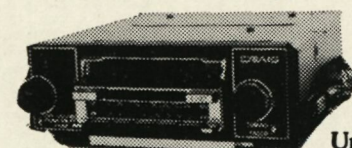

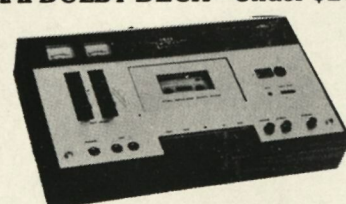

California State University, Long Beach is part of the 19-campus public higher education system known as the California State University and Colleges. The University was founded in 1949 on a 320-acre site donated by the City of Long Beach.

The University began instruction in a small apartment house with 160 students and 13 faculty members. This was an austere beginning for an institution that was to experience growth greater and more startling than any college or university in the entire history of the United States.

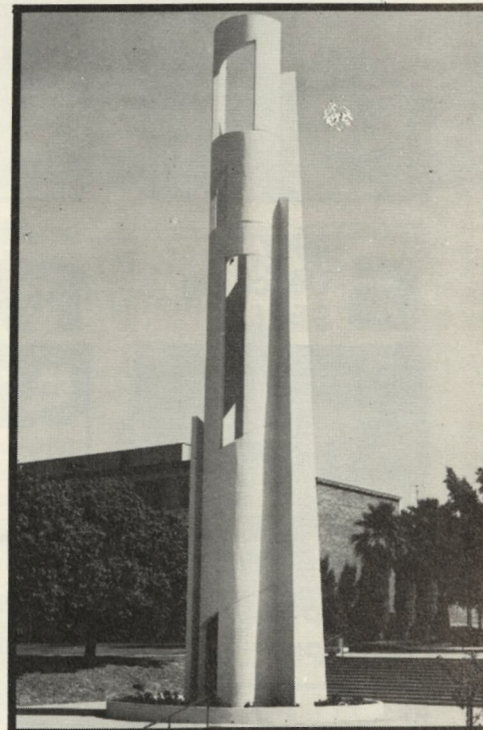
Today, CSULB has a faculty of over 1,500 and a student body of more than 31,000, making it the largest university in the state and one of the largest in the

The student body is comprised of individuals mainly from California, but there are representatives from every state in the Union and 82 foreign nations. 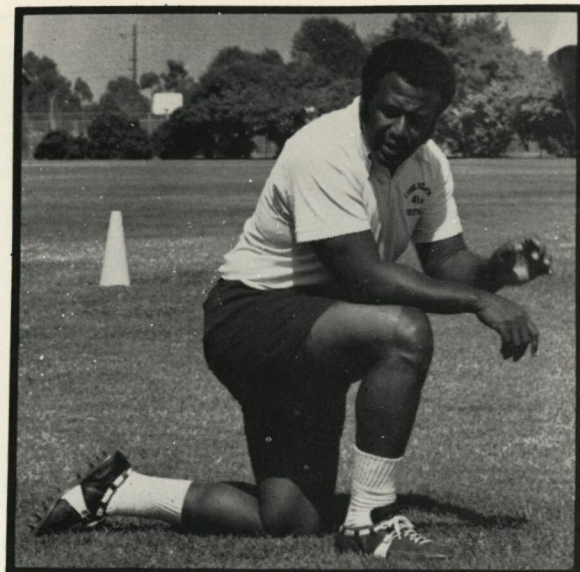

