Gauchos Hope To Stir Witches Brew Tonight

UCSB's Gauchos hope to turn into gruesome goblins on this Halloween night as they tangle with the Tigers from the University of the Pacific in a Pacific Coast Athletic Association game.

Coach Andy Everest's gridders, fired-up after their stunning 22-20 upset victory over previously unbeaten Hawaii last week, are 0-3 in conference play while Pacific comes in with a 1-2 PCAA mark after dropping a 48-7 decision to San Jose State last Saturday.

Coach Homer Smith of UOP, a Princetonian and former teammate of Heisman Trophy winner Dick Kazmaier, is in his first year at Pacific, but the Tiger grid boss is no stranger to UCSB's Andy Everest.

They are, as a matter of fact, quite close friends having served together on Jack Curtice's staff at Stanford in 1958 and 1959. Smith was Curtice's freshmen coach the first year "Cactus" Jack arrived in Palo Alto with Andy Everest, and the following season Homer was elevated to the varsity staff where he served as receiver coach.

Everest enjoyed the fruits of his first collegiate football win last week and his Gaucho gridders awarded him the game ball in an emotional aftermath which well set the stage for tonight's encounter with Pacific.

After six games of frustration and despair, UCSB managed to put it all together when it counted last Saturday — in the fourth quarter when the Gauchos overcame a 20-10 deficit and pulled out the victory with less than six minutes remaining in the game when fullback Steve Vermillion scored on a one-yard plunge.

Earlier in the quarter, wide receiver Mike Williams latched on to a 19 yard TD strike from QB Randy Palomino to put the Gauchos within striking distance at 20-16.

Although relishing the victory amidst their hour of triumph, UCSB settled down this past week to prepare for the Pacific clash which is expected to be one of the Gauchos' fiercest conference games.

UOP was upset last week by San Jose State, but nevertheless comes in as the favorite. The Tigers will be led into action by quarterback John Read, a talented signal caller who led the nation last week in forward passing and is considered one of the finest QB's in Pacific's history. He already holds five school passing records and is on the brink of setting two others.

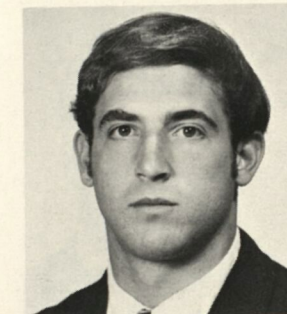
The Gauchos and Tigers renew a rivalry tonight which started in 1941 when UCSB eked out a 7-6 win. The two schools resumed play after World War II with Pacific rolling to victories in 1946-47-48.

The series was terminated until 1967 when the Gauchos stunned the Tigers with a 24-20 upset win in Stockton, but Pacific was quick to retaliate with a 27-21 win the next year and a 38-0 triumph last season.

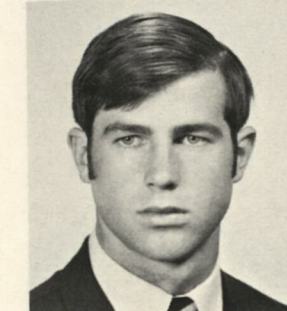

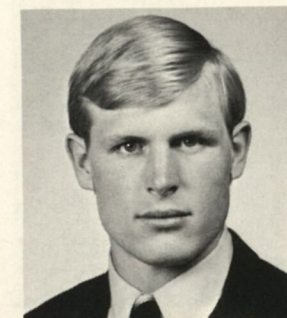
WILLIAMS' WRATH — Defensive back Wendell Williams arrests Hawaii's tailback Richard Thompson during action at Campus Field last week.

HEAD COACH HOMER SMITH



Homer Smith, who has been head football coach at Davidson College since 1965, was named Pacific's new gridiron pilot last spring.

Smith graduated cum laude in economics from Princeton University in 1954. While at Princeton he was recognized as an outstanding football player and received numerous awards, including the coveted "Ditwiler Prize" for "having done the most for the class of 1954." In the 1952 and 1953 seasons he received honorable mention All-American honors as a fullback.

Following graduation from Princeton, Smith served in the United States Army as an artillery officer and then enrolled at Stanford University's School of Business. He graduated in 1958 and immediately became the head freshman football coach and director of recruiting at Stanford.

In 1961, Smith became backfield assistant to Coach Ben Martin at the Air Force Academy. He continued there until 1965, when he was selected head coach at Davidson.

