Dear John & Louie:

I presume you
have rec'd our Christmas & New
Year greetings ere this; but I
now write to acknowledge
John's letter & Louie's box, which
arrived safely on New Year's
morning, and gave us much
pleasure. All the careful arrange-
ment, and preparation, indicat-
ing, so much thought & affection-
ate consideration, that our
hearts were reached, and I as-
sure you that all was highly
prized, and now our move
is onward of Californian
Frontiers. - I decorated the

walls and pictures (Johns more
especially) this same afternoon.
A number of the slips &c
are in pots and under glass.
We shared with the Daniels folks.

D. W. G. was in town
this afternoon. Said he had
~~and~~ read a letter from you which
changed his mind materially.
Said he should write P. to stay
until spring - Anne has re-
signed her school, so that
all will go smoothly at home
now. Hope they will stay
and rest, and get all the bene-
fit, Californian climate
