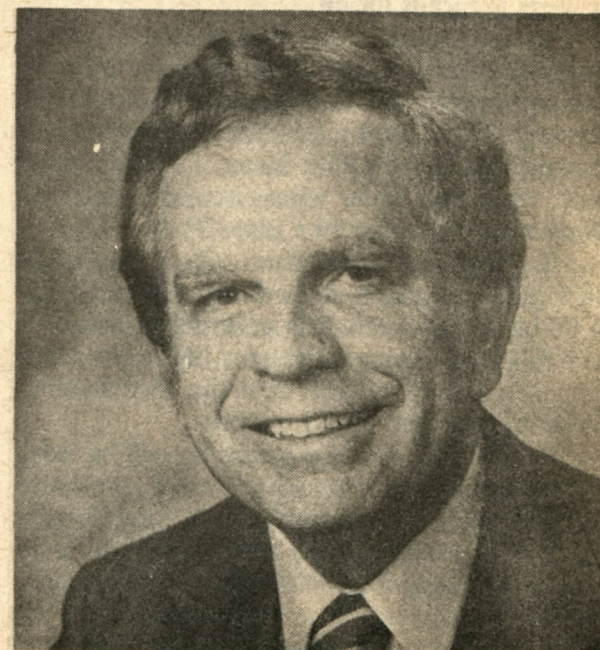
Dabritz has been practicing these principles since his first job as staff assistant with the Modesto chamber in 1957. "I was interested in public relations work when I graduated from Pacific," he recalls. "When the Modesto job came along I didn't know what a chamber was, but it sounded interesting."

After five years in Modesto, Dabritz advanced to become manager of the Lodi chamber for five years before going on to Salinas. He was there for nine years before moving to Fresno in 1978.

Although he is enjoying the challenge of chamber work in Fresno, he hopes to continue his advancement within the profession to new responsibilities in a larger city in the years ahead. "I like what I'm doing but ultimately would want a bigger challenge," he says.

The Pacific graduate, who has two children interested in UOP, drives to Stockton frequently for campus events.

# Ted Olson Provides Legal Advice To President

WHEN Ronald Reagan was elected president in 1980, he placed his assets in a blind trust. Ted Olson, COP '62, was the attorney who prepared the legal documents for the trust.

"It terrifies you to think that you might do something wrong," Olson says about that incident, "but it also is a special privilege to have such an assignment."

Olson apparently gets "terrified" a lot, as he has been intimately involved in legal matters of the highest magnitude for several years.

Much of this activity has been in his position with the Justice Department in Washington, D.C. His business card says assistant attorney general, office of legal counsel. What this means is that when the president's lawyer - the attorney general of the United States - needs a lawyer, he consults with Olson. The former Pacific debate champion has gone a long way since his campus days.

He has a list of more than 150 issues he has dealt with in the last four years, and many were highly volatile at the time. The topics include school prayer, the death penalty, the Freedom of Information Act, the War Powers Resolution, CIA operations, legal issues in the Soviet downing of a Korean aircraft, equal rights amendment and terrorism.

"The consequences of what we do are so widespread, it's important to be careful, thorough and sensitive to the ramifications of each decision," he said in an interview published in *The New York Times*. Added Olson later, "The challenge and diversity of the job are vastly greater than I anticipated. There is no way you can anticipate the magnitude and complexity of these issues, the frequency with which they appear and the infinitely small amount of time you have to resolve them."

A case in point was the firing by Reagan of 13,000 air traffic controllers. "The president had to know what legal rights he had, and we had four hours to come up with the answers," recalls Olson.

When John Hinkley shot President Reagan, Olson - who was still new on the job - had to prepare for the possible transition of power. "There were a lot of legal questions that needed answers in a hurry. For example, how, when and under what circumstances might such a change take place?"

To deal with these issues, Olson directs a staff of 20 lawyers and works an estimated 80 to 90 hours per week. It's definitely a hectic schedule that clearly represents life in the fast lane. It's so fast, in fact, that the 43-year-old Olson has decided to slow down.

Within the next few weeks he will be leaving the Justice Department to return to private practice. He was a partner in Los Angeles for the firm of Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher when he went to the capital in 1981. Now he will join the Washington office of the firm, which is the fifth largest in the country with some 400 attorneys.

"I love trial work and have missed it in this position," he says. "But this job is so intense that I haven't had time to miss it very much. However, I will enjoy getting back to that part of the profession. Being an advocate - the attempt to persuade - is a stimulating thing to do. I put about as much energy and strength in the position as I can, but it's time to do something else. I'm looking forward to trial work."

"My job with the White House has been to make sure everything is done with the highest level of integrity. I assist the attorney general in providing the executive branch with legal advice. It's an awesome responsibility. It's very important to present legal issues clearly, but not let partisan politics interfere. I'm there to make sure they get high quality, reliable, unshakeably sound legal judgments. If I can do that, it's making a good contribution to the process."

On this topic, he said in the *Times* interview, "All you can do is give your legal opinion, your best legal analysis, to the policy makers so they can understand the issues and

options, and then let them make the decisions."

Olson had not contemplated going to the Justice Department, as he was successful practicing law in Southern California. The position came about for a variety of reasons. Two of the biggest were that his firm was the legal representative for Reagan and one of Olson's colleagues in the office was William French Smith, who the president selected as attorney general.

"It was a big challenge to do something completely different at a level almost unsurpassable at any other job in this country. It was an opportunity - if you are lucky - that comes once in a lifetime. I'm very glad I didn't pass it up."

His career prior to the Justice Department, although not on the same dimension, could hardly qualify as low profile. He spent 16 years in Los Angeles emphasizing trial work in the areas of print and broadcast media litigation, business and securities work and the entertainment industry. His clients included the *Los Angeles Times*, Metromedia, NBC, and



Los Angeles Magazine. Olson also represented the First Artists Production Company formed by Barbra Streisand, Paul Newman, Steve McQueen, Sidney Poitier and Dustin Hoffman.

