PACIFIC MEMORIAL STADIUM



Home Of The Tigers

The Stadium

Pacific Memorial Stadium, a 30,000-seat, earth-fill structure was dedicated on October 21, 1950 when the Pacific football team entertained Loyola. Built on land donated in part by the legendary Amos Alonzo Stagg, it is one of the largest on-campus facilities in the Big West Conference. The stadium was funded originally by a two-month drive in the spring of 1950 which raised \$165,000. Initially having a capacity of 35,975 with room for expansion to over 44,000, the stadium has undergone several structural changes that have reduced the seating to its current level.

Ticket Offices

The University Box Office, located near Long Theater on campus, is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday–Friday, and from 12 noon to 5:30 p.m. on game Saturdays. The ticket booth southwest of the stadium on Pershing Avenue is open two hours before kickoff on game days. The Spanos Center ticket booth is the site of Will Call. Ticket Office phone number is 946-2474.

Lost and Found

Lost and found items should be given to a stadium usher or brought to the pressbox on the West side of the stadium. During the week, check with UOP security. Lost children should be brought to the pressbox on the West side of the stadium.

Public Address System

All announcements must be approved by the Marketing and Promotions Director. No special announcements will be made except in case of gravest emergency. Any other announcements should be cleared with the sports information office (946-2715) the week prior to the game. Those expecting emergency calls should leave word with the Sports Information Director or at the pressbox during the game.

Rest Rooms/Concession Stands

Rest rooms and concession stands are located on the rim of the stadium behind sections O, H and ZZ.

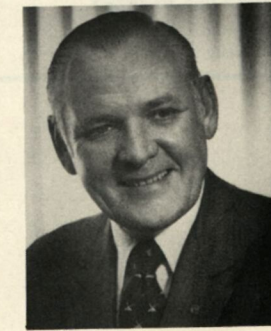

Academic Excellence Remains Pacific's Hallmark



Founded in 1851 as the first chartered university in California, University of the Pacific continues to enjoy its reputation as one of the finest academic institutions in the West.

The only private school in the Big West Conference, Pacific offers a diversity of programs that would normally be associated with a much larger university than the 6,000 students attending classes at the main campus in Stockton and in Sacramento and San Francisco.

Pacific is now comprised of 11 schools and colleges, including a dental school in San Francisco and the McGeorge School of Law in Sacramento. The main campus features the central liberal arts division, College of the Pacific, and schools of music, engineering, education, pharmacy, business and public administration, international studies, a graduate school and University College, designed specifically for adult re-entry students.

Throughout the university the emphasis is on teaching, although research is recognized as having a need in the various disciplines.

The students at the university are represented on nearly all decision-making committees and the Associated Students (ASUOP) play an active role in campus life through social and cultural programs for the community. The Stockton metropolitan area, with a population of more than 200,000, is also the scene of many programs that take students off campus in a multitude of community involvement and work experience activities.

Stockton, known for its inland deep-water port, is located in the Central Valley of California, 75 miles east of San Francisco and 50 south of Sacramento. It is within easy driving distance of Lake Tahoe, the scenic national parks of the Sierra Nevada, the picturesque wine country of Napa and Sonoma Valleys and the Bay Area.

The President Dr. Bill Atchley

Dr. Bill Atchley became the 22nd president in the 36-year history of University of the Pacific on July 1, 1987. Known as a down-to-earth, plain-spoken individualist, Atchley comes to Pacific with an impressive background in collegiate education and university administration, particularly in the areas of practical science and technology.

Dr. Atchley was most recently the president of Clemson University, where he served as that distinguished Southern university's leader from 1979 until 1985. While at Clemson, he provided the leadership for several academic and research projects. During his reign the university raised over \$18.3 million in private funds for academic programs and boosted the assets of the Clemson Foundation from \$3.4 million to \$10.3 million during one of the nation's worst recessions.

A former pitcher in the New York Giants baseball organization who attended college on an athletic scholarship, Atchley boasts a superior knowledge of athletics and values the concept of the true student-athlete. He was the only college president to serve on the prestigious U.S. International Sports Committee.

