I reached the city about four o'clock. Visited the immortals Brown & Swett, & heard Prof Proctor's Sun lecture. Slept last night at Swetts, & came out here this forenoon for my letters.

Am going down town now to telegraph Dr Swinell, & visit the shears.

I hope to get off tomorrow for Monterey. Write me at Swetts 1419 Taylor St.

I am a little afraid there may be difficulty in getting Swinell at the right hour through the puzzling tangle of trains & ferry, all of which seem to run on the how-not-to-do-it principle.