When Mike Curb was serving as California's lieutenant governor, Olson represented him in a dispute with Governor Jerry Brown over the powers of the lieutenant governor when the governor was out of the state. Olson also represented Foster and Kleiser when the City of San Diego wanted to abolish billboards in that city.

If there is anyone at Pacific who isn't surprised by the accomplishments of Olson it would be Dr. Paul Winters, his retired debate coach. "Ted was an extremely good debater whose greatest quality through the years has been his loyalty to Pacific," recalls Winters. The debate coach says that when Olson was working in Los Angeles and the forensic team was in Southern California for a tournament, Olson would always be available to help and lend support. "Of all the debaters I coached, Ted has probably gone on to receive the most national recognition, and it certainly is deserved," says Winters.

Olson also holds his former coach in high regard. "He took a tremendous amount of interest in debate students," says Olson about his mentor. "He had remarkable enthusiasm and inspirational ability. The best thing that ever happened to me was participating in debate."

Not only did Olson lay the groundwork there for a successful legal career, the forensics class was where he met his wife, the former Karen Beatie. She holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Pacific and is a daughter of UOP Regent Ken Beatie. Both her

parents are Pacific graduates, along with her brother and one of Ted's sisters.

Olson, who is from Los Altos in the Bay Area, enrolled at Pacific as a math major but changed to debate because of an interest in the law. "Debate teaches you many things that are helpful for the legal profession," says Olson. "You learn research skills, how to analyze issues, appreciate the fact that most issues have two or more sides, how to organize your thoughts and how to speak. The process of thinking that debate gave me was very helpful in law school."

Olson went to University of California's Boalt Hall, where he earned a law degree in 1965. He was named to the Order of the Coif and was a member of the **California Law Review**. This type of activity corresponds with his years at Pacific. He was a national championship winner in debate and selected as the outstanding graduating senior in journalism and speech. Ted was president of the Interfraternity Council, editor of the student newspaper, member of Archania fraternity, senior class vice president and communications commissioner for the student body.

He was on a debate scholarship for four years, and he can still tell you who else competed with him in forensics: John Beyer, Horace Wheatley, Brenda Robinson, Jinny Kahle, John Redhorse and Jerry Chong.

Olson's interest in politics started at UOP, where he belonged to the Young Republicans. He continued with this affiliation at Boalt and began to assist with legal matters in election years. He was an alternate delegate to the 1976 GOP convention, a delegate to the 1980 convention and was California Chairman of Lawyers for Reagan/Bush in 1980.

In the legal arena, he has practiced before the U.S. Supreme Court and was a member of the California Commission on Uniform State Laws, advisory member to the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws, and served as chairman of the Federal Bar Association's General Counsels Committee.

He likes the law because it "draws out the things I enjoy doing - communicating and competing. Law has an enormous fascination for me. It goes as far back as our history. It brings order to society and involves politics, history, human nature and problem solving. I have a deep personal feeling that law is what we are all about."

Ted Olson certainly is pursuing a career in an appropriate profession.

**LOS ANGELES** - Several "young" alumni joined the Los Angeles Pacific Alumni Club at the opening meeting.

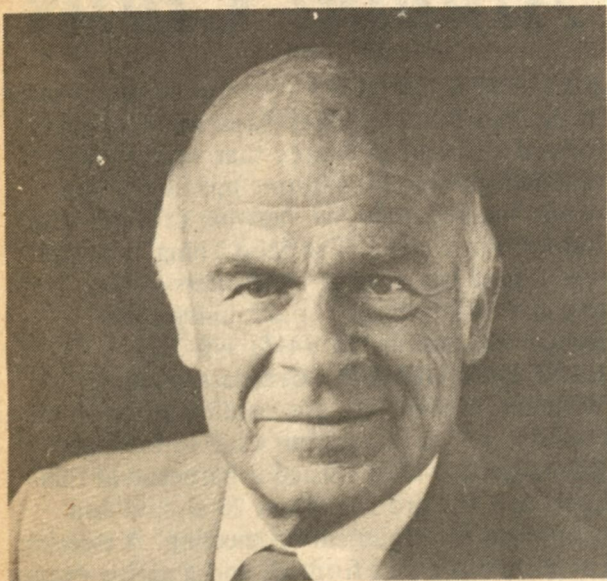

# Distinguished Service Awards Presented To Graduates

**A**LUMNI from four decades and a family that has been affiliated with the University of the Pacific since 1918 were honored by the Pacific Alumni Association in six awards presented during Homecoming this fall.

Included were the Amos Alonzo Stagg Award, the Pacific Family Award, and Distinguished Alumni Awards in the categories of professional achievement, public service and University service. Also, an award was established to honor an Outstanding Young Alumnus who has graduated since 1970.

Two alumni from the 1930s received the Stagg Award at the annual Block P Society dinner which also honored the teams from the late 1950s and early 1960s. Award recipients are Max E. Childress '36, and Edward A. Koehler '39. Both were honored for their humanitarian work and for carrying on the ideals established by Stagg.

Childress received his M.D. degree in 1940. In addition to developing a successful practice in San Francisco, he has done extensive volunteer work in Vietnam and in other Southeast Asia areas. Koehler is a partner in a successful business in Southern California and also has been instrumental in the development of Hope House, a residence for multi-handicapped children.

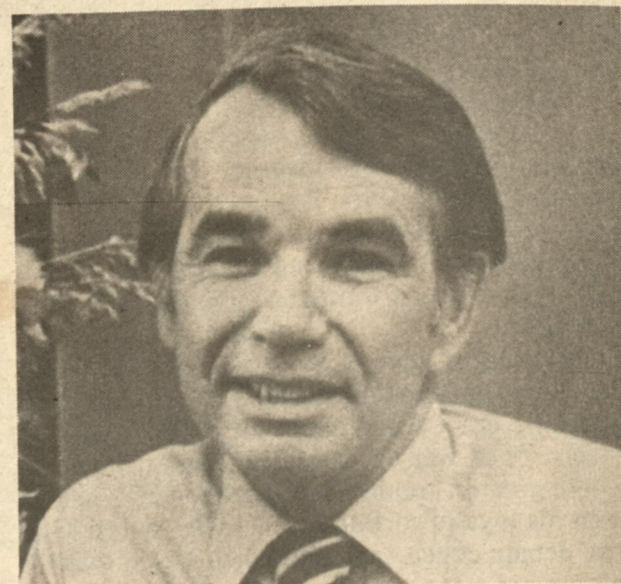
The Fred Farley family received the Association's Family Award. Dr. Farley joined the UOP faculty in 1918 as professor of ancient languages. He was awarded the Order of Pacific when he retired in 1953. Nine members of three generations of the Farley family have attended UOP.