While at Clemson, he helped spearhead the drive for a 15,000 seat upper deck addition to the football stadium.

Since 1985 he has also served as president and CEO of the National Science Center for Communications and Electronics Foundation, Inc. He boasts over 22 years of experience as a professor and a dean in engineering at Clemson and at the University of Missouri at Rolla. He was the Dean of the College of Engineering at Clemson for four years before being

Atchley earned his Bachelor of Science degree (1957) and his Master of Science (1959) in civil engineering from Missouri-Rolla, then went on to earn his Doctorate at Texas A & M in 1965. Atchley and his wife Pat have three children.

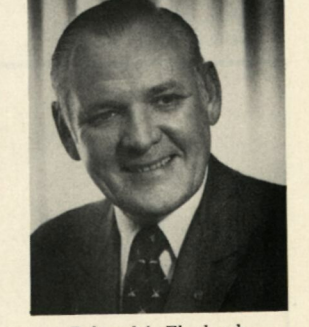

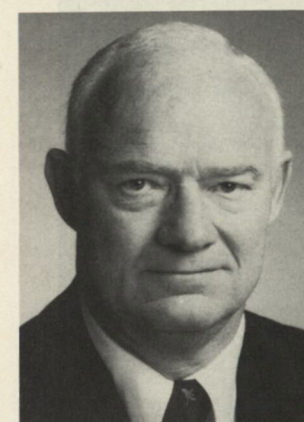

Interim Athletic Director DR. TOM STUBBS



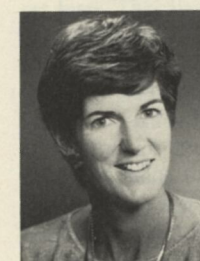
Dr. Tom Stubbs, Associate Athletic Director, was named University of the Pacific's Interim Athletic Director August 24 following the resignation of Dr. Carl Miller.

Stubbs, who served in the same capacity for ten months before the hiring of Miller in 1984, also serves as the Chairman for the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Department. He came to Pacific in 1963 as head baseball and assistant football coach. Stubbs was promoted to assistant athletic director in 1968 while retaining the head baseball coaching position, compiling a 410-384-3 record in 18 years. In 1981, Stubbs was promoted to associate athletic director.

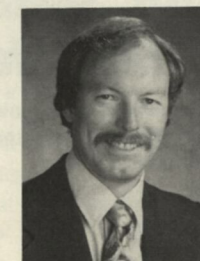
Stubbs, 54, earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Ripon (Wis.) College in 1956 and his master's from Ohio State University in 1957. He received his Ed.D. degree from the University of Arkansas in 1978.

Over his 24 years at Pacific, Stubbs has served on numerous committees affiliated with both the university and the conference. He is also a Board of Directors member of the Stockton Hall of Fame. Stubbs and his wife Margie live in

THE TIGER COACHES

Head Coach BOB COPE



Bob Cope begins his sixth season at the helm of the Pacific football program, confident that the Tigers can win the conference title.

In his five seasons at Pacific, he has laid a strong foundation that has enabled the Tigers to compete head-to-head with the best in the Big West Conference. But also has set a standard of academic excellence in the program that stands as a benchmark for football programs on the West Coast.

Cope, 51, spent four years in the early 1970's (1972-75) as an assistant coach at Pacific under Chester Caddas. During his tenure under Caddas, the Tigers compiled a 26-16-2 record. After five years as the head coach he remains familiar with the university's role in the community and it being the only private institution in the conference.

In the past five years, 22 individual and six team records have been rewritten. Six of the top 10 individual passing games at Pacific have taken place since Cope has taken over, in fact the second most yards ever thrown for by a Tiger team took place against Cal State Fullerton in 1984 (446). But the next year saw the Tigers go to the wishbone attack and then the rushing records fell. In 1986, the Tigers finished seventh in the nation in rushing after being ranked as high as third during the year, and finished 17th in total offense. In scoring, Pacific tallied more points in 1985 and 1986 than any Tiger team since the 1950-51 seasons.