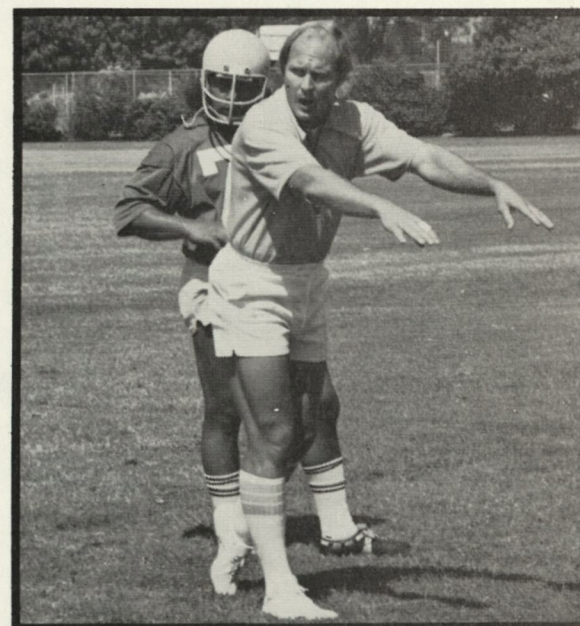

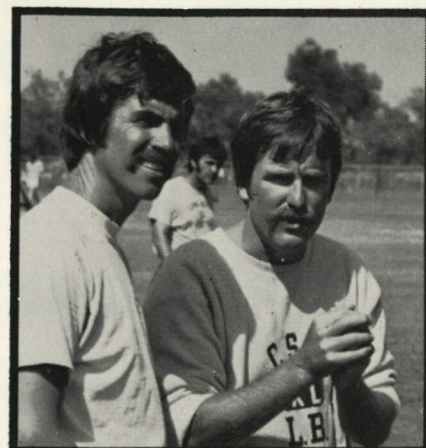

49er head coach Wayne Howard guided Long Beach State last year, the Year of the Comeback, to a winning 6-5 record. It was the first time since the 1971 campaign that the 49ers had posted a winning mark.

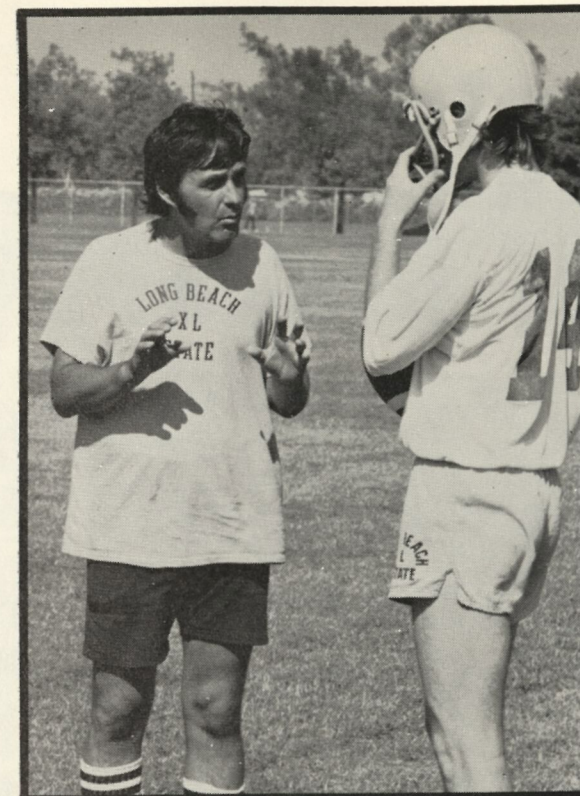
Winning has become a way of life for Howard and his teams. He took a losing U.C. Riverside program and posted a 9-1 mark in 1972 and an 8-2 record in 1973. Before Howard showed up at Riverside the Highlanders had suffered through three consecutive losing seasons and had experienced only four winning records since 1955.

Before going to Riverside, Howard spent six years as head coach at Gavilan Junior College in Gilroy, Calif. Gavilan had a combined record of 2-24-1 for its short three-year history, but Howard turned the program around and posted a six-year mark of 37-18. His 1968 team went 8-1 and the 1970 squad was 9-0.

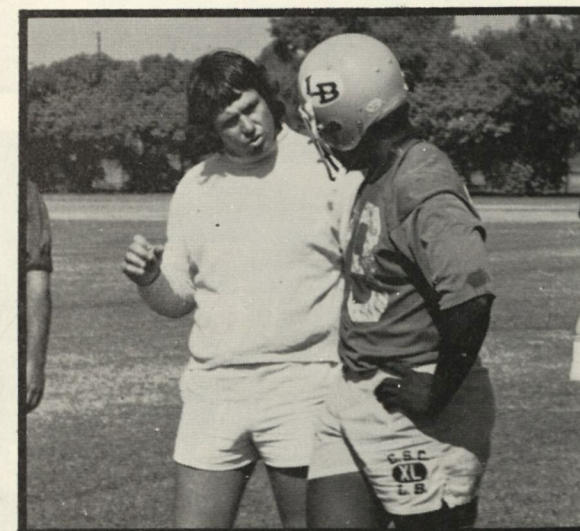
The 44-year-old head coach has a 16-year career record of 110-45-3. He has had a losing team only twice.

Howard graduated from the University of Redlands in 1957 and received his Master's from San Jose State University in 1965. His athletic career started in Long Beach at Jordan High, where he played football and baseball. He later transferred to Chaffey High in Ontario. Howard also played baseball and football at Redlands.