Tom Flores '59, head coach of the Los Angeles Raiders, received the professional achievement award. He has been involved with four Super Bowl championship football teams and has been head coach of the Raiders for the past six years - twice as Super Bowl champions.

Allen Breed '42 was honored for public service. He served as head of the California Youth Authority from 1967 to 1976 and has continued "to provide advice and counsel on the improvement and modernization of corrections programs" throughout the United States as a private consultant.

Garth Lipsky '52 was honored for his University service, having been president of the Pacific Alumni Association for two terms in 1980-81 and 1981-82. He was cited for his efforts to revitalize the Association during his term of office and during the 10 years he has served on the Board. He has been city manager of Modesto for the past 11 years.

Chauncey L. Veatch '70 received the newly established Young Alumnus Award. This award was established in recognition of the fact that more than 50 percent of the alumni have graduated from UOP since 1970. Veatch has held state level offices in Nevada and California and currently is director of the California Alcohol and Drug Programs.

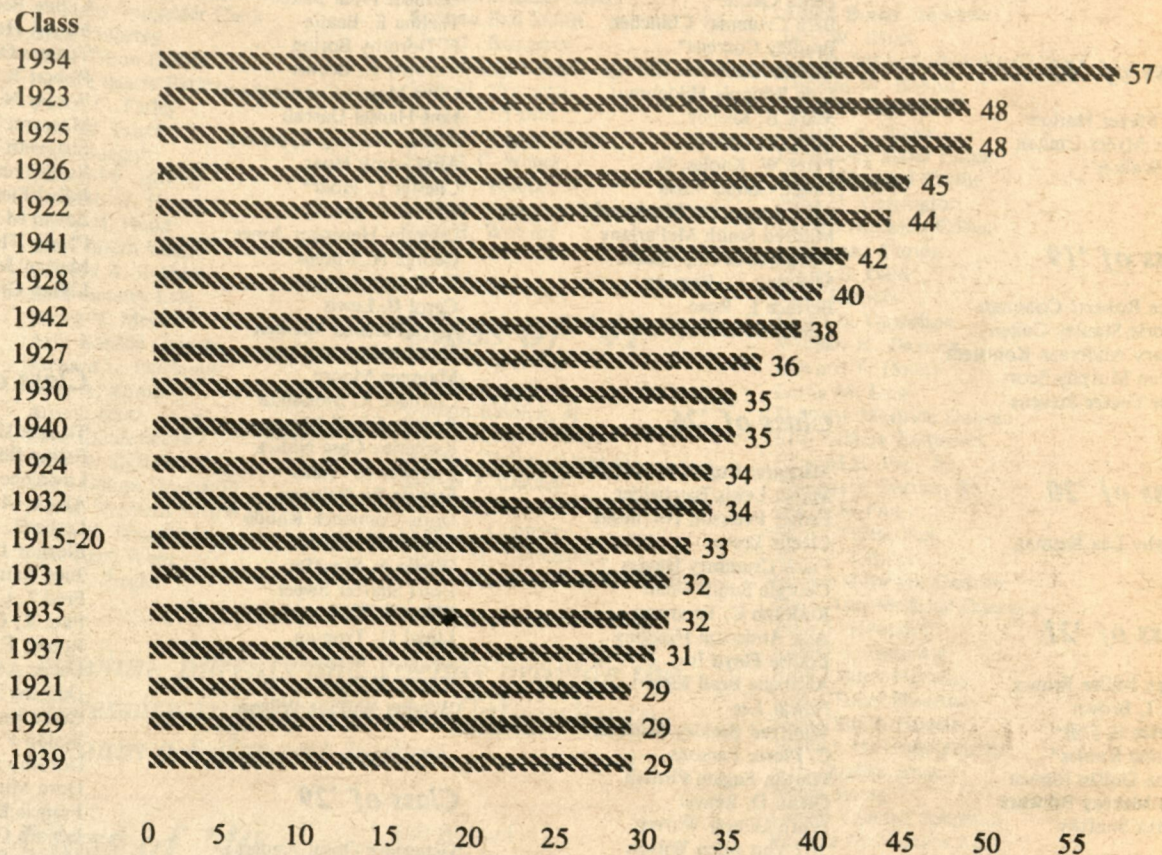
Concerned with the need by private universities for greater alumni support, the James Irvine Foundation presented Pacific Alumni with the following challenge.

