1993-1994 FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION

A PROCLAMATION
by the
Governor of the State of California¹

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California has been called in extraordinary session and convened on January 4, 1993; and

WHEREAS, on account of an extraordinary occasion which has arisen and now exists, it is deemed desirable and necessary to submit an additional subject to the Legislature for consideration;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, PETE WILSON, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, hereby amend and supplement my Proclamation dated December 31, 1992, by adding the following additional purpose thereto, and thereby permitting the Legislature to legislate upon the following subject, in addition to the subject specified in the original Proclamation, to wit:

To consider and act upon legislation relative to preventing crime; keeping our homes, schools, businesses and neighborhoods safe; and punishing career criminals, violent offenders, sexual predators, armed criminals, juvenile gang members, and criminals who victimize the most vulnerable in our communities.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this 29th day of December 1993.