Cope's teams also show discipline, as his 1987 team led the nation in fewest penalty yards (321) and ranked fifth nationally in turnover margin with a +1.55 per game. They have also gained national respect, with wins over Minnesota, Oregon and Hawaii. And competitive games with Arizona State and Washington State last season. Within the conference, the Tigers have knocked off Fresno State, San Jose State, Utah State and UNLV, a feat that had not been accomplished in eight years.

A 1961 graduate of Carson Newman College, where he was a small college All-American, Cope was the defensive coordinator at Purdue in 1982 before coming to Pacific. He spent the 1981 season as the defensive coordinator at Mississippi after tutoring the secondary for three seasons and serving as defensive coordinator for one season at Arkansas under Lou Holtz. While with the Razorbacks, Cope's teams put together a 37-10-2 record and went to four bowl games, including the 1977 Orange Bowl, where the Razorbacks upset Oklahoma to cap an 11-1 year.

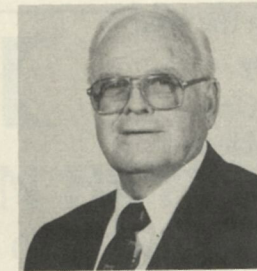
Between his four year stints at Arkansas and Pacific, Cope was the defensive line coach at SMU, under now Indianapolis Head Coach Ron Meyer. He started his collegiate coaching at Vanderbilt in 1964 where he spent eight years, and prior to that spent three years as a high school coach.

He is a native of Chattanooga, Tennessee and received his master's degree from George Peabody College in Nashville in 1965. He and his wife Jimmie Ruth have a 15 year old daughter, Susan Kimberly.

TODAY'S GAME

The University of the Pacific Tigers take a break from Big West Conference play this weekend when they host the Sacramento State Hornets, a team they have had relative ease with in the previous five meetings.

The Tigers fell to 1-6 overall and 1-3 in conference play last weekend when they were defeated by San Jose State 35-17, despite leading the Spartans 14-7 at halftime. The Hornets are 5-1 overall and 2-1 in the Western Football Conference and defeated Santa Clara last weekend by a 28-14 score.

A positive note is that the Tigers have never lost to the Hornets, and more importantly, have never allowed them to come any closer than 21 points, that being in 1974 when Pacific shutout Sac State 21-0. UOP also shut out the Hornets 22-0 in 1973 and has coasted to 31-7 victories the past two seasons. In 1985, Pacific defeated Sac State 49-17. All of the games between these two schools have been played in Stockton.

But, the Hornets may have their best team in recent years. Since the 1982 and 1983 seasons, when they finished 8-3, the Hornets have been on a downslide, but this year's 31-28 victory over perennial Division II powerhouse University of California-Davis at Davis proved they are on the rebound.

Meanwhile, Pacific is looking for its second victory of the season before returning to Big West play next weekend. This game also finishes a three-game homestand for the Tigers, who depart for Utah State and Fresno State before returning home to wrap up the season against New Mexico State.

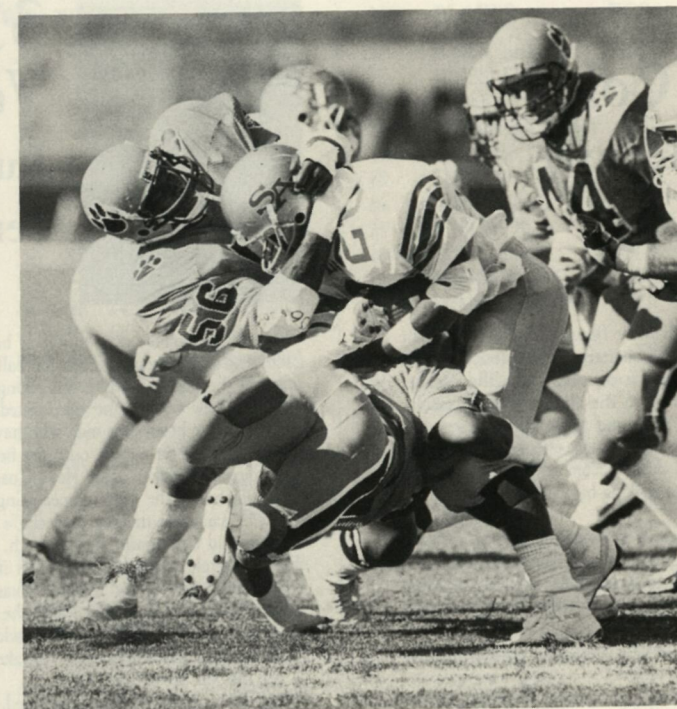
Leading the way offensively for the Tigers is fullback Jon Grim. Grim, a 5-10, 200-pounder from Salinas, is the team's second leading rusher with 179 yards. Also providing some punch on the ground is 6-2, 195 senior Vernon Hadnot. Hadnot has rushed 38 times for 109 yards this season, with a majority of those yards coming in the last three games.

