Portage Wis - May 16 1882

Dear Daniel

Your letter of the
12th Inst. is received, and brings
good news

I am glad to know
that you are all well, and
that business is increasing -
and also that you have sold
your farm, as it did not
suit your expectations -

In regard to the money,
I may say that I have no
immediate use for it -
as I have not yet found a
suitable house or even lot
but am looking out all the time
and as you can send it any
time on ten days notice -

- you may still continue
to use it.

Building goes on
here very briskly - and property
of every kind has advanced in
value very much this season.

David is now having
his house much enlarged, so
they will all feel more comfortable
his health is much better than
it has been. but I wish he
could have a long vacation
this summer.

I am glad to know
that they are all well at Crete
as it is a good while since I had
a letter from there.

Joanna seems to be
quite well pleased with her
Southern home, but thinks
she may come north during
the hottest months.

Your father has
settled already, although he
thought that the climate of Ark.
was the best he had ever seen.
"I wonder if he will ever settle."
The house I occupy
is a good brick one, on Conant
street not far from the business
part of the city, containing five
rooms with parlor and kitchen.
The rooms are quite small
so we think we are rather
crowded, we have a flower
garden in the rear as large
as I want to care for.

Blessings unnumbered
surround my path - for which
I am thankful to the giver of all
good.
