*Prior to May, 1909, students in the Conservatory of Music were Was backen granted the Bachelor of Music degree on their proficiency in music only. In August, 1909, a diploma from a recognized High School or Academy was made a requisite for the Bachelor of Music degree. In August, 1911, a further requirement of at least sixty-four college units in addition to the High School diploma was made. In the above list Miss Shafer is the first student in our Conservatory to receive the Bachelor of Music degree as a College degree, she having met the College requirements. The other students who receive the Bachelor of Music degree this year are High School graduates. There is no distinction between the diploma students

and the degree students so far as their proficiency in music is concerned.

With the exception of a few Juniors now enrolled in the Conservatory who will receive the Bachelor of Music degree next year on the completion of their work, no student in the future will be granted this degree except on the completion of the requisite amount of College work. A diploma of graduation, however, will be awarded to all students completing the

Conservatory Course satisfactorily.