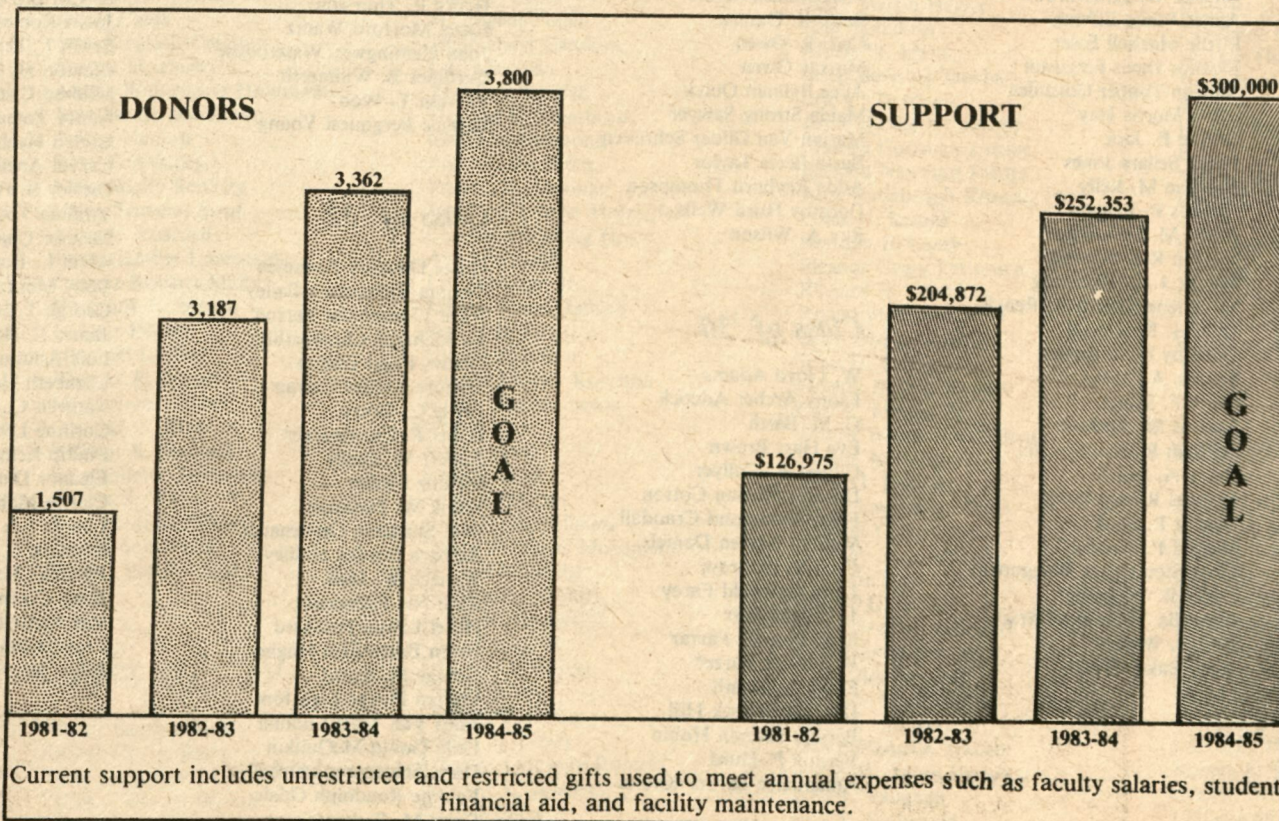

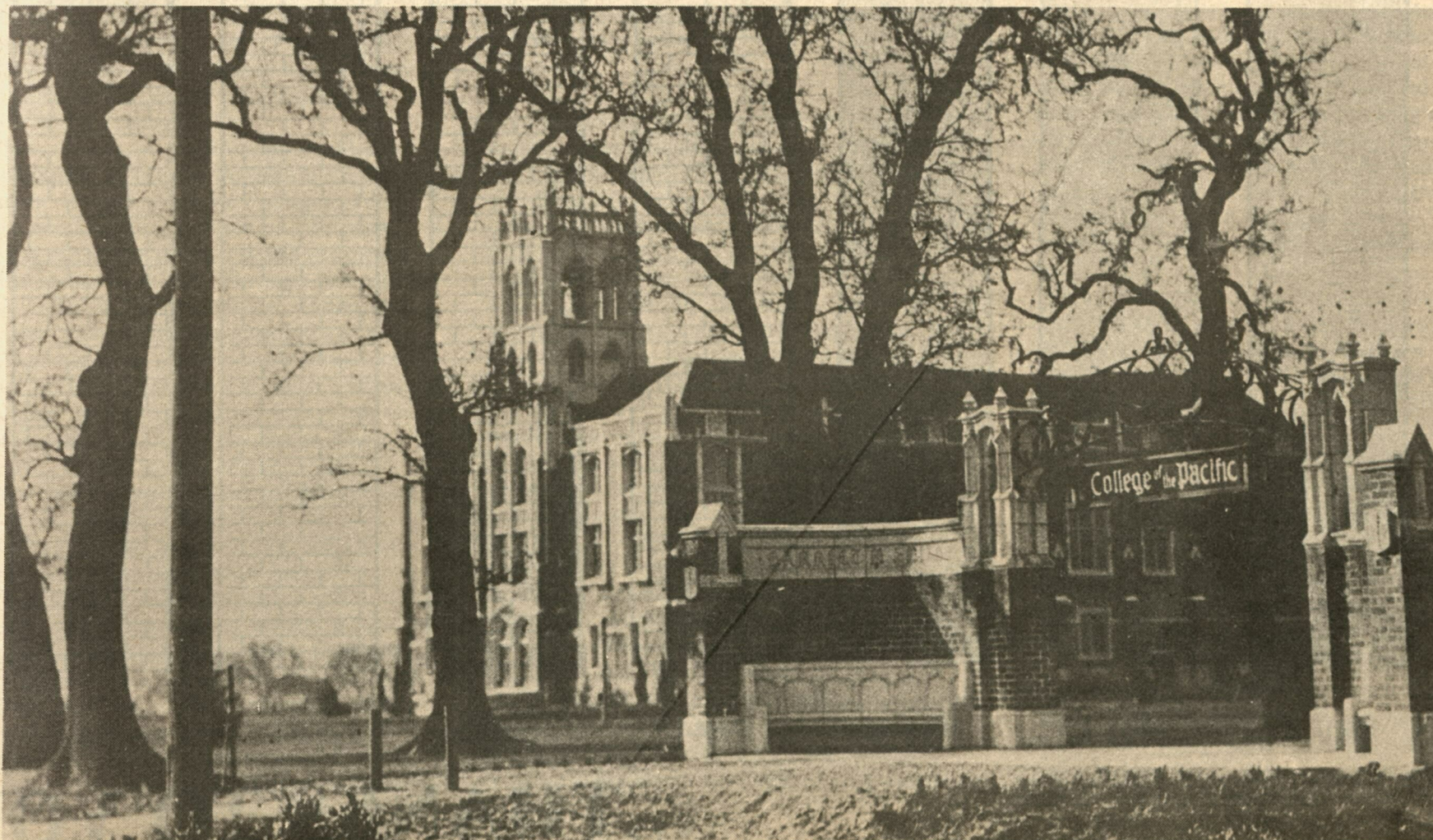

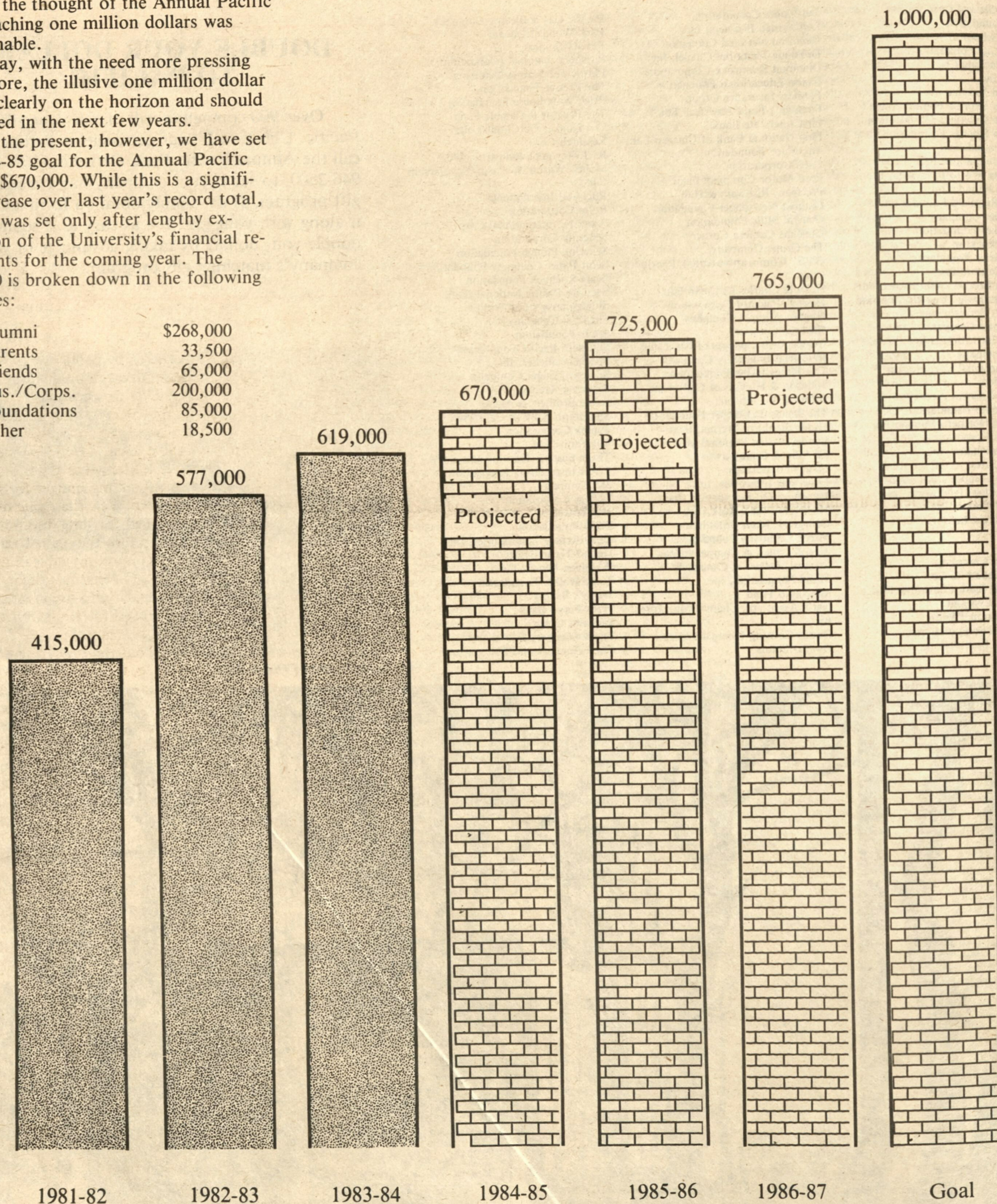
# WE'RE ON OUR WAY...

# An American In Paris

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Thomas Miller, a senior majoring in international studies, was in France during the last school year. The following comments on this experience were first published in the *International Bulletin* on campus.