During his tenure at Davidson, Smith's teams have been nationally recognized for their explosive offense. The Wildcats led the Southern Conference in total offense and passing offense yardage in 1966, 1967, and 1968. Davidson's quarterbacks broke Southern Conference pass completion, passing yardage, and individual total offense records.

Smith's strategy in 1969 resulted in Davidson winning its first Southern Conference championship with an overall record of seven wins and only three losses, its best record since 1926.

Last year Smith was named coach of the year in NCAA District Three as well as in the Southern Conference.

Smith is the author of a book titled "Handbook for Coaching the Football Passing Game," to be published this summer by Parker Publishing Company.

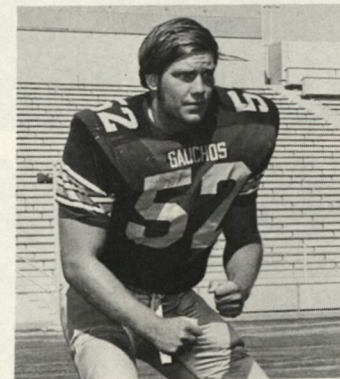
SCHADE, TIM 5-8 158 21 Jr.

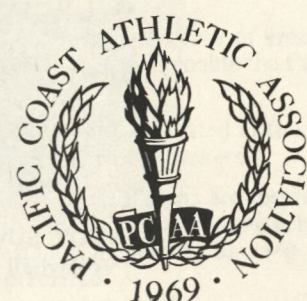


VAN DYCK, NEIL 6-2 216 19 Jr.

ISLA VISTA

(The following is a portion of a report on Isla Vista from Ray Varley, UCSB vice-chancellor for business and finance and coordinator of ongoing projects in I.V.)

I am happy to say that we have taken positive steps toward solving some of Isla Vista's many problems during the summer months, and I am sufficiently heartened by numerous developments in the community to think that a sort of "progress report" is due.

I want to emphasize that I am in no way assuming credit for these constructive measures. In most cases, the projects have arisen from within the community itself, although in many cases the University has assisted with the programs. Some are ongoing programs which have been revitalized, though many are new.

The most obvious result of the summer's efforts was the opening of the *Isla Vista Community Service Center* for a medical clinic, branch offices of the UCSB Counseling Center, Housing Office and Placement Office, as well as IVCC, People's Patrol, Switchboard, Associated Students, Isla Vista Community Affairs Board, Food Co-op, Family Counseling and Legal Defense.

Formed last spring, the *Isla Vista Community Council* is the first attempt at I.V. home government. In its weekly meetings, it tries to resolve community issues, and its representatives work with county and campus officials toward that end.

The *Isla Vista Economic Commission*, an agency of IVCC, has conducted studies on the economics and facts of I.V.'s housing situation and the feasibility of local self-government for the community.

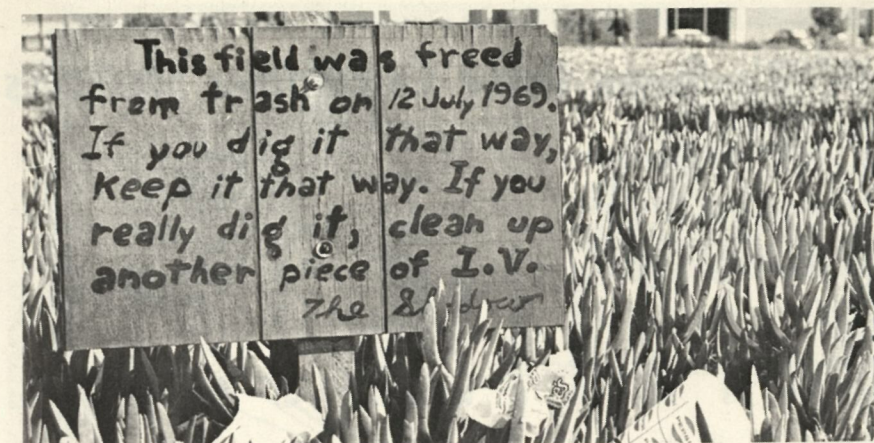
A part of the Associated Students I.V. efforts, the *Isla Vista Community Affairs Board* directs, coordinates and aids a variety of programs there, while the *Campus-Community Alliance* is a neutral body which maintains communication between the campus and the broader community.

