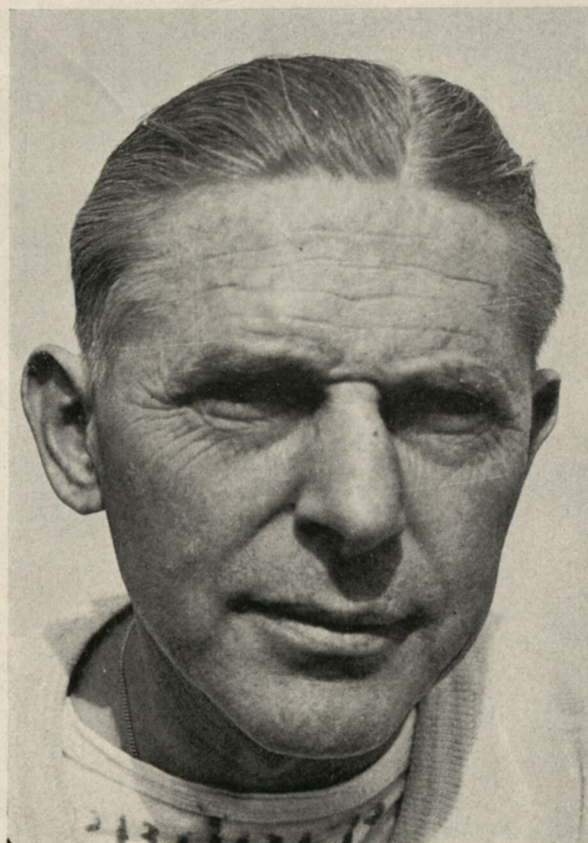
time sports, carrying on in the face of every difficulty, and playing a major schedule with very limited manpower.