A nine hour flight separates Paris and Stockton, but the change in intellectual and spiritual time zones seems so great that some visitors are left culturally jet-lagged and mentally disoriented. For others, it transforms their lives.

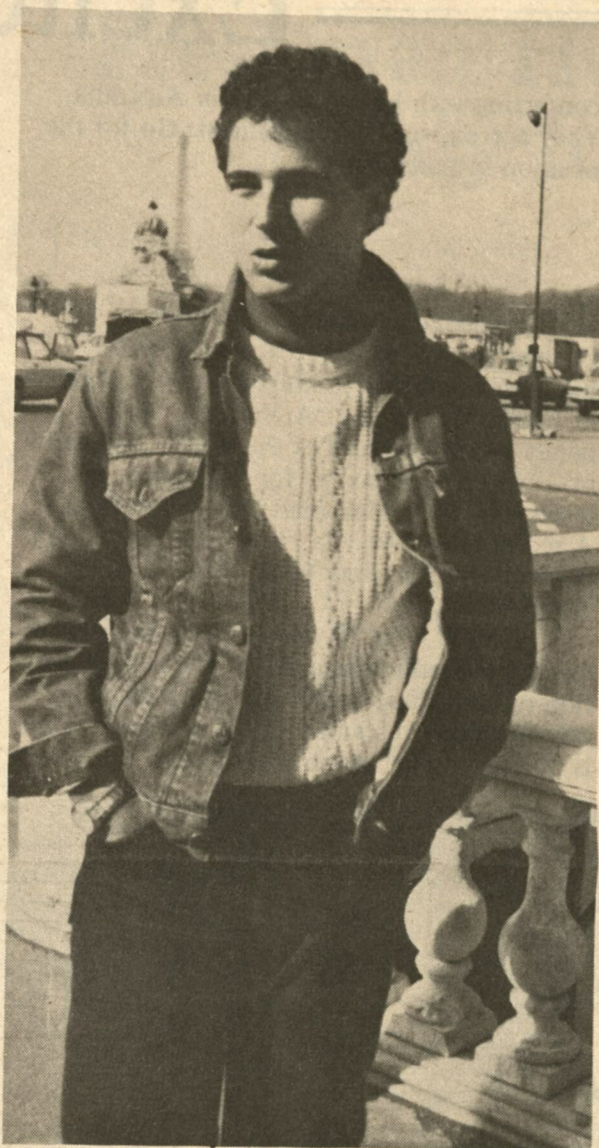
It was only on my last night in Paris that I surrendered myself to the emotional remembrance of the people and events which shaped, over the course of 11 months, a most extraordinary experience.