Howard will have an outstanding staff of assistants once again this fall. The 49er defense will be coached by Tom Gadd (defensive ends), John Pease (linebackers), Wayne Hogue (secondary) and Sam Moore (linemen). The offense will be directed by Mike Davis (running backs), Ron McBride (linemen), and Gary Lumpkin (receivers). Howard himself will work with the quarterbacks.

49ers Return Home with Two Road Wins

The 49ers of Long Beach State University return home tonight to host fellow PCAA member the University of Pacific. This will be Pacific's 1975 conference opener, while the 49ers are 1-0 in the PCAA thanks to last week's 32-6 win over Cal State Fullerton.

The 49ers are 2-1 on the year after two straight road wins over Northern Illinois (24-7) and Fullerton. Long Beach dropped its home and season opener three weeks ago to Southwestern Louisiana, 22-17, before 10,482 fans at Veteran's Stadium.

Pacific is 1-1-1 on the year. The Tigers tied Northeast Louisiana, 3-3, in the year's opener, then whacked U.C. Davis 31-13 before being handled last weekend by the University of Arizona, 16-0.

Head coach Wayne Howard and his staff have placed the PCAA title as one of the team's top priorities for the 1975 season. The 49ers now play three of their next four games against conference foes. After traveling to Southern Illinois next Saturday, the 49ers return home to host San Jose State (Oct. 11) and Fresno State (Oct. 18). The final conference game for the 49ers is the season's finale November 22 against San Diego State at the San Diego Stadium.

Long Beach will be looking for its first win over UOP since a 15-14 victory in 1971. Pacific leads the series, 6-4. Last year the 49ers dropped a 38-6 decision to the Tigers up at Stockton.

The 49er offense is now averaging 381.3 yards per game, 204.7 yards per game rushing and 176.7 per game passing. Three weeks ago the 49ers attempted a whopping total of 44 passes, but in the last two contests Coach Howard's offense has turned to an effective running game to post the two wins.

"We still need to get our running game some more consistency," noted Howard, who is now 8-6 as head coach of the 49ers. "Herb Lusk (130 yards) ran well against Fullerton, as did Mark Bailey, Kise Fiatoa and Johnny Washington."

Lusk has now moved into the top ten among career rushing leaders for the 49ers with 792 yards in 14 games. Lusk had 546 yards last year to rank second on the squad.

Long Beach State will probably seek to sustain a better balance between the pass and the rush on offense against Pacific.

"In the opener, Southwestern Louisiana gave us the pass, so we threw the ball 44 times," said Howard. "Northern Illinois' defense allowed us to run, as did Fullerton's, so our running game showed up. We'll have to wait and see what UOP will allow us to do."

Defensively, the 49ers have not allowed a touchdown since Northern Illinois scored on a 24-yard pass play in the first quarter. The 49ers defensively have not allowed a TD in seven quarters. Fullerton was able to score only on two field goals and gain a total of 213 yards in total offense last Saturday afternoon.

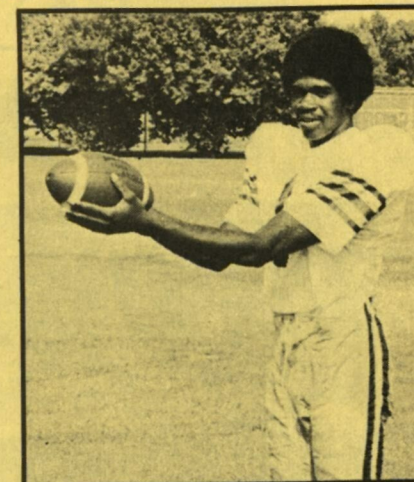
Sophomore tackle Jeff Lyall led the Long Beach defense with 15 assisted tackles and three quarterback sacks in the Fullerton game. Junior linebacker Sam Tagaloa was again outstanding with four unassisted stops and 10 assists. The transfer from Fullerton JC is quickly gaining as one of the best linebackers on the West Coast. Tagaloa is the leading Long Beach tackler with

nine unassisted tackles and 28 assists in the three games.