Via the air, senior quarterback Jason Frost has completed 46 of 100 passes for 493 yards. He completed his first touchdown pass of the season last weekend when he connected with Doug Tackett on a 14-yard scoring strike. Frost has also ran the ball effectively, although he only has 24 yards for the season.

For the Hornets, it is two-time All American and First Team All-WFC running back Donald Hair. Hair, a 5-8, 180-pound senior from Sacramento, leads the Hornets' ground attack with 466 yards on 99 carries. He averages 4.7 yards per carry and has scored five touchdowns rushing. In addition to Hair, the Hornets also possess a threat in junior fullback Ed Bueno, who has carried the ball 59 times for 316 yards.

The Hornets have a balanced attack and have quality receivers in Mark Young and Ron Weaver. Young, a senior wide end, has caught 19 balls for 341 yards and a whopping six touchdowns, averaging a touchdown in every three receptions. Weaver has caught 27 passes for 436 yards.

Throwing the ball to the receiving corps will be senior Tony Trosin,

who played tight end last season after losing a three-way battle for the quarterback spot. Trosin has proved his worth this season as the signal-caller by completing 40 of 62 passes for 534 yards and four touchdowns.

The key matchup today will be the Sacramento State offense, with Hair and Bueno rushing and Trosin passing versus the defensive line of the Tigers, which has played extremely well the entire season. Bolstering the defensive line for Pacific are junior ends Dan Hampton and Kendrick Brown. Last week, Brown blocked a punt and caused a fumble, both of which led to Pacific touchdowns, in addition to making 11 tackles, seven solos, and adding to his team-leading sack total of 7.5.

Hampton has kept up with Brown, trailing by only one sack, and recovered his third fumble last weekend. He had ten solo tackles and three assisted ones against the Spartans and also recorded a tackle-for loss.

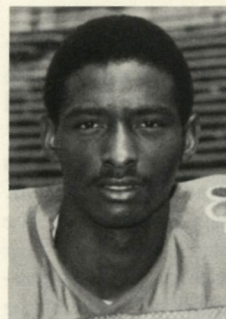
Today's game is the final non-conference game for the Tigers as they return to Big West action next weekend. It is also the second to last home game, with the next being three weeks away. The Tigers have a streak to continue, but this year may be the toughest game ever against the Hornets.

There is no play that is more exciting in football than the Bomb. There is an element about it unlike any other play—the anticipation as the quarterback drops back deep in the pocket; the excitement of the receiver outrunning his defender down the sideline; the magic of the ball spiraling perfectly fifty plus yards in the air; and the spectacular culmination as the receiver tucks the ball into his chest and glides into the endzone. At Pacific, that majestic play is being reborn, as the Tiger passing offense has improved enough to make the Bomb a major offensive threat. A key factor in the reintroduction of the long ball is a man who is quite accustomed to making big catches: wide receiver Troy Cole.

Cole began his athletic career at Monterey High School in Monterey. He was a three-sport letterwinner, playing football, basketball and track. His all-around talent led him to honors in all three sports. In basketball, he was all-tournament for two championship basketball teams; in track, he landed on the third team of the All-State high jumper list; and in football, he was an All-Monterey League quarterback. In 1984, Cole was awarded the California Association of Compensatory Education Positive Image Award for his achievements at the high school level.