Tucked in the candlelit corner of a Saint Germain cafe I recalled my professors, who had instigated some of the most significant developments in my education. I was thankful that the doors had been open to me upon my arrival through the unique program at the Institute of European Studies.

The structure of the program enabled me to take courses at various Parisian universities.

At the Institut d'Etudes Politiques I listened to awe-inspiring lectures by Professor Helen Carrere d'Encausse, a world-renowned specialist in Soviet affairs. Through her course I was impelled to continue Soviet studies and finally visit Eastern Europe during the summer. What began as an interesting three month class on the USSR and the European socialist camp ended up as a fascinating four week sojourn through Poland and the Soviet Union, taking with me the insight and the vital academic foundation that necessarily precedes a stay in the "Eastern Bloc."

My interest and curiosity ignited by Carrere d'Encausse exploded when I met Professor Stanley Hoffmann through a series of lectures I also attended at the Institut d'Etudes Politiques. In the USA he has been chairman of the Center for European Studies at Harvard since 1969, and Hoffmann is internationally recognized as a leading political scientist. He is known for his writings in the areas of international politics, ethics, world affairs and French intellectual and political history. Hoffmann's eloquent use of the French language and the

clear expression of his sophisticated ideas and models inspired me to continue studying his work on the ethics of foreign policy behavior.

Similarly, I could not forget walking between the marble pillars and passing the faces of ancient mosaics as I entered the elite College de France. My first experience there was one of pure curiosity, to listen to a man about whom the intellectuals were raving. I was stunned by what I saw and heard. In due course, I too spoke of the late philosopher Michel Foucault as if he were of another world. The focus of the lectures I attended examined the ideas (or what he called "reality of events") which rule our behavior and dictate human customs. The wealth of information and the vast sources upon which he could draw off the top of his head led the discourse to far transcend the limits of my own knowledge. However, Michel Foucault opened for me a world of philosophy and thought that previously had been unknown.

It was this guiding environment that made up the substance of my lifestyle and my daily pre-occupations. Here, in the "city of light," is where I developed the capacity to generate

my own learning. Without doubt, the different dimensions in which learning was taking place were as limitless and varied as Paris itself.

From the great amphitheaters of the Sorbonne to the quiet gardens in the Bois du Boulogne, it was impossible for me to ignore the people, sights, sounds and smells as so many of us do at home.

Each day brought new encounters. I recalled the afternoons spent sitting in the cafes, engaged with students, artists, communists, anarchists, entrepreneurs, a writer from *Le Monde* --- or a total stranger. We spoke of architecture and Paris, literature and Simone de Beauvoir, politics and pacifists. The minutes in a cafe would stretch into hours. As the last rays of sunlight fell behind the Arc de Triomphe, we would leave our cafe and walk by the cathedral to be cooled by the soft spring wind and amused by the tourists in cars asking for the time or directions.

I finally understood what Ernest Hemingway meant when he described Paris as being a "moveable feast." I understood, and it was now mine. It seemed at times that the only obstacle to satisfying my hunger for Paris was the burden of sleep. Yet, the flame of my inquisitiveness burned for long durations.

And so, deep into the night I sat in my cafe and reflected upon my education and these experiences. On that last night, with one of my closest friends (also my greatest educator), I discussed the transition I had made in the past few months.

We realized that the procuring of education and knowledge exposes a person to the world in the context of his/her own experience and conditions. For instance, education in the classroom at home teaches one to deal with emotionally loaded issues of value and attitude by discussing, analyzing, rationalizing and intellectualizing them. Yet that seems appropriate only to the task of understanding issues, not to the task of choosing a position or exposing the self, which is often systematically withdrawn in a classroom situation.

In contrast, the process of being suddenly immersed in an alien country, exposed and hit with the disruptive impact of different lifestyles, values and traditions, leaves no room for emotional distance. One's assumptions and values constantly are being called into question, often by the most trivial events. The extent to which one's values and emotions are actively involved, touched and changed through daily encounters and the conditions of foreign culture, the higher the degree of learning that takes place. Consequently, the greater the personal commitment becomes to both understanding and choice.

The candle burned low, sitting in that quiet cafe. The last metro left Saint Germain to take us home, where I was left by myself to think about being alone tomorrow on the flight to New York, there to return to a culture that had become alien to me. Yet, I managed to smile. Paris was an experience which had taught me much more than just how to speak French.



# Changing Priorities In Teacher Education Excite New Dean

**T**HE boxes were packed and ready to go. The furniture was prepared for shipping. The movers were coming in a few days.

Dr. Fay B. Haisley, the associate dean in teacher education at the University of Oregon College of Education, was ready to return to Australia. She had accepted a contract to administer an education program that she hoped would lead within a few years to her ultimate professional goal: dean of a school of education.

Then, to steal a line from a Joseph Heller best seller "Something Happened."

Haisley received a telephone call inviting her to be a candidate for the position of dean at the University of the Pacific School of Education. She was familiar with Pacific through her work in administering the dean's grant to upgrade educational programs to meet new requirements.

"Part of the curriculum at the school reflected some of the recommendations we

conferring with her colleagues in Australia. They agreed with her assessment: Go for the position in Stockton.