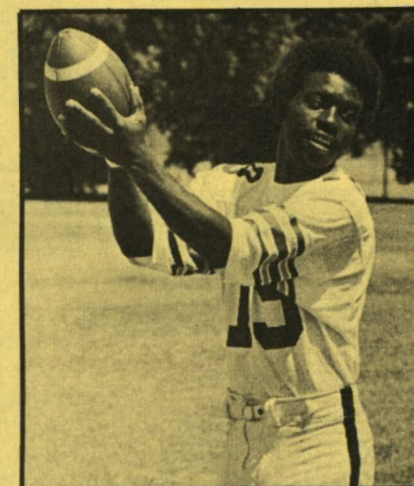
Defensive ends Gary Balch and Willie Guillory came up with interceptions against Fullerton. Balch now has two on the year, as does free safety Mark Pap. Linebacker Sal Flores owns the other 49er theft.

On the other side of the coin, the opposition has not been able to get an interception in the last two games. Southwestern Louisiana picked off six 49er passes in the opener, but quarterbacks Joe Paopao and Lloyd Michaelson have not thrown an interception since.

Receivers Mike Willis and Stanford Brewer are two of the best in college football. Willis was seventh in the nation in receiving going into last weekend's game.

Tigers Eager to Run on the Beach

A powerful running attack has been the earmark of Coach Chester Caddas' Pacific Tigers for the last three years. Each one of those seasons has been a winning one for UOP, and Caddas' forces have depended on their ground game again this year in recording a 1-1-1 mark for their first three contests.

After a season-opening tie with Northeast Louisiana, the Tigers romped over defending Far Western Conference champion UC Davis, 31-13. The UOP defense scored twice against Davis when John Peacock ran in a blocked punt for a touchdown and Jack Cummings returned an intercepted pass 37 yards to score. Quarterback John Ertman ran for two touchdowns and fullback Bob Ferraro rambled for 108 yards on 14 carries.

The Tigers ran into the powerful University of Arizona Wildcats last week, and were shutout, 16-0. The first three games were against non-conference opponents, and tonight's battle against the 49ers will be the Tigers' PCAA opener.

In attempting to continue the outstanding rushing tradition that has produced a 1,000 yard gainer in each of the last three seasons (Mitchell True in 1972, Willard Harrell in 1973 and 1974), Caddas has considerable talent available to him.

"While replacing a player of Harrell's caliber is no easy chore," Caddas says, "We do feel we have three talented candidates for his job in Oresar Brown, Dale Williams and Darwin Benjamin. And, I think the fullback position is in the best shape it's ever been with Bruce Gibson and Bob Ferraro."

Caddas' evaluation of Gibson and Ferraro was evident in the first two games. With 174 yards rushing each, the two fullbacks accounted for 384 of the Tigers' 581 yards on the ground. Quarterback John Ertman had 145 yards, while Brown had 72.

The success of the running game is largely dependent on the offensive line, and UOP has two outstanding performers blocking for their runners in guards Morrison England and Mel Visger. England, who was a first-team all-PCAA selection at tackle last year, is described by 49er coach Wayne Howard as "the best offensive tackle we faced all last year. He is very strong and fast for his size and is a good pro prospect." Visger also earned first-team all-PCAA honors last year.

The Tigers also have a fine place-kicker in junior John Rodriguez. He has connected on 12 of 23 field goal attempts and 46 of 53 PATs in his career at UOP. He has kicked two field goals this year, both from 32 yards.

Caddas has been pleased with a defensive unit that blocked two punts and picked off four enemy aerials in the first two games. Vernie Kelley has two interceptions, and Rudy Viney and James Cummings one each.

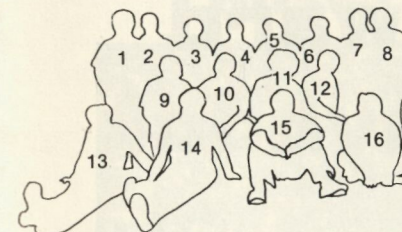
The Tigers have won six of ten games against the 49ers. The last Long Beach win was in 1971. Harrell led a 38-6 Tiger romp last year. He scored four touchdowns as the Tigers rolled up 495 total yards. Harrell, now a Green Bay Packer, finished his career at UOP with 3324 yards rushing, a figure that places him in the number ten spot on the list of NCAA top career rushers.

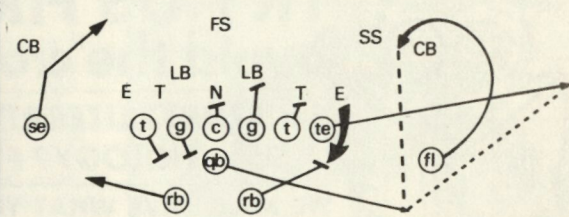
COUNTER [STRONGSIDE]: The counter is a miss-direction play. The quarterback fakes the football to the fullback going off tackle on one side. The quarterback then gives the ball to the tailback coming back to the other side off guard.