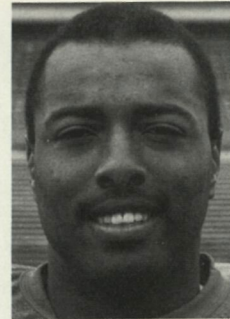
Cole's ability guided him to be awarded a scholarship at Oregon. However, after a brief stint in Oregon, he decided to transfer to Monterey Junior College. At Monterey JC, he saw plenty of action in his team's pass-oriented attack. In two years, he caught 330 passes for 1,026 yards and 12 touchdowns. While compiling those statistics, he was named the league's Player of the Week twice and earned honorable mention accolades in the All-Coast Conference.

When Cole arrived at Pacific in 1986, he soon learned that he would have to make some quick adjustments. Pacific ran a strong wishbone attack then, which was quite different from the passing-style game that he was used to at Monterey JC. "I came from a passing offense," Cole stated. "That was all I wanted to do. But at Pacific, I have learned a lot of things that have made me a better receiver. I have become a student of the game."

After seeing limited time in 1986 and redshirting in 1987, Cole came into this season with high hopes of making a mark in Pacific's new, more pass-oriented offense. "Cole has become a deep-ball receiver now that we are beginning to throw the ball better," Head Coach Bob Cope stated. "He will make a big contribution to our offense."

Thus far, 1988 has been particularly sweet for Cole, who has had to make it through some rough weather to see the sunlight. "It's been a long, tough road," Cole admitted. "After all of the hard work and sacrifice, it is quite a relief to succeed." Succeed is exactly what he has done so far this year. He is Pacific's leading receiver with a 22.4 yard average per catch. In total, he has caught eight passes for 179 yards and a touchdown. The definite highlight for Cole was his touchdown grab, a 77-yard bomb from now-injured quarterback Ron Beverly against Cal State Fullerton. "It was neat to get out in the open and make the catch," he stated. "But I expect to make the big play; it is my role."

With the recent season-ending injury to Pacific's top running back Anthony Williams, Cole may find himself playing his role more often in the future. "There still is a bevy of talent in the backfield," he points out. "But we're going to have to be less conservative and go more to the pass. When we do and the spotlight is on me, I've got to do it." When he's the one on the receiving end of the Bomb, he'll look sharp in the spotlight—if the spotlight can keep up with him.

From in the middle of a huddle of bulky men, a loud voice boomed. The voice was addressing a large group of Tiger football players who were preparing for one of its biggest games of the year. The voice was strong and authoritative. "I have liked what I've seen in the past few weeks," the voice stated. "We've had some players go out with injuries, but there have been some men who have come off of the bench and have accepted the challenge. They have come onto the field wanting to play and have played very well." The voice belonged to Tiger Head Coach Bob Cope, who was speaking to his team at a practice before the Tiger homecoming game versus San Jose State last week. Indeed, it can be said that the key to Pacific's success for the rest of the season relies on the strength and enthusiasm of the bench. There are quite a few Tigers who have played this fill-in role admirably. One man in particular is running back Vernon Hadnot.

Hadnot, a senior from Austin, Texas, could very well be one of the men who can turn things around for Pacific. With the season-ending injury of the Tigers' leading running back Anthony Williams, some added pressure is placed on the Tiger backfield to fill in for him. Hadnot is ready to take this challenge. "I feel confident in my ability to get the job done," he said.

Hadnot, with his strength and speed, should indeed feel confident in his abilities. A 1984 graduate of Regan High School in Austin, Texas, he honed his strength and speed early. He was a two-sport letterwinner at Regan, excelling in both track and football. As a track standout for Regan, which is considered to be a powerhouse track school, he worked on his running skills, chalking up a 10.7 second mark in the 100-meter dash. He was able to put his speed to use on the football field as well. His football talents led him to earn All-26-5A League honors at running back in his senior year. He helped to lead his team to a conference crown and a runner-up spot with records of 11-1 and 9-3 respectively.

From Regan High School, Hadnot went to Livermore's Laney College, where a now-familiar face handed the ball off to him—Tiger quarterback Jay Frost. At Laney, he was an All-Golden Gate Conference running back in 1985 and his team's Most Improved Player.

