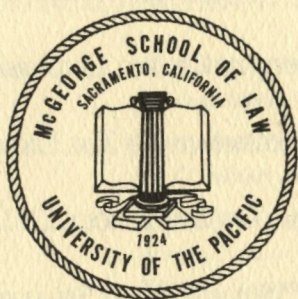

MALCOLM M. LUCAS

Dedicated public servant, able practitioner, capable trial court judge and committed appellate court justice, your 35-year career in the law has brought honor to your family, your native State of California and all of the courts that you have served. Since your initial appointment to the bench, to the Los Angeles Superior Court by then-Governor Ronald Reagan in 1967, you have served the administration of justice with industry and distinction.

The great-grandson of a two-term Governor of Ohio who also served as the first territorial Governor of Iowa and the brother of a California Court of Appeal Justice, you distinguished yourself early in your career by earning the Bachelor of Arts Degree in History cum laude from the University of Southern California, where you also earned your Juris Doctor Degree and served on the University of Southern California Law Review. Your commitment to education has been unflinching. You served for eight years on the Board of the Los Alamitos School District and as its President during 1964-65. Since coming to northern California, you have presided over the Board of the University of California, Hastings College of the Law.

Your career on the bench has been exemplary and illustrious. Having distinguished yourself as the Supervising Judge of the Criminal Division of the Los Angeles trial court, you were nominated by President Richard Nixon and confirmed by the Congress as a Judge of the United States District Court for the Central District of California in 1971. In 1984, you resigned your lifetime seat on the federal bench to accept Governor George Deukmejian's appointment to the California Supreme Court, an appointment that was confirmed by the State's electorate in 1986. During February of 1987, you took the oath of office to preside over the highest court in this great State.

On the bench, you have earned a reputation for moderation, for fairness, and for tough-mindedness with offenders and protection of citizens' rights, as well as for judicial restraint. Yet you have not faltered when faced with the need to espouse difficult or controversial positions. Your willingness to author the dissent, which in your own words, "may lay the foundation stone for a future majority opinion," has demonstrated courage in the face of adversity.

Off of the bench, you have lived a public life that serves as a fitting paradigm for these younger colleagues in the law who sit before you today. From your service to the United States Navy during World War II to your commitment to education to your dedication to the improvement of the administration of justice, your career presents us with a remarkable biography of energetic endeavor and success. We who benefit from your wisdom and your industry wish you continued success and Godspeed in your future.

It is therefore my distinct pleasure, by virtue of the authority vested in me and by vote of the faculty and the Board of Regents, to confer upon you the degree Doctor of Laws.

The University of the Pacific's McGeorge School of Law has realized great gain by virtue of your twelve years of association.

After having earned your baccalaureate degree from the University of Chicago, you distinguished yourself while earning your Bachelor of Laws degree from Indiana University by serving on the Board of Editors of the Indiana Law Review and by being elected to the Order of the Coif. You have gained admission to the bars of the jurisdictions of Indiana, Illinois, Washington and New York, having practiced in each.

Between faculty positions, you engaged in the active practice of law, first in Seattle and later as a Partner in the distinguished New York law firm of Kaye, Scholer, Fierman, Hays and Handler. In that capacity, you became one of the principal architects of the development of collective bargaining in higher education.

In the public sector, first as a consultant to a member of the California State Legislature and later as a member of New York Governor Hugh Carey's cabinet, you pioneered systems for public sector collective bargaining and refined techniques for dispute settlement.

During your later career, you have served as a recognized "senior statesman" of the law, acting as an arbitrator espousing a neutral position much respected in industries that have included food processing, transportation, retail sales, communications and public conveyances.

Of particular note, you have brought wisdom from all of these areas of expertise to the classrooms of the McGeorge School of Law. Our students have profited immeasurably from your mentorship.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC REGALIA

Distinctive academic dress can be traced back to the universities of the Middle Ages. In the early centuries of its existence, the costume was worn as daily garb, and the several parts each had its practical use. In more recent centuries its use in complete form has been reserved for special, ceremonial occasions.

European universities tend to display considerable variation in their academic regalia. In the United States, however, a standard pattern was adopted over a half-century ago to which virtually all American colleges and universities adhere. This governs the material, style, color and trimmings of the gown and hood, the style of the cap, and the color of the tassel.

The field of learning in which the degree was awarded is shown by the color on the edging of the hood, and in some cases by the color of the facing and crossbars on the doctors' gowns. Some of the more frequently seen colors are: white (Arts and Letters), pink (Music), dark blue (Philosophy), light blue (Education), scarlet (Divinity), golden yellow (Science), lilac (Dentistry), olive green (Pharmacy), and purple (Law).

Graduates or candidates for the Juris Doctor Degree who are elected to The Order of the Coif wear, as part of their academic regalia, the traditional white coif attached to their mortarboard.