The *UCSB Alumni Association* donated \$1,000 for use in Isla Vista, half of the sum going to IVCC and the remainder to the Service Center. During the summer months, the *Affiliates* and students have met over coffee and dessert, as a prelude to the booth the organization currently operates in the University Center.

Joint Isla Vista Effort (*JIVE*) is a student-directed organization primarily concerned with physical improvements in Isla Vista. It also sponsors beautification efforts, including Plant Isla Vista Over With Trees (*PIVOT*).

The campus Housing Office attempts to acquaint students with its involvement in I.V. housing matters, and will continue its mediation board to arbitrate minor housing disagreements.

Perfect Park, a cooperative effort of the Associated Students, the recreation department and the administration, may not be available



for continued use as a park. These problems are under discussion in the hope that this site or other parks can be put under the ownership of Isla Vista.

Direct university involvement in attempting to improve the quality of life in Isla Vista is a reality, from the Regental level to the local campus level.

For example, the Regents of the University have made \$84,000 available to UCSB for Isla Vista projects and/or personnel to work on I.V. matters, and they also funded a recently issued comprehensive study of Isla Vista and UCSB.

A University request to the county has resulted in architectural review of all buildings proposed for construction in Isla Vista, and we also are reviewing each request to county or state officials for variances, zoning changes, permits and so forth.

Private citizens and agencies in the greater Santa Barbara community have demonstrated their eagerness to join us in our efforts. In cooperation with the Metropolitan Transit District, we have arranged for an express commuter service between Santa Barbara and UCSB during morning and evening rush hours to reduce the flow of automobile traffic on the campus.

The Santa Barbara Citizens Commission on Civil Disorders also labored throughout the summer, hearing testimony from students, faculty members and others, in an attempt to sort out the facts about last year's turmoil.

My office will continue to be the center of UCSB oriented projects in Isla Vista. I have a full time staff assistant who works solely on I.V. matters, and a student intern worked with us this summer to determine how UCSB can participate with students and other I.V. residents on ecological projects.

I hope you get the impression that the onrush of constructive action in Isla Vista is overwhelming, because it is. We have not yet solved every grievance, every dispute, every problem; but we have overcome the major one — indifference.

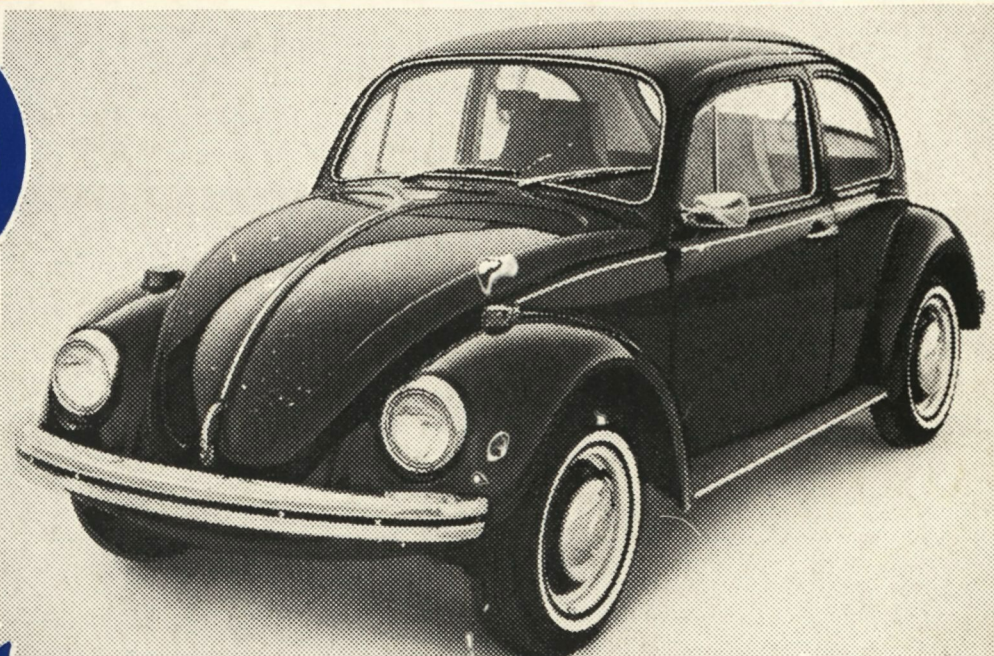