One year's success at Laney was enough to convince Cope that Hadnot would be an asset to the Tigers. He came to Pacific in 1986 and redshirted his first season to learn the Tiger system. In 1987, he played in a backup role at running back, carrying eight times for 35 yards. Coming into 1988, he had developed enough to be considered a major contender for a starting spot. A hamstring injury in spring drills set his plans back, however. But Hadnot, one of the hardest workers on the team, would not give up. "He has always been a good preparer," stated Cope of Hadnot. "He has excellent work habits and performs well."

What is the outlook for Hadnot's success for the rest of the year? Top-notch, according to Cope. "He has played the best football of his career in the past two weeks," Cope stated. "He is a good runner and can make the big plays for us." He has gained some yards thus far in a part-time role, rushing for 78 yards on 28 carries going into the San Jose State game. Now, he will get his shot to produce even more yards. "I just have to mentally prepare myself even more now since some of our running backs are hurt," Hadnot said. Hadnot is prepared, willing, and able to meet the challenge, and the opponent's defense, head on at full speed ahead.

Tigers Back to Full Strength With Oden's Return

For Tiger volleyball fans who were at the Spanos Center on the night of October 15, they witnessed a blast from the past and a glimpse into the future. On the court, the Tiger volleyball team, like the Tiger national championship team of 1985 and 1986, was dominating the opponent. The team was not just beating



or competing with the opponent, but controlling the course of the game. All of the elements were in sync: the hitters were pounding nearly everything set to them straight to the floor; the blockers were blocking attack after attack, and the back row players were digging up every volleyball hit within a ten mile radius of the court. What was the catalyst that brought

about this top team performance? The presence of one nervous but happy lady: Elaina Oden.

After a season and a half of recuperation, the Tigers welcome back middle blocker Elaina Oden, a two-time All-American who led the team to its back-to-back national championships. With her return, the Tigers also welcome back the possibility of winning its third national championship in four years. This isn't to say that the hope for success was dead without Oden or that the team couldn't do it on its own. To explain, a trip down memory lane is necessary.

At the beginning of the 1988 campaign, there was a younger face on the Tiger squad. The end of the 1987 season saw the departure of four solid veteran starters to graduation: Mary Miller, Teri McGrath, Liz Hert and Dorothy Hert. The departure of such talented athletes left gaping holes in the Tiger starting rotation, a difficulty that was not aided by the absence of Oden as she recuperated from knee surgery. Head Coach John Dunning had plenty of young talent to choose from when making out the rotation sheet, but many of his players lacked the

experience needed to bring the team to fruition.

To make things more difficult, the 1988 Tiger schedule has not been sympathetic to the young Tigers. In the first month of play, Pacific faced four Top Twenty teams and played in two high-caliber tournaments. Although the team shone impressively and maintained its reputation as one of the top teams in the nation, more experienced teams got their licks in, leaving the team teetering at 8-8 by the first week in October. The team was learning and gaining experience every step of the way, but as everybody knows, the acquisition of confidence in ability takes a bit of time.

But sometimes, processes can be speeded up tremendously. All it takes is some factor that takes the players' minds off of their doubts, something that refocuses their attention on their strong desire to succeed. For the Tigers, this factor has arrived in the return of Oden. "They are good teammates," coach Dunning said. "It makes them happy to see Elaina getting to do what she loves to do again. Her presence gives them confidence."

Confidence via Oden is just the shot in the arm that the volleyball team needed to succeed. It will be this confidence that will prevail for the remainder of the season, the element that will

pace the team to success. "The team has been getting better, getting more confident and experienced," Dunning said. "Elaina's return just speeds up the process." What exactly is it about Oden that gives the Tigers confidence? "She loves to play in the clutch. Her ability to make the play stabilizes the team and gives it confidence," Dunning said.

One final important point to note is that, for the first time since the Tigers took their second consecutive national championship in 1986, the team is at full strength. Every player on the roster is physically and mentally ready, willing and able to play. Oh, what about the glimpse into the future? Well, for the Tigers, as the Beatles said, things are "getting so much better all the time!"