BELLY [STRONGSIDE]: The quarterback takes the snap from center and moves down the line. He now has two options: he can either give it to the fullback off tackle, or he can keep the football and continue down the line. If the quarterback keeps the ball, he then has two additional options. He can pitch the ball to the trailing tailback, or he can keep the ball. The key to this play is the ability of the quarterback to make the right decision: give the ball to the fullback or pitch it to the tailback or keep it himself.



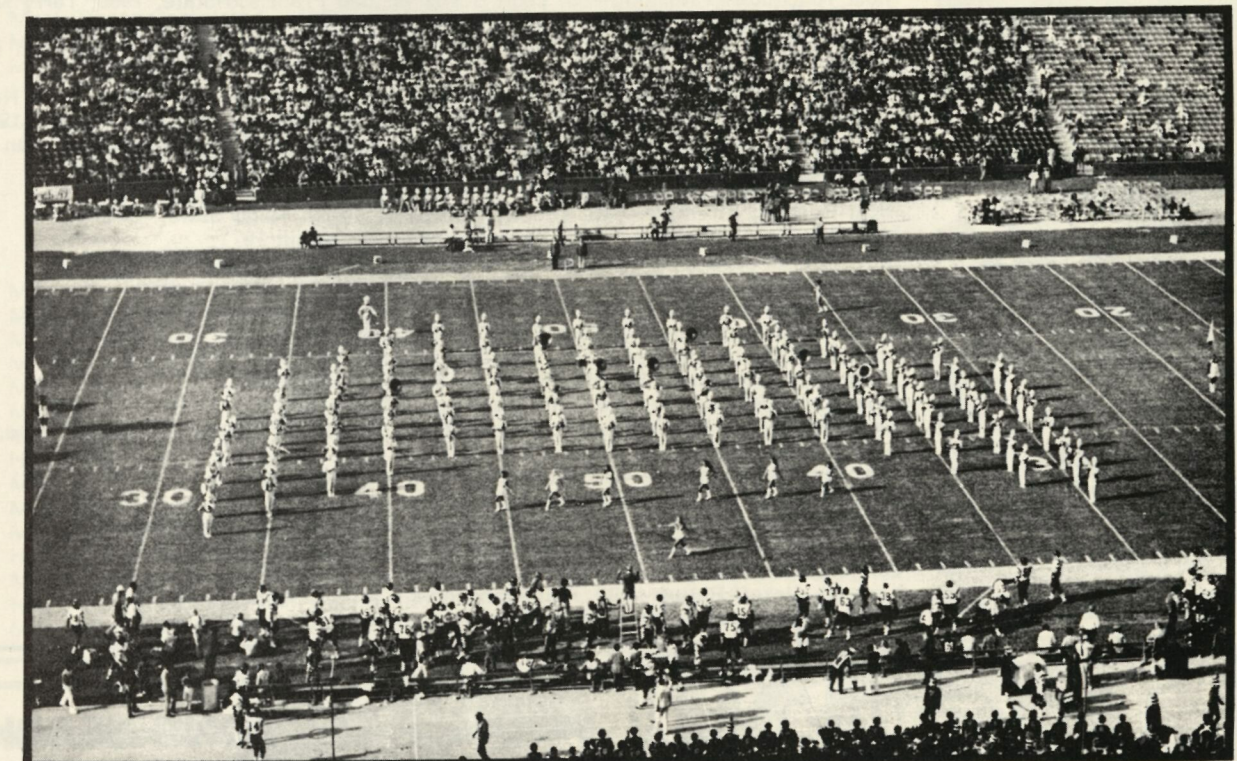
SWEEP [STRONGSIDE]: The 49er sweep is a basic power sweep. The quarterback must pitch the football deep to the tailback going wide and outside. The tailback then looks for the open hole and runs, and runs... The offensive guard on the strong side must be able to pull quickly and help the play around the end.



30 PRO 80 PASS B FLAT: This play is the basic sprint pass-run option. The fullback blocks the defensive end, preferably knocking him to the ground. The quarterback goes behind the block and looks for the flanker or the tight end. He can also run if the receivers are covered.
