Waltham Hill Sept 18th
1866

Dear Daniel

I received
your letter informing us of
your moving a little nearer
home, why did you stop
short of Waltham Hill. nearly
every day we think of you
when we go to that room
to pick out good apples
we would all enjoy them
better if you were here
I am glad to know your
health is good. I hope
you like your new situation
let us know if your
wages are sufficient to support
you comfortably

Affairs here
move along much in the same
old track our farm is let
again to one of the men

that had it last year
the other man has bought
that eighty nest Mr Thomson
for twelve hundred dollars
the one half to be paid
this month - the other half
next fall so our farm
is becoming gradually less

I expect you know Moryt
has got home and is enjoying
pretty good health. Jessie
went home about a week
ago we miss her very much
she staid with us five
months

I must now bid you
Goodbye - praying that the Lord
will bless you and keep you
and direct you at all times -
from your ever
affectionate Mother