The challenge for education schools in this country may never be greater. The widely publicized National Commission on Excellence in Education report, "A Nation at Risk", paints a bleak picture of the state of education in America. Test scores for students at all levels reflect a widespread lack of excellence. A recent cover story in Newsweek magazine is titled "Why Teachers Fail - How To Make Them Better."

Haisley, with 30 years of experience as a teacher and administrator, is in a unique position to view these problems. Her background has included substantial overseas work, which is obvious by her Australian accent. She is in a

Haisley, who assumed her position at UOP in July, continues, "Children in America will perform at a higher level than is expected, but the general attitude has been 'let's not give them too much to do.' Too often our schools have been seen as an interruption from play."

The new dean feels the "Nation at Risk" findings, from the commission chaired by University of California President David Gardner, have some positive aspects for the future of the country because they have moved the issue to the political arena and made it a national concern. "This has created a dialogue from constituents in different areas, which is important because it must reach the local level. It's not so much the financial backing as the people resources that will make the difference.

"The National Commission on Excellence in Education was correct in pronouncing this country as a nation at risk. In the mid-1970s our schools lost sight of their mission, which is to provide the knowledge base for the future of the country.

"The schools were failing to meet the expectations of the public, but there are a number of reasons for this that are not the fault of the schools." She says teachers have been poorly paid and badly treated, yet expected to improve tomorrow's society with dwindling financial and public support.

Haisley, the first woman dean in the 60-year history of the UOP School of Education, feels these conditions and situations present a major — but not insurmountable — challenge for those in teacher education.

"These actions set the stage for almost the development of a national agenda to review educational priorities," she says. "The impact has had a wide-spread effect through new mandates for high school graduation requirements, a longer school day and more attention to foreign languages and teacher education. It's interesting that in the 1890s a similar report was issued, and it brought almost the same reaction. It's almost a cyclical pattern."

She supports closer ties between education colleges and public school systems. "In general, faculty members throughout the country are not on the firing line in the same way as elementary and secondary teachers. We need some mechanism for the infusion of more public school know-how into school of education training programs. We have to develop new models for better interaction with public school teachers, administrators, school board members and parents. I think we in higher education have tried, but more needs to be done. It's also important to provide the faculty with a continual update on the state of the art in teacher education."

She notes that "outside agencies are moving to train teachers. If this continues, many schools of education are out of business. To counteract this, we need to maintain our

made through the dean's grant. I felt comfortable there and accepted by the faculty," she recalls. These feelings were enhanced by her selection as the commencement speaker at the school in 1983.

The offer to apply was attractive, but Haisley only decided to pursue the matter after

position to compare the American system to others. Her comments support the bleak findings receiving national attention in the media.

"I feel children are challenged more abroad. The mental capacity expectations are higher overseas. Until recently, I viewed the American system as soft, with a less than rigorous curriculum and with lower expectations for the students."



strong faculty, provide the best graduates we can, and pay more attention to the needs of the public schools."

At UOP, Haisley praised the work of her predecessor, Dr. Oscar T. Jarvis, who is now the academic vice president at the University. "It's easy to succeed when a quality operation is in place," she says, "and Dr. Jarvis made this possible."

She plans on having the faculty become involved in curriculum matters while developing their personal goals to relate to the priorities of the school.

"I want to meet with our faculty to know the individual strengths of each one and their expectations for the school." She would like to see the faculty obtain more national visibility for their professional activities and be more aggressive in seeking grants.

"The faculty is our greatest strength, and some of the research from here is remarkable for the size of the school." She cites Dr. Ennio Cipani in special education, Dr. Sandra Anselmo in early childhood education and Dr. Elmer Clawson in economics education as among those having national stature in their areas of expertise. "National rankings exist in professional associations, and we should be there. It gives us the opportunity to recruit nationally and gives the faculty increased visibility," she says.

Haisley is hoping her contacts can lead to faculty exchange programs, perhaps with the University of Oregon or overseas in Australia and New Guinea.

She sees the top priority at UOP as the recruitment of quality students, given the tuition here and dwindling pool of applicants, while maintaining the quality of the programs. "Our problem is not placing students — nearly 100 percent of our graduates receive jobs — but getting students. The dean has a leadership role to find and utilize the resources in the best possible way. You need a vision of the future that can be developed with faculty participation to best project UOP across the state and nation."

It's obvious that Fay Haisley understands the challenges facing education in this country. It's also obvious that she made the right decision in altering her moving plans from Australia to Stockton.

## Freshmen Honor Students Study John Muir

UOP freshmen have access to the world's largest collection of original writings and sketches by John Muir in an experimental class now underway.

"John Muir and the American Environment" is the title of the seminar course for 10 freshmen honor students. Dr. Ronald H. Limbaugh, a UOP history professor and director of a major University project on Muir, is teaching the class.

"John Muir was one of the first Americans to call public attention to the adverse consequences of material growth," says Limbaugh in a course outline. "As such he was a watershed figure in history. During his time the American public first began to take up environmental issues that still trouble us today."

The course emphasizes class discussions instead of lectures on Muir, who founded the Sierra Club and helped make Yosemite a national park.

"This class makes you think," says Katie Morrison, 18, of Fresno. "It's about your system of values and gets you to look at the environment around you in more objective terms." Marion Nobbe, 18, of Walnut Creek, says the class discussions also affect her value system. She adds, "I didn't know much about Muir before. I think he had some good ideas, but some of his positions regarding nature can be unrealistic today."

Limbaugh, who has previously taught courses in environmental history, has studied

Muir since 1970, when UOP received a major collection of original works by the legendary conservationist. Limbaugh helped catalog and inventory the collection, which is housed in the Holt-Atherton Pacific Center for Western Studies that he directs.

"Probably over 75 percent of the original writings and drawings of John Muir are located at UOP," says Limbaugh. Much of this material is available to the freshmen in the class. "His writing is really hard to read, but the sketches are interesting," says Nobbe.

Limbaugh also is the director of a UOP project to collect, edit and publish on microfilm all of Muir's original works, including the portion not already on deposit at UOP. This five-year project is due for completion next spring.

"Muir was a real pioneer in raising questions about some very special values we hold dear in America," explains Limbaugh in talking about the class. "We want to assess the value of his writings and experiences in light of current issues and concerns."

Items being discussed in the class include the energy crisis, depletion of natural resources, a decline in the quality of life, urban congestion, and chemical wastes. "We need to articulate these concerns and question the moral and ethical values they raise in relationship to topics like the environment, wildlife, wilderness preservation and the aesthetics of nature," says Limbaugh.

# Curtain Rising For Promising Actor

**B**OB Bejan, COP '83, raps on the wooden wall in a delicatessen for good luck. The exuberant singer-dancer-actor can't get over his remarkable rise in show business.

Unlike many out-of-work performance majors, Bejan has been employed virtually since he got out of school. Last summer he concluded nine months on the road with a seven-week run at the Music Circus in Sacramento and was heading for a six-month engagement in New York this fall. Before that he had appeared in nearly a dozen television, stage and motion picture productions.

Not bad for a guy who came to UOP on an athletic scholarship to play water polo.

During his first semester Bejan enrolled in a dance class to help limber an ailing shoulder in preparation for the water polo schedule. He found enjoyment in the fine art, continued to take classes and appeared in numerous productions on campus - usually in the spring so it would not conflict with his sport.

The conflict over sport and art haunted him throughout his term at UOP. Yet, he enjoyed the contrast.

Dr. William Wolak, chairman of the Drama Department, remembers that the situation "tore him apart. But he gave himself fully where ever he was. Bob had to make his opportunities."

Bejan recalls his friends from the water polo team would attend his theatre productions, and fellow cast members became interested in the aquatic sport. He enjoyed being the bridge between the two vastly different worlds.

He also performed in the Pacific Dance Ensemble and the San Joaquin Concert Dance Ballet. Rounding out his experience was his membership in Archania fraternity.

Just prior to graduation, Wolak challenged him by saying that to succeed in a show business career Bejan would need to sharpen his skills, since he was neither a superb dancer, singer or actor. "I told him," says Wolak, "it would require determination and drive, and continued study and practice."

Bejan received a surprise call just two days after graduation to fill in for a sick cast member in the stage presentation of "Sugar" at the Harlequin Theatre in Costa Mesa. He continued, thereafter, in the dinner theatre circuit, performing in "West Side Story," "Applause" and "Grease."

In Las Vegas, while performing in a second version of "Sugar", Bejan was asked by

the producer to choreograph the show in Atlantic City, where Joe Namath would star in the lead role. Bejan also was asked to understudy with the former pro quarterback. He jumped at the chance to choreograph, remembering the excitement he got from directing and choreographing in college.

"Bob never was a follower," remembers Wolak. "I was never impressed that he was just a chorus boy. He always had the confidence to go for the creative leadership positions."

Meanwhile, Bejan continues to gain experience as a performer while he waits for the opportunity to direct. So far, his versatility has paid off. "If you want to be a working actor, the musical theatre is the most accessible area for an upcoming actor. If you can sing, dance and act you will be more castable," he says.

Looking back, Bejan says there is no "right" way to break into show business. However, he believes he has the edge over his colleagues who only studied the technical aspects of performance. His liberal arts education, he says, also taught him how to learn. "And that is more important than any of the acting or dance steps that I learned there."

Bejan says the business demands hard work, a maniac faith in yourself and the ability to handle rejection - something he learned through athletic competition.

"Pacific made me a well-rounded person rather than just a performance machine," he says thoughtfully.

## Goals For Alumni Outlined

**I**NCREASED participation is the central theme for all programs of the Pacific Alumni Association developed by the Association Board at its annual Feather River retreat this fall.

A newly formed Public Relations Committee, expansion of volunteer efforts on behalf of the University in Stockton, and development of new clubs while strengthening existing ones are among the goals set by the Board.

The Board's Committee on Development established a goal of increased participation in the Annual Pacific Fund to 24 percent of all alumni, the national average of schools similar to UOP. The current level of participation is 20 percent. Expansion of the class agent program, increased telephone campaigns, refining of recognition groups, and greater emphasis on matching gift programs were included as means for reaching this goal.

The Public Relations Committee, chaired by Charlotte Filipelli '53, Carmichael, will work with the University's Public Relations Office in seeking greater recognition for the University in local media and assist alumni clubs in gaining visibility in their areas.

Stockton alumni and friends of the University are being mobilized in a new program called the "Orange Aides." Volunteers are working two days a week on campus in a wide range of activities. This includes serving as tour guides for visiting groups and doing research for the Alumni Office.

This group also is working closely with the Events Committee, which has assisted in staging Homecoming, Pacific Family Day, class reunions and various Admissions Office events.

Special efforts will be made during the year to establish two new alumni clubs; one in Sacramento and another in the East Bay area near Concord and Walnut Creek.

Several new programs also are being planned by the Continuing Education and Travel Committee of the Association under the leadership of Bob Black '73.

# Gridiron Legend Preserved

## Amos Alonzo Stagg

**D**EDICATION ceremonies for the newly established Amos Alonzo Stagg Memorial Room were held during Homecoming weekend.

The room, located in the gymnasium, houses memorabilia preserved by the Stagg family and presented to the University for display and safekeeping.

UOP athletes who played on Stagg teams in the 1930s and 1940s and other University alumni and friends contributed more than \$30,000 in cash and materials for the development of the memorial room.

In addition to serving as a museum, the room includes facilities for meetings and a small dining area.

Featured speakers at the dedication included Dr. Earl L. Klapstein '43, football team captain in 1941 and 1942, and Paul A. Stagg, Stagg's son who represented the family.

John B. Cechini '37, a retired Superior Court judge in Stockton, was chairman of the fund raising drive. Carl Isaacs was co-chairman.

Special recognition also was given to the late Bob Breeden '22, one of the originators of the memorial plan. He served as co-chairman until his death last year.
